Town Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stark, in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, March 9, 1954, to act upon the subjects herein after mentioned. The polls will be open at said place and date from 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon for the reception of your ballots upon the election of town officers under the Non-Partisan Ballot System: furthermore, you are hereby warned that on said date and place, at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon, the matter of appropriations and such other business properly coming before said meeting will be taken up for your consideration and action.

1. To choose by ballot the following town officers: one town clerk for one year, one selectman for three years; and the following for one year: a town treasurer, a tax collector, one auditor, two road agents, two constables, two sextons and one trustee for the cemetery trust funds.

2. To see if the town will instruct its selectmen to appoint all other town officers required by law.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for current expenses.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Election and Registration expenses.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Insurance.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for:

- (a) General Expenses of the Highway Department
- (b) Snow Removal
- (c) Town Maintenance

8. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V Highways and appropriate \$290.99 and set aside for this purpose. The State will contribute \$1,939.95.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Town Relief.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Interest Charges for the ensuing year.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Public Library purposes.

13. To see if the Town will vote for a scale of discounts for payment of taxes on the basis of Three per cent if paid by August 31st and Two per cent if paid by September 30th.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year and pay such debts from tax money when received.

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the upkeep of Cemeteries.

16. To see if the Town will vote to tar the road built last year from Robert Emerson's to Jenkins' farm with T. R. A. funds and raise \$2,000 for the same.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$100 for White Pine Blister Rust Control, to be worked out in cooperation with the Forestry and Recreation Commission.

18. To open and maintain the back road from Stark Village to Percy Village and raise money for same. 19. To discontinue the meadow road and bridge from Percy Village to the main highway.

20. To raise a sum of money to purchase and maintain a dump in the Town of Stark.

21. To raise money to pay constable on an hourly basis.

22. To raise money to purchase or lease a parcel of land for a parking lot for Town hall and install lights for same.

23. To raise money to rent or construct a suitable building for the purpose of storing Town equipment, road machine, snow plow, snow fence, etc.

(Articles 18 to 23 were inserted in the Warrant through petition of ten voters of the Town of Stark.)

24. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Stark School District which was made by this Division, acting under authority of Chapter 82, Section 27, of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, which provides in part as follows:

"Audit on Motion of Commission. The Commission may cause an audit to be made of the accounts of any city, town, school district, village district or precinct, as often as once in two years, or whenever conditions appear to it to warrant such. *****" This audit covered the fiscal year ended June 30, 1953.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the School Board and Treasurer of the School District.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets -- June 30, 1952-June 30, 1953: (Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of June 30, 1952 and June 30, 1953, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein, the Surplus increased by \$518.24 during the year.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the School District during the year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures

Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits C & D)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1953, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a net revenue surplus of \$518.24, resulted in a net budget surplus of like amount.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1953, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of June 30, 1953, is indicated in Exhibit F.

Statement of School District Appropriation Account: (Exhibit G)

A statement of the School District appropriation account is included in Exhibit G. As indicated therein, the balance of the 1952-53 school tax due from the Town of Stark on June 30, 1953, amounted to \$518.24. This represented the excess of the actual amount of Foundation Aid received from the State (\$1,118.24), over the estimated amount (\$600.00). The full amount of the school tax for 1952-53, amounting to \$15,968.78, should have been paid to the School District by the Town.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS 1953-1954

To the School Board and Citizens of Stark:

It is with pleasure that I submit my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools in Stark. During the past year we have had an audit by representatives of the State Tax Commission and the financial data included herein, with the exception of the recommended budget for 1954-55, is a copy of their report. Statistical data, unless otherwise noted, is for the current school year, and in most cases is corrected up to time of publication.

Resignations at the end of the school year in June, 1953 made it necessary to engage two new teachers. Mrs. Constance Martin of Groveton, and Mrs. Gwendolyn Jones of West Milan were engaged to fill these vacancies and have proven most satisfactory. Mrs. Margaret Nichols has continued in her fine work at Crystal. Enrollment in the three schools is about the same as last year with three less attending high school. A grade placement chart follows:

Of this number two have now left school.

In compliance with provisions made in the budget at the March, 1953 meeting the School Board installed running water in both buildings. In each case this was done by sinking a point and, in each case, an ample supply of water was found at about 20 feet. Flush toilet facilities have been installed at the Village School, and the toilets repaired and rebuilt at the Crystal School. These installations have greatly bettered the health situation at the school and has given each building an adequate supply of State tested and approved water.

Changes in the doorways and the installing of new doors at each building have eliminated heat loss and made for better entry and exit. Both the new doors have been equipped with approved panic hardware.

A few more children's desks and one teacher's desk have been installed putting the school furniture and equipment in a good state of repair.

Several factors have made it impossible to meet the requirements for a Federally approved and subsidized hot lunch program. However, the teachers have cooperated with the homes to heat soup supplied by the homes so that the children could have this one item to enrich the noon lunch. The approved lunch will be offered again when circumstances make it possible.

In the past several years schools of the State and Nation have taken a bombardment of criticism. In individual schools some of this may be justified but in general much of it is not. During the past year in Stark there has been a close and understanding supervision of and cooperation with the teachers to see that the school program is in line with the State approved course of study and the best interest of the children of Stark. Young people graduating from the eighth grade in Stark hold their place with young people of equal ability whether they attend high school in Berlin or Groveton. In standardized test our children do as well on the average as they could be expected to do if they were attending school in an urban situation. The teachers, the superintendent, and the School Board members welcome an opportunity to listen to and meet any such criticisms as they apply to our schools. Moreover, a cordial welcome is extended to the parents to visit the school at any and all times.

It has been a pleasure and a privilege for me to take part in the school program of Stark schools. Thank you for this opportunity to report.

All defects found were reported to the parents concerned.

On the whole the children's general health is very good. The greatest need is dentistry. The six year molars are permanent teeth and should be taken care of regularly.

It is suggested that funds be included in the budget to start the dental program and then add to this any amount the children can afford to pay plus any funds available from activities of the community organizations.
