Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town house in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday the ninth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget, and raise money for the same. If not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
 - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
 - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
 - (c) Election and Registration.
 - (d) Municipal Court.
 - (e) Town hall, lands and other buildings.
 - (f) Damage and Legal Expense.
 - (g) Health Department.
 - (h) Vital Statistics.
 - (i) General Expense Highway Department.
 - (j) Interest on Temporary Loans.
 - (k) Interest on bonds.
 - (l) County Tax.
 - (m) Payment on Bonds.
 - (n) Payment on Temporary Loans.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of the Poor.

- 4. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of Libraries.
- 5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise one thousand seventy-eight dollars (\$1,078.00) for street lighting.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following departments:
 - (a) Police Dearptment.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Department.
- 8. To see what sum of money, if any the Town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the Town Road Maintenance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for winter roads.
- 10. To nominate and elect two members to serve three years on the Municipal Budget Committee.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of Taxes of the Municipal year and to pay out of the Tax money when it is received.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote whereby it adopted the Australian ballot at its annual Town meeting held in said Town of Stewartstown on the 12 day of March 1940, and to be effective on the adjournment of the March Town meeting held in said town on March 9th, 1948.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a Nonpartisan ballot system for the election of its

town officers as provided in Chapter 22, of the Public Laws of 1943, in amendment of Chapter 34, providing for a Non-partisan ballot system for town elections.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to layout and build a road leading from the Back Pond road near the Clarice LaFoe farm going in a southerly direction coming out near the so-called Joe Lakin Place and to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for same. If this new road is built, the road leading from the Joe Lakin Place to the River road and the road from the so-called Nelson Fortier Place to the River road to be automatically discontinued subject to gates and bars when the Selectmen deem the new road passable.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell the old Town grader and to sell all real estate acquired by the Town through a Tax Collector's Deed.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to install one or two street lights at Stewartstown Hollow.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise what sum of monies if any is necessary to have private Driveways ployed that can be plowed and instruct Selectmen to look after same and to remove all snow from the sides of the road wherever it is considered that it has become a nuisance to the public and especially in the village of West Stewartstown.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ to the White Mountain Region Association, being one 1-100th of one per cent of the town valuation, (10c on \$1000) for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising and otherwise calling

attention to the resources and advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the White Mountain Region.

- 19. To choose by Australian Ballot the following Town Officers:
 - (a) Town Clerk.
 - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.

 - (c) Town Treasurer.(d) Three Road Agents.
 - (e) One or more Auditors.
 - (f) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
 - (g) Overseer of Poor.
 - (h) One or more Sextons.
 - (i) Trustee of Trust Fund.
 - (j) One Library Trustee for three years ensuing.
- To see if the Town will vote to instruct its 20. Selectmen to appoint all other town officers as required by law.

To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Superintendent School Committee and the Citizens of the Stewartstown School District:

FOREWORD

Certainly the wealth of natural resources which abound here in this northernmost section of our Grand Old State of New Hampshire is vividly impressed upon our minds whenever we stop a moment to reflect upon our surroundings. Whether our thoughts are absorbed with the grandeur of Mother Nature's handiwork on every side, or with the rolling by of truck load after truck load of milk, potatoes, pulp or logs, as the case may be, our conclusion is the same, namely, we are living in a land of tremendous natural resources and we are doing something with them.

Deeply impressed as we are by the potentiality of these most generally thought of natural resources, we are sometimes prone to overlook the two all important ones. All others are meaningless without them. The intelligence and initiative of our boys and girls, the determining factors of where we will be tomorrow are our greatest "natural resource." Where we are today is not primarily a result of our other natural resources although we have been most fortunate in this respect, but of the abilities which our youths of yesterday developed. Where we will be in the future will be dependent, in turn, upon the abilities which we help our present younger generation to develop.

Faced with this fundamental truth it is imperative that everything possible be done in our schools to meet these needs. Especially is this true, when we realize that we have not only "come a long way" in bringing about the high standards of living enjoyed today but, also, that we have "gone a long way" in depleting our natural resources of a material nature in bringing them up to our present high level. It means that the demands upon our educational system are paramount as never before to assist in developing the most vitally important of all our "natural resources" the ability of our boys and girls to successfully meet the many complicated situations of life.

TEACHERS

We are fortunate that only one change was made in the teaching personnel since last year. Velma Gray, Mae Drew, Junie Aldrich and Cleora Richardson all returned at West Stewartstown. Carrie Riley is again teaching at Cedar Brook, Harriett Gray at the Hollow, and Dorothy Blodgett is teaching at South Hill in Place of Lillian Hart Perry.

NOTES ON THE BUDGET

The School Board's budget for 1948-49 totals \$29,608.00 as compared with \$26,077.00 for last year. The budget is reduced by an estimated income of \$10,375.00, which leaves a requested appropriation of \$19,233.00. The July appropriation 1947 was \$15,586-.41. The increase in this year's budget is explained by increases in salaries, greater number of tuition pupils, and sharp rises in the prices of supplies.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

Except for a few minor repairs to the building in West Stewartstown, most of the painting and repair work done during the summer was confined to the Hollow, Cedar Brook and South Hill schools. Each of these buildings was given a thorough renovation, including repairs and painting of both the walls and ceilings in the classrooms.

