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TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

L.S.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Orange in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Orange on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose by ballot and plurality vote: A Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman for three years, a Tax Collector, a Road Agent, a Constable, one Trustee of Trust Funds, one Library Trustee for three years, two Auditors, one Cemetery Agent, one Overseer of the Poor, Fence Viewers, Measurers of Wood, Bark and Lumber and all other officers that the Town may judge necessary.

ARTICLE 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the payment of Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$40.00 to pay Town House expenses.

ARTICLE 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of Highways and Bridges, Summer and Winter, and make appropriations for the same.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. for truck upkeep.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.27 for Town Road Aid and the State will contribute the sum of \$1,168.48.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate of sum of \$40 for insurance on the Town House.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$120 for insurance on the Town Truck.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$700 for Old Age Assistance.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$20 for the maintenance of the Town Library.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$60 for the maintenance of the Town Cemeteries.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5 for the decoration of Soldiers' graves on Memorial Day.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to hire the Canaan Fire Department for services in case of fires in Orange. And to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for this purpose. Said \$100 to be placed in the "Orange Fire Fund."

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the Orange Auxiliary Fire Department. Said \$100 to be placed in the "Orange Fire Pump Fund."

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes to pay necessary town charges.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Deeding Agent to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds in the town.

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount on taxes paid in full, within fifteen days from the date of the tax bill.

ARTICLE 18. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting not included in this Warrant.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

At this moment it appears that there will need to be a small deficiency appropriation of approximately \$100 due to increases in the number attending high school. Any change in the number between now and the district meeting would affect this amount one way or another. It is impossible at budget time, or any other, to figure tuitions accurately since there is considerable shifting of residences from time to time. Elementary tuition rate is close to actual costs but the high school rate is considerably lower than costs for next year. Since this latter cost varies quite a bit it is reasonable to expect the tuition rate to increase once the figure becomes more or less stabilized. The Canaan rate of \$260 for 1957-58 is much lower than most rates will be. A figure of \$320-330 will be the prevailing rate with some even higher than that.

Your understanding of these difficulties in the past has been greatly appreciated.
