## Town Warrant

L. S.

State of New Hampshire.

Carroll SS.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sandwich, in said

County and State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following articles:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To see if the Town will determine by vote the salary to be paid any of its officers or agents.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To raise money to pay interest on the School Fund Note for the year ensuing. The sum required is \$133.92.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the support of the Library in addition to the amount required by law. The sum required is \$69.30. The sum recommended to be raised by vote is \$300.00.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to pay the expense of decorating soldiers' graves. The sum recommended is \$100.00.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the observance of Old Home Week. The sum recommended is \$150.00.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the repair of the Notch and Dale Road. (The sum recommended is 200.00 The State to give in proportion 3 to 2), or pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise money in addition to the sum required by a law to obtain State Aid for the construction of State Aid Road. The sum required by law is \$651.20 plus \$1,302.41 to be taken from Town Highway appropriation. State to furnish equal amount. Total available \$3,907.22.

10. To see if the Town will ratify the contract for snow removal made by Elmer S. Thompson with Town of Sandwich in substitution for the contract formerly made with Guy B. Thompson, or take any action relating to snow removal. 11. To raise money for the repair of Highways and Bridges for the year ensuing. The sum recommended is \$8,000.00.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the support of either Laconia Hospital at Laconia or Huggins Hospital at Wolfeboro, or for both. The sum suggested is \$200.00, to be divided.

13. To see if the Town will raise money for the support of the Fire Department for the ensuing year. The sum recommended is \$350.00.

14. To raise by vote such sum of money as shall be necessary to pay the expenses of General Government of the Town. The sum recommended is \$1,800.00.

15. To see if the Town will discontinue, subject to gates and bars, the old road from David Rowe barn to Jose Bridge.

16. To see if the Town will vote to buy a road machine for summer use and raise money therefor.

17. To raise such sum of money as shall be necessary to pay Town Charges for the ensuing year. The sum recommended is \$800.00.

18. To see if the Town will ratify the action of the committee elected at the Annual Meeting, 1933, in naming the Town Forest in Sandwich Notch, Sandwich Notch Park.

19. To see if the Town will accept as gifts certain lands from George S. Hoyt and I. Harris Metcalf, adjacent to Sandwich Notch Park.

20. To see if the Town will accept from Mr. Edwin F. Samuels the use as a public park of the "Gold Mine Pasture."

21. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally, as permitted under Laws of 1933, Chapter 99.

22. To see whether the Town will vote to take any action in favor of exercising its power to enact Zoning Regulations as provided in Chapter 42, Public Laws of New Hampshire, and take any vote relative to the appointment of a Zoning Commission.

### REPORT OF SCHOOL HEALTH WORK

To the Townspeople, School Board, and Superintendent of Schools:

It cannot be considered that satisfactory results were obtained in the Sandwich health work the past Advantages obtained a year ago were not folvear. lowed up properly, and much of the good results were lost. This was especially true of the dental corrections. It is not possible to do all the necessary work for a child at one time, when there is a large amount of work to be done. This means that a carefully planned program must be carried out for several successive years to get satisfactory results. This was not done, and the good beginning made in 1931 has, for the most part, been lost. We are hoping to be able to start over again this year, if funds to back the project can be found, and an excellent dentist can be found who will undertake the work.

The most valuable advancement made was the correction of ten cases of defective vision. This leaves only three cases to be done. There were also six more tonsil operations done. There are now about fourteen to be done. We hope to get a few more of these operations done this year, and finally clear up all cases of diseased throats in Sandwich. This should make a difference with the general health conditions in the schools.

The teachers are doing a good piece of work in trying to form health habits among the children. It is often inconvenient for the parents, but valuable habits can be formed in this way that will always serve the child through life, and now is the time to do this.

Through the Federal and State Emergency Relief Acts, about eighteen children are being served with a half pint of milk each school day to help keep up their resistance to disease, and to build strong bodies. Cod Liver Oil, for a tonic and a builder, has also been given to those run down by the whooping cough epidemic. It was a very beneficial thing to enable all those who wished it to have the whooping cough serum given. There were no deaths from this disease, although many delicate babies had the fatal disease. In towns where this was not given, months of whoops disturbed the schools, and there seems to be no evidence that the disease will be cleared up in many homes before spring. Serum shortens the sickness by many weeks, and prevents the serious after-effects and deaths usuany found with this disease.

It we could get the children's teeth in better condition, three more pairs of glasses, and fourteen tonsil operations done, we would consider that the Sandwich children were in satisfactory condition to grow and develop normally. Nothing must be neglected that could retard the best development of the children, even if depression does ride the land!

Schools were in session 357 half days, with a percentage of attendance of 93 plus.

Sandwich has an undue number of cases of tardiness. This is due, in most cases, to the carelessness of parents. The real cause of complaint from the school standpoint is not that the children are losing a few minutes of time in the school room, but that they are creating habits of carelessness which are harmful to them and injurious to the morale of the whole school.
