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

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TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Greenfield in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Greenfield on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.

3. To choose one or more and not exceeding three Highway Agents, for the ensuing year.

4. To hear reports of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Road Agents, Overseers of the Poor, Library Trustees and other Town Officers and take any action relative thereto.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs of highways and bridges.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Public Library.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money to pay Town debts or take any action relative thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Maintenance, raise and appropriate the sum of nine hundred dollars or take any action relative thereto. 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction, raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred ninety-three dollars and fifty cents for the permanent improvement fund or take any action relative thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to complete the State Highway to the Lyndeborough line, authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the same, or take any action relative thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to replace the kerosene street lamps with electric lights, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relative thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to wire the Town Hall and other public buildings for electric lights, raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relative thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of fifty dollars for the perpetual care of the Rufus Hardy lot in the Old Cemetery, or take any action relative thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Cemetery Trustees to take from the income of the Albe Stephenson Trust Fund enough money to build a road from the new gate to the rear fence, or take any action relative thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to accept any and all legacies for the perpetual care of Cemetery lots, by any person or persons, provided, after care of said lot and a reasonable balance, the remainder of the income may be used for beautifying the Cemetery under the direction of the Trustees or take any action relative thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars and appropriate the same for the extermination of the White Pine Blister Rust, or take any action relative thereto.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