The heating system at West Stewartstown school continues to cause considerable trouble during the severe winter weather, and in heating the classrooms evenly. Some of the plumbing may have to be replaced before these conditions can be improved.

ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE

The present enrollment of the district is 140. A breakdown of this shows there are 67 at West Stewartstown, 41 in the three rural schools, and 32 tuition pupils. At this time last year we had 146 enrolled.

In view of the fact that our schools keep every day throughout the school year, regardless of weather conditions, the percentages of attendance are reasonably good. Only one school, the Hollow, was below 90% and both grades 3-4 and 7-8 at West Stewartstown were above 95%. The number of tardinesses shows a remarkable improvement in that the number decreases from 483 the previous year to 88. Continued close cooperation of the home will help greatly to improve the attendance figures and to decrease still further the number of tardinesses.

TUITION

At the present time 32 pupils are attending school outside the district. Of this number 25 are at Canaan, and 7 at Colebrook. Last year there were 30, and the previous year 29 tuition pupils.

Five pupils from Pittsburg are attending the West Stewartstown school.

LEGISLATURE

The past year has been an epoch making one in the passing of legislation beneficial to education. Of the several bills passed, the ones on state aid and teachers' salaries are extremely important. The former provides for the annual distribution of \$2,000,000 on an equalization and general basis for both elementary and secondary education throughout the state. The latter establishes minimum teacher salaries dependent upon the amount of training and experience of the teacher.

CONCLUSION

Again may I reiterate the magnitude of our responsibility to help our boys and girls to develop sterling characters, sound judgments and deep understandings the prerequisites of extensive ability. The degree to which not only our section, but also our nation, maintains and improves upon its present status is going to be directly proportional to the extent that these traits are established and function in the routine every day living of its citizens.

May I take this opportunity to express my deep appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and citizens for all the help received in endeavoring to maintain high standards in our schools.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE OF INVESTIGATION ON CONSOLIDATION OF EAST STEWARTSTOWN SCHOOLS

The Committee of Investigation on Consolidation of East Stewartstown Schools submits its report herewith:

Careful study and consideration of the problem shows that there are five feasible plans:

- 1. Close the three remaining schools and transport both elementary and secondary pupils to the Colebrook Special Schools.
- 2. Classify the Hollow and Cedar Brook Schools, four grades in each school and transport the pupils from South Hill to these schools.

- 3. Close three remaining schools and transport elementary pupils to West Stewartstown School.
- 4. Construct a new two room building of adequate size on a suitable site in the Stewartstown Hollow area.
- 5. Enlarge present Hollow School to a two room building of sufficient size to accommodate all pupils.

Factors considered in formulating the respective plans listed above include:

- a. Estimated cost of \$3000.00 to operate each of the three schools for the next year.
- b. Present enrollment of approximately 40 pupils and the likelihood of an increase in the future.
- c. Increasing problem to find teachers to teach in one room schools.
- d. Question of how long State Dept. of Education will approve present set up and continue to furnish state aid.
- e. Effect of providing transportation for high school pupils upon the number who continue their secondary education.
- f. Provision and estimated cost of transportation involved in different plans.
- g. High cost of materials and labor for construction purposes.

In plan (1) the estimated annual cost of transportation is \$4600 with \$3600 for one large 48-passenger bus, and \$1000 for necessary "feeders." Tuition amounts to around \$1600. This means a saving to the district of approximately \$3000 each year. In

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addition to the financial, there are also several educational advantages which will accrue, such as (1) one teacher for each grade, (2) greater diversification of class activities, (3) more time for class discussions, (4) more time for individual attention, (5) membership of a larger group of the same age, (6) hot lunch program, and (7) use of modern toilet facilities.

Plan (2) provides the educational advantages gained through having fewer grades per teacher, in this case four instead of eight, and of having a smaller range in the ages. The estimated annual cost of operation for each of the two schools is the \$3000 mentioned in Plan (1) plus a possible increase in transportation expenses of \$1000 to transport the pupils from South Hill, and between the Hollow and Cedar Brook Schools. With the corresponding change of state aid for classified schools instead of for approved one room schools, and the closing of one school, an estimated saving of \$1500 is made for the district.

In Plan (3) the estimated cost of transportation, provided good roads are maintained at all times, is comparable to that in Plan (1). There is no tuition expense. With some renovation in and an addition on the present West Stewartstown building, educational advantages will be gained similar to those cited in the first plan. It is difficult to make an estimate of the cost of this plan as compared to the present setup of three schools, because of the high cost of labor and materials, plus the uncertainty of the extent of the construction work involved.

Under the present conditions of the high cost of both materials and labor, the estimated cost of a new two-room building on a new site in the Hollow area, considered in Plan (4), is in the neighborhood of \$15,000. Estimated expenses of operation are somewhat more than the total of two one-room buildings, due to an increase in transportation costs. The cost of an enlargement of the present Hollow School building into a two room structure, called for in Plan (5), is estimated to be somewhat less than the cost of constructing the new building in Plan (4). The possible saving on purchase of materials, however, is used in improving and expand-

ing grounds of present site. Operational expenses are estimated to be the same as for Plan (4). In light of the study made of the five plans,

In light of the study made of the five plans, briefly explained above, it is believed that the first one is the most feasible.
