## TOWN WARRANT

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook, qualified to vote in Town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lower Hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association building on Collins Street on Tuesday March 8, 1955 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects :

Article 1 — To elect by Australian ballot; A Town Clerk, One Selectman, Assessor and Trustee of the Trust Funds for a term of Three years; Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Three Constables, Chief of Police, and any other officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2 — To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expense of the General Government, for the protection of Persons and Property, for Health and Sanitation, for Highway and Bridges, for the support of the Town Poor, and all other necessary expenditures for the ensuing year.

Article 3 — To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes and to renew and refund Town Notes.

Article 4 — To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the advancement of the Town through publicity and promotional services of the Seacoast Regional Development Assoc. cooperating with other regional committees the sum of \$200.00.

Article 5 — To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for the purchase of a new Calculator.

Article 6 — To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 to rebuild the World War Two Honor Roll as a permanent memorial.

Article 7 — To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for use by the Selectmen for Clerk Hire.

Article 8 — To see if the Town will vote to establish the Salary of the Clerk of the Municipal Court.

Article 9 — To see if the Town will vote to revise the salaries and wages of the Town officials and employees.

Article 10 — Upon petition by Horatio Lattime Jr. and 12 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,400.00 to purchase and install Radio and Communications equipment for use by the several Town Departments, said purchase and installation to be handled by the Board of Selectmen through the State of New Hampshire Civil Defense Agency.

Article 11 — To see if the Town will vote to resurface, repair and otherwise improve Highways in the Town and for such purpose appropriate a sum not exceeding \$25,000.00.

Article 12 — To see if the Town will vote to issue Serial Bonds under and in compliance with Revised Laws Ch. 72 and amendments thereto, in the principal amount not exceeding \$25,000.00 for the purpose of resurfacing, repairing and otherwise improving the Highways in the Town of Seabrook and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the time and place of payment of such Bonds and the rate of interest thereof and to do whatever may be necessary to the insurance thereof

Article 13 — Upon petition by William N. Davis and 23 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 to repair and Tar Page Road.

Article 14 — Upon petition by Leland W. Boyd and 15 others; To see if the Town will vote to accept as a public

way, "Cross Beach Road" so called and to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for repairs to same.

Article 15 — Upon petition by James C. Falconer and 11 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.-00) in accordance with Chapter 34; 4, Article 3 for the purpose of having the Town provide culverts and proper drainage on Railroad Avenue.

Article 16 — To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 to be used for the purpose of installing Test Wells as recommended in report of preliminary survey submitted by the Whitman Howard Co. and accepted at the 1954 Town meeting.

Article 17 — To see if the Town will vote to rescind action that was taken under article number 24 at the 1953 Town meeting.

Article 18 — Upon petition by Edward F. Goodwin and 15 others; To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen on behalf of the Town to Lease and set Rental Fee on Town owned marsh land at Farm Land Dock.

Article 19 — Upon petition by Edward F. Goodwin and 32 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred (\$300) Dollars to be used for the purpose of deepening the channel leading from Mill Creek to the Town Dock at the foot of Railroad Avenue.

Article 20 — Upon petition by James C. Falconer and 11 others; To see if the voters of the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to procure at the expense of the Town a portable "Wire Recorder", the purpose of this recorder to be used at all adjourned Town meetings that are holden. This machine to be operated by the Town Clerk and remain in her custody at all times, and furthermore the "Clerk" shall from this "Recorder"

transcribe a verbatim written record and the same to be a true and attested copy and this "Wire Record" and written and attested record to remain forever in the archives of the Town.

Article 21 — Upon petition by James C. Falconer and 16 others; That the Town hereby rescinds its previous vote to have a Chief of Police election by Ballot at the annual Town meeting holden in March, and that hereafter all police officers other than the Constables shall be appointed by the Selectmen in accordance with Chapter 422 of the Revised Laws.

Article 22 — Upon petition by James C. Falconer and 11 others; To see if the Voters of the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue the annual Tax inventory forms at the same time that they conduct their annual appraisal of Taxable property.

Article 23 — Upon petition by James C. Falconer and 11 others; To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to give a Four Per Centum discount on property Taxes paid before July First of each year and a Two Per Centum discount if paid before September First of each year.

