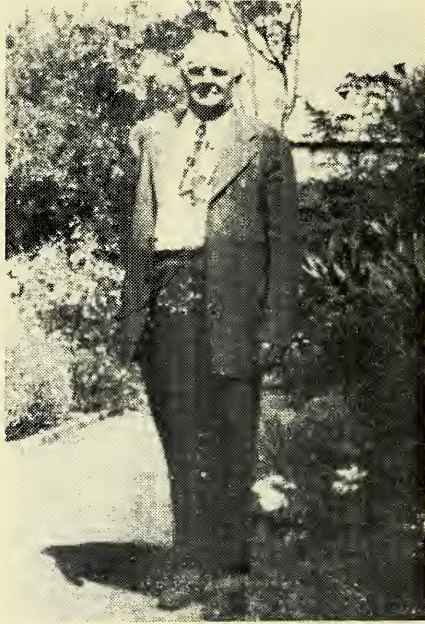

# TOWN WARRANT

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## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Goshen in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Goshen on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations of the same.
3. To hear the reports of selectmen and other Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
4. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for highways and bridges.
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for winter roads.
6. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for general expense of the highway department.
7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
8. To see what sum of money the town will raise for town poor.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.
10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Library.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control.



12. To see if the Town will vote to allow the collector of taxes additional compensation for his services in collecting the state head tax and to fix the amount thereof.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30.00 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural resources of the town and other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee region.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$176.26 and the State will contribute \$1175.05 for T.R.A. roads.

15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the fire department.

16. To see what action the town will take regarding the Non-partisan ballot and pass any vote relating thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for printing and distributing the History of the Town of Goshen.

18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of the Town dump.

19. To see what action the Town will take in regards to street lights and pass any vote relating thereto.

20. To see if the Town will vote, to permit the Edgemont section of Sunapee the use of the Goshen town dump and pass any vote relating thereto.

21. To take up any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

# SCHOOL WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Goshen qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the tenth day of March, 1953, at two-thirty o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing two years.
5. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
6. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
7. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
8. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate, in addition to the original appropriation for 1952-53, a sum of \$3,052.42 to be made available to the school district prior to July 1, 1953.
10. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Goshen, I herewith submit my first annual report as Superintendent of Schools:

The employment of two exceptionally capable teachers has been largely responsible for the greatly improved schools this year. Mrs. Starkey and Mr. Kathan are providing the opportunity and pattern by which children learn and enjoy school experiences. They are working with the boys and girls not only during school hours, but many outside of the regular school day. The response on the part of the pupils has been most gratifying. The recognition of the outstanding work by the local newspapers and citizens does much to encourage these young people.

Through the cooperation of Mr. and Mrs. Parks, it has been possible to secure running water at the Corner School. This is a tremendous improvement and is thoroughly welcomed by not only the pupils and teachers, but especially the people preparing the hot lunch. If we can continue to improve by the addition of a drinking fountain and toilets, this school building will be so modernized that it will compare favorably with many other rural schools.

Several other minor repairs have been accomplished on the two buildings which prevent heat loss, improve the attractiveness and livability, and meet health requirements.

There is need for more land and running water at the Village School. Improved lighting is also essential. Better facilities for the preparation of hot lunches are forthcoming.

The inauguration of deficit spending at the last school district meeting has increased the burden for the next year due to the increase in rates. The deficiency appropriation to be raised and appropriated, in order to continue operation of the schools for the balance of the 1952-53 school year, is in addition to the normal school budget.

Increased state aid, if voted by the legislators, would ease the situation, but the real issue is up to the local voters.

The time is fast approaching when it may be necessary for us to educate more of our children than at present. Increased enrollments at Newport may limit the number of tuition pupils. It would then be necessary to transport them to Sunapee or Alstead at additional costs. Unity and Cornish are actually faced with such a proposition for the next school year.



I wish to thank the school Board, parents and citizens for their cooperation, advice and support during the few months I have been privileged to work with you. I would especially like to thank the teachers and pupils for their fine cooperation and performance of duties.

## SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

Healthy development of the child is of basic importance. Good health is essential to effective living. What better place than the school to teach "GOOD HEALTH HABITS"? Good health is an important goal of education.

Your school nurse has been privileged with the opportunity to continue to improve the health of your school child. The methods used are not new. A yearly inspection is done. This includes weight and height. An inspection of posture, skin, hair, teeth and throat are also a part of the routine. Your child's vision is tested by means of the Massachusetts Vision Testing Machine. Hearing is tested individually by means of the audiometer. Hearing is done about every other year as the testing apparatus is loaned by the State Board of Education. As time permits, your nurse visits the classrooms and has discussions with the children on different phases of the health problems.

Now to explain what happens following the inspection. A "Notice to Parents" is sent home by the school nurse. What is on this notice? The defects observed by your nurse are sent to you for your consideration. You may request the assistance of the nurse, check that you will consult your family doctor or family dentist. Home visits are made by the nurse where it is necessary; to discuss the plan to be taken; to discuss health problems; to give suggestions in the care of the sick child as needed.

A health record is kept on your child so that the nurse, teachers, principal and superintendent may have access to the health progress of each child. Should parents wish to discuss this record, they may consult the nurse at their convenience. A close relationship between local, state, social and health agencies is gratefully appreciated. There is a full cooperation with the State Board of Education, State Health Department and State Department of Public Welfare. Thus through the cooperation of "ALL OF US", our endeavor will be to keep the school child healthy in mind and body.
