To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rumney in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Rumney Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its highways and bridges.
- 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Library.
- 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Cemeteries.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Common and the daily raising and lowering of the flag.
- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights.
- 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the LaMott-Kenneson Post No. 76, American Legion for Memorial Day and other patriotic purposes.

- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Town Dump.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$285.65 to secure from the State \$1,904.36 to be expended for Town Road Aid.
- 12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate towards the operation of the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital in Plymouth, N. H.
- 14. To see what action the Town will take for the construction of a Vault or the purchase of a suitable safe for the use of the Selectmen in protecting the Town Records and to raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 15. To see what action the Town will take for the repair of the Town Hall Furnace or the purchase of a new Furnace and to raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 16. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to improve the road leading from the New Winsor Bridge to the Avery Homestead.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to install water and toilet in the Library and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 18. To see what action the Town will take to assist in the construction of a new dam at Stinson Lake in conjunction with the State of New Hampshire and raise and appropriate money for the same.

- 19. To see what action the Town wishes to make in regard to Civil Defense and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to confirm the conveyance made by the Town of Rumney to Earl E. Colby and Eva M. Colby, July 25, 1942, recorded in Grafton County Registry of Deeds book 708 page 453.
- 21. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for legal advice.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent, sell or otherwise dispose of any real estate or mineral rights acquired by the town at any of its tax collectors sales.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to allow a two percent discount on all taxes paid within fifteen days after presentation of tax bills.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to have the inventory blanks distributed at time of taking appraisal of properties.
- 26. Shall the provision of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this town.
- 27. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

TO THE RUMNEY SCHOOL BOARD:

This is my eleventh and final report as Superintendent of Schools in Rumney. Since I shall not long be concerned with any action taken by either the Rumney School District or the Rumney School Board, you may be assured that whatever observations or recommendations this report contains are based solely on the needs of Rumney children as I see them.

The most important subject under discussion in Rumney for the last two years has centered around the possible construction of a new central school. That discussion has continued through two years with a different committee appointed each year to investigate and report back. Whether a new school is any nearer to reality now than two years ago, only the people of Rumney know. However, it seems to me that it is time to decide something, whatever that decision may be. The Rumney Depot school is and has been for a long time the most unfit school building in Supervisory Union No. 48. The interior of the building is neither attractive nor large enough. Your children are crowded into it under conditions that cannot possibly be favorable to the most profitable school experience. It would be fine if every parent in Rumney would come to that school when it is in session to see exactly the conditions under which your children are expected to work. If that were done, I am confident that complacency would give way to a feeling of uncertainty and insecurity. Every day your children are kept in the Depot School as it now is only drags out a long continued policy of cheating the youngsters. It is your money; they are your children; it is your responsibility to do with either or both whatever a majority of voters decide. Whether that decision is to build a new school or to enlarge the Depot School, it should be made without further delay.

Textbook material is being gradually brought up to date by the introduction of recent editions of textbooks in use or the introduction of new series of books. As of September, 1954, both grades 1-2 will be using the most recent editions of reading material. During the present year, all pupils in grades 2 through 8 have been supplied with new spelling books. As of next September, grades 3 through 8 will be using new social studies textbooks which combine both history and geography. The advantage of this unified program is that it shows more clearly the close relationship between geography and history and, at the same time, saves class time which was formerly divided between two separate subjects. A similar revision in English textbooks is needed.

For several years, Rumney school boards have wisely followed a policy of adjusting salaries on the basis of teaching experience and professional improvement. It would probably be to the advantage of both the teachers and the School District if a definite salary schedule were adopted. If it is the wish of the Rumney School Board, I shall be glad to assist in drafting such a schedule.

The Rhinehart Functional Handwriting System of Waltham, Massachusetts, was engaged to supervise the teaching of penmanship for the school year 1953-54. Regular instruction is given by handwriting experts in all of our schools. Comments by teachers and an observation of progress by pupils indicate that the School Board made a wise decision.

The interest and cooperation of members of the School Board are very much appreciated. The friend-liness of Rumney people and the loyal and efficient work of the teachers are likewise thoroughly appreciated.

* EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent as per the following quotation:

"Reports. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report showing the total salary paid to the superintendent, which report shall show in detail the amount derived from the per capita tax and the amount paid directly by each school district in the union."

One-half of supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year, ending on June 30. For the school year 1952-53, the superintendent in Union No. 48 received a salary of \$5350 which was made up as follows: \$2275 paid from the per capita tax, and \$3075 pro-rated among the several school districts. An allowance of \$750 for travel within the Union was also pro-rated as stated above.

TO THE RUMNEY SCHOOL BOARD:

I herewith submit my report as School Nurse which covers the period of the school year 1952-1953.

158 children were inspected and symptoms of these physical defects were found:

Two children are under orthopedic treatment. One child had tonsilectomy paid for by the Red Cross. One child had glasses through the Sight Conservation Program. Several children attended the Chest Clinics at Plymouth sponsored by the N. H. Tuberculosis Association.

The Maico Audiometer, purchased by the subscriptions of organizations in the School Union No. 48, is proving very adequate in screening children who need medical attention because of poor hearing.

The only communicable diseases reported were 2 cases of chicken pox, 2 of impetigo, and 2 scabies.

I have made 66 school calls, 40 home calls, and innumerable business and phone calls and written many letters in carrying on the health program in the schools.

Healthful living, based on prevention of illness, is constantly being taught in the classrooms by the teachers. As one has said, "To cure is the voice of the past; to prevent, the divine whisper of today."

I thank the School Board, Superintendent, teachers, pupils, and parents for their kind help during the past year.
