I don't consider it anything against a person because they cannot make a success of teaching, but it is against the interests of the schools if such teachers are employed.

A system of discipline to gain the respect of the pupils and accomplish its object must be earnest, strong and thorough. The very fact of such a government has a silent but powerful influence in preventing evil and securing obedience and fidelity. Both the teachers and pupils must work. Indolence in the teacher begets idleness and recklessness in the pupils. Life, energy and industry manifested by the teacher will be at once reproduced in the pupil.