Article 24 — Upon petition by James C. Falconer and 14 others; To see if the Town will vote to have all meetings in the future "Warned" in the manner set forth in this article and as follows; That in addition to the present method of warning meetings as set forth in sections 4, 5, & 6 of Chapter 57 of the revised laws and the present method now being used by the Town; that they further be warned by the Warrant being published within one week after the posting thereof; Once in the "Newburyport News" so long as it shall exist, once in the "Amesbury Daily" so long as it shall exist, and once in the "Portsmouth Herald" so long as it shall exist.

Article 25 — Upon petition by James C. Falconer and



16 others; To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to provide One other additional Polling place within the Municipality of Seabrook for the convenience and accommodation of the voters residing in the "North End" of the Town. The foregoing to be conducted as enumerated in Chapter 34 of the revised laws of the state of New Hampshire.

Article 26 — Upon petition by James C. Falconer and 14 others; To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Town manager plan as enumerated by Chapter 55 of the Revised Laws and subsequent amendments thereto.

Article 27 — Upon petition by James C. Falconer and 14 others; To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law.

Article 28 — Upon petition by James C. Falconer and 14 others; That in the event that the Town does so vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law, the board shall consist of 12 (Twelve) members and they shall be nominated and elected by ballot at the annual town meeting in accordance with chapter 52 of the Revised Laws and subsequent amendments thereto.

Article 29 — Upon petition by James C. Falconer and 14 others; To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to prepare sufficient questionnaires to be sent to all property owners in the Town of Seabrook including the Beach precinct containing the following; an interrogatory to the effect and in substance the following. Would you in the event that the Municipality had a town water supply constructed, acquiesce in a signed statement that you would be a taker. And until this be done, and unless there are sufficient "Takers" to justify the construction of such a project there shall be no money appropriated or expended in any way on such a project.

Article 30 — Upon petition by Eva deNichols and 14 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$44.00 to install and maintain a street light on Rock's Road Pole No. 670J.

Article 31 — Upon a petition by Sarah B. Fowler and 15 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$44.00 to install and maintain a street light on Pole No. 170J on Collins Street.

Article 32 — Upon petition by Lucien W. Foote and 14 others; That a light shall be placed on Pole No. 53 on South Main Street.

Article 33 — Upon petition by Clifford H. Creighton and 17 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$44.00 to install and maintain a street light on Washington Street Pole No. 185J.

Article 34 — Upon a petition by William N. Davis and 23 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44.00 to install a street light on Pole No. 301J at the intersection of Page Lane and Fogs Corner Road.

Article 35 — Upon petition by Harold W. Hewlitt and 10 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44.00 to install a street light on Pole No. 633J on South Main street.

Article 36 — Upon petition by Edward H. Walton Jr. and 14 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44.00 to install a street light on Pole No. 187J on Washington Street.

Article 37 — Upon petition by Tracy L. Dow and 11 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$44.00 to install and maintain a street light on Brook Street Pole No. 929J.

Article 38 — To see if the Town will authorize the

establishment and construction of a Water system for Town use and for the use of the inhabitants of the Town and others and the borrowing of not exceeding \$720,000 for its construction.

Article 39 — To see if the Town will vote to amend Section 2, Paragraph 4 under building laws of the Zoning By-Law as adopted at the Town meeting on March 9, 1954 by adding after "Frontage or Frontages" the following; "And in no case shall a structure be placed closer than 16 Feet to another structure on an adjoining lot.

Article 40 — To hear the report of the Planning Board and to act thereon.

Article 41 — To hear the report of the Water Committee and to act thereon.

Article 42 — To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Seabrook for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1954, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

**SCOPE OF AUDIT**

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

**FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

**Comparative Balance Sheets: Dec. 31, 1953 - Dec. 31, 1954:  
(Exhibit A-1)**

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1953 and December 31, 1954, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Net Debt increased by \$4,286.99 in 1954.

**Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)**

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

**Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures —  
Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)**

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1954, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net overdraft of appropriations of \$7,922.71, less a net revenue surplus of \$209.25, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$7,713.46.

**Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)**

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1954, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1954, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

**Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)**

A statement of long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1954, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

**AUDIT PROCEDURE**

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by sources insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

**GENERAL COMMENTS**

**Current Surplus:**

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased from \$7,962.60 to \$175.61, in 1954, as shown by the following statements.

This was largely due to the fact that abatements and tax

refunds made during 1954 exceeded the amount raised for overlay by \$8,550.81.

Inasmuch as the entire collections on all of these warrants amounted to only \$14.00 in 1954, it is recommended that all taxes on the lists which appear to be uncollectible be abated by the Selectmen.
