1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To see if the Town will accept the Budget for 1953 as prepared by the Selectmen and make appropriation of the amounts therein or to make any changes.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 58.00 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 1|100th of one percent of the Town Valuation.

4. To see if the Town will vote to give the selectmen the right to issue temporary loans on the anticipation of Taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$200.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

6. To see if the Town will vote that the Board of Trustees of the Trust Funds of the Town shall consist of One Trustee only.

7. To choose by ballot a Trustee of Trust Funds for one year.

8. To see if the town will vote to allow the collector of taxes additional compensation for his services in collecting the state head tax and fix the amount thereof.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the salaries of the Selectmen to \$200.00, the Collector to \$300.00, the Treasurer to \$100.00, and make appropriation for the same.

10. To transact such other business as may lawfully come before said meeting.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures —Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits C and D)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenue for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a net revenue surplus of \$2,200.63, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$1,753.65, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$446.98.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance, as of December 31, 1952, is indicated in Exhibit F.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased from \$8,565.95 to \$7,026.29 in 1952, as shown by the following statement:

Changes in Accounting Procedure:

As a result of the audit several changes have been made in the accounting procedure of the town officials. These were as follows:

Board of Selectmen:

Adopted the use of the Class A Receipts or Payments Book.

Tax Collector:

Adopted the use of (1) the standard form of loose leaf columnar cash book, (2) the standard form of tax sale record book and (3) form for reporting redemptions from tax sales to the Treasurer.

Town Clerk:

Adopted the use of the prescribed form of Town Clerk's Cash Book for recording motor vehicle permits and dog licenses issued.

Town Treasurer:

Will countersign town orders only after they have actually been issued and signed by the Selectmen. Checks will be entered as payments in Treasurer's cash book at the time of issuance rather than after their payment and return from the bank.

Uncollected and Unredeemed Taxes:

It is noted that there were uncollected and unredeemed taxes on account of the tax warrants of 1949 and prior years as follows:

It is recommended that these lists of uncollected and unredeemed taxes be carefully gone over by the Board of Selectmen and Tax Collector. Such taxes on the uncollected lists as appear to be uncollectible should be abated and tax deeds should be issued to the town by the Collector for properties represented by the unredeemed tax liens.

Town Treasurer's Surety Bond:

The Town Treasurer's surety bond for 1952 was written for \$2,000.00. Inasmuch as the funds handled by the Treasurer in 1952 totaled \$43,000.00, it is recommended that the surety bond be increased to \$5,000.00 in 1953.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Dalton for their assistance during the course of the audit.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

To the Citizens of Dalton:

The school board herewith submits its annual report. The report includes the treasurer's report for the fiscal year July 1, 1951 to June 30, 1952 with a statement of expenditures; budgets and estimated receipts for the present school year and for next year; and a written report by the superintendent of schools.

The budget of \$26,731.95 for the year 1952-1953 was approved at the last regular school district meeting. At that time it was anticipated that Dalton would receive \$5,779.34 state aid. The amount of state aid was actually cut to \$4,483.26. This resulted in a loss of approximately \$1,300.00 to the school district. Your costs for tuition were less than anticipated due to failure of certain pupils to continue their education. The budget was then revised and it appears now that your school district will end the year without a deficit in spite of the \$1,300.00 loss in state aid.

The budget for the year 1953-1954 is higher than this revised budget due for the most part to an anticipated increase in tuition costs because of increased numbers of pupils. We, therefore, request an appropriation of \$26,179.05 for the support of schools for the year 1953-1954.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town School District in the Town of Dalton, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the school building in said Dalton on the ninth day of March, 1953 at 8:00 o'clock in the evening, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose a moderator for the ensuing year.

2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To choose an auditor for the ensuing year.

6. To hear the reports of officers, auditors or committees of the district and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To see what action the district will take in the selection of a suitable site for a new elementary school, and authorize the acquisition of any real property for the location of such building.

8. To see if the district will vote to build and equip a new elementary school.

To see what sum the district will vote to 9. raise and appropriate for the construction, equipment and furnishing of such new elementary school and the acquisition of any real property that may be necessary for its location; and whether the district will vote to raise such sum through the issuance of serial notes or bonds upon the credit of the district for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the school board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued including their sale and the time and place of payment of principal and interest, in accordance with the provisons of the Municipal Bonds Statute, N. H. Revised Laws, Chapter 72, and any amendments thereto.

10. To see if the district will vote to appoint a building committee consisting of three persons, to be elected from the floor, to advise with the school board in selecting a location for the new school and to supervise the construction of said building, providing that the plans and specifications and the selection of a site for the new school shall finally be approved by the school board acting alone as required by law, and to further authorize the school board to execute any and all contracts or agreements necessary in connection with the construction and equipping of said school.

11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$2,700.00 as a capital reserve fund for the construction of a new central school, said funds to be placed in the custody of the trustees of trust funds and reserved for the construction of a new central school in accordance with the Laws of 1943, Chapter 160 as amended by the Laws of 1945, Chapter 35 and Laws of 1947, Chapter 8.

12. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Dalton:

It is with pleasure that I submit my annual report relative to your schools.

This past year brought only one change in the teaching staff. Mrs. Shirley Aldrich of Dalton, with two years' training at Plymouth Teachers College and with attendance this past summer, was elected to replace Mrs. Gertrude Severance who resigned to accept a pocition in the southern part of the state.

The enrollment this year in the six grades is 75 as compared with a total of 71 last year. On February 2, 1953 there were 29 pupils registered in Whitefield High School. There were 19 pupils registered in Grades 7 and 8 in Whitefield and three pupils in the lower six grades.

The report of the school nurse shows that 70 pupils were examined for vision, hearing, teeth,

height and weight. The following defects were found and reported: Vision 8, hearing 5, teeth 70 and tonsils 4. All children were reported to have been successfully vaccinated. Dental clinics were conducted in Littleton and with the cooperation of a number of parents, children were transported to the dentist.

All classes have been provided with adequate materials and teaching aids to insure good training. Mental maturity tests are administered to Grades 1, 3 and 5 each year and all children are given achievement tests in the spring to determine their progress.

The school lunch program is being continued this year. The teachers and parents are to be commended for carrying on this program under such adverse conditions.

Your teachers attended a two day music workshop this fall under the direction of Miss Alice Baumgarner, Director of Art Education.

The budget for this next year is of necessity somewhat higher than the revised budget of the present year. This is due to an anticipated increase in the number of tuition pupils this next year. If the amount of state aid alloted to Dalton remains the same as this year, this will mean an increase of about \$1,200.00, however, the governor is recommending an increase in the amount of state aid from \$600,000.00 annually to \$900,000.00. If this increase is approved by the legislature Dalton should receive an additional \$1,400.00 and the assessment can then be no more than last year and possibly less. We were very fortunate this year that sufficient savings could be made to offset the cut in state aid.

In closing, I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the citizens, the school board, teaching staff and other district officers for their continued cooperation.
