

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

#### TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in the Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the second day of March, next at 10:00 in for forenoon for balloting upon matters specified in Article 1, listed below, and you are hereby further notified to meet at the Troy Elementary School on Wednesday, the third day of March next at 7:30 PM to act upon the remainder of the listed Warrant.

Article 1. To bring in your votes for one Selectman for three years, and for one Selectman for one year, and all other town officers elected by ballot, as passed by Town Meeting, or State Statute for the specified number of years.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$1,277,250, for the purpose of preparing plans specifications and constructing sewerage and sewerage treatment facilities which are requirements contained in the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended (33 U.S.C. §1251 et seq.) and will qualify the Town for Federal funds, such sum to be raised by the issuance of Serial Bonds or Notes not to exceed \$1,277.250, under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (N.H. R.S.A. 33.1- et seg., as amended) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds or notes as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Troy, and to allow the Selectmen to expend such monies as become available from the Federal Government under the Financial Assistance Program of the Construction Grants section of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended (33 U.S.C. §1251 et seq.) and pass any vote relating thereto,

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, until directed to the contrary at a subsequent Town Meeting, to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal, State, or other assistance as may be available for the design of, and construction of a sewage disposal system, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of said assistance as outlined in N.H. R.S.A. 33:7-b et seq., as amended, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the pro-

visions of RSA 252 (suu), with relation to sidewalks and sewers.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to take any and all such action as may be necessary to acquire whatever easements and lands as are required for the pollution abatement project. Further, the Selectmen are hereby authorized to employ whatever statutory provisions, including RSA 31:92-a, as are deemed necessary or desirable in order to secure the easements and lands required for the project.

Article 6. To see what action the voters wish to take upon the recommendations of the Budget Committee.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the following Town expenditures for the ensuing year.

- a. Town Officers' salaries
- b. Town Officers' expenses
- c. Election and Registration
- d. Town Hall
- e. Parks
- f. Vital statistics
- g. Insurance
- h. Social Security
- i. Shade trees
- j. Interest temporary loans
- k. Memorial Day
- 1. Town dump
- m. Street lighting
- n. Dog Constable
- o. Humane Society
- p. Legal fees
- q. Town Commissioners
- r. Planning Board
- s. Civil Defense

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to add street lights on Jaffrey Road. (By Petition)

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to add street lights on Richmond Road.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highway summer maintenance.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highway winter maintenance.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$401.59 to which the State will contribute \$2,677.28 if voted and

and accepted, for the construction of Class V roads,

Article 13. To see if the town will nominate and elect three citizens at the annual meeting to consult with the Selectmen and the Highway agent in making a study of the feasibility of establishing a Department of Public Works and to require this committee to make a report with the recommendations at the next annual meeting.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to appropriate two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for the Fire Department to be used for the purchase of a compressor and related equipment and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the Fire Department.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the Police Department.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the District Nurses Association.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the Water Department.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to support the operating costs of the Cheshire Hospital.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote and appropriate a sum of money for the continuation of the War Memorial Program.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,270.00 for the studies and operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Gay-Kimball Library.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care of the Cemeteries.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for Old Age Assistance and Public Welfare.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the support of the Monadnock Regional Association.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for

the support of the Monadnock Family and Health Services,

Article 27. To see if the town of Troy will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase an ambulance for an amount not to exceed \$23,527.87 provided that an amount up to \$8,335.00 is provided by the New Hampshire Highway Safety Agency out of Federal Highway safety funds, and provided that the Troy Emergency and Ambulance Service Inc. donates an amount equal to the purchase price of the ambulance less whatever money is provided by the New Hampshire Safety Agency, and further provided that said ambulance shall be operated and administered by the Troy Emergency and Ambulance Service Inc., with title to said vehicle remaining in the Town of Troy.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to be used to improve and maintain that section of Bigelow Hill Road from the Richard Pelto residence to the Liimatainen property and from the Loupa property to the Meagher property. Any work done on this road shall not constitute its acceptance as a Town Highway. (By Petition)

Article 29. To see if the town will vote to reopen and maintain that section of road off Route 12 leading to the residence of Chester Priest.

Article 30. To see if the town will vote to appropriate Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for the purchase and erection of Fencing and related improvements for the War Memorial Recreational Area and authorize the withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Funds.

Article 31. To see if the town will vote to appropriate Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to be used by the Bicentennial Committee in restoring the Steeple to the Town Hall and authorize the withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Funds.

Article 32. To see if the town will vote to appropriate Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00) to be used for repairs to the Heating System and other repairs in the Town Hall and authorize the withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Funds and anticipated income to the Revenue Sharing Funds.

Article 33. To see if the town will vote to appropriate One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to be used by the Bicentennial Committee in funding a Founders Day exercise and authorize withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Funds and anticipated income to the Revenue Sharing Funds.

Article 34. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to pay charges and the interest thereon.

Article 35. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to a Capital Reserve Fund for the Fire Department.

Article 36. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to a Capital Fund for the Highway Department.

Article 37. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate Three Thousand One Hundred and Thirty-Five Dollars (\$3,135.00) to provide monthly payments to the Robert DiLuzio Ambulance Service.

Article 38. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell tax deeded property.

Article 39. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to establish the Arvi Maattala property which the town owns by Tax Collectors Deed as a Town Forest.

Article 40. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to negotiate with F. T. Cummings Inc. for the sale of the so called Sprissler Property to said F. T. Cummings Inc. Approval of this Article is sought to establish clear title to the said property and to return it to the tax rolls.

Article 41. To see if the town will vote to authorize the New Hampshire Housing Commission to operate in Troy as provided for in Chapter 204-A New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated and the provisions of Sections 8 of the New Hampshire Housing Act of 1937 as amended.

Article 42. To hear reports of committees, agents or officers heretofore chosen and take any action relative.

#### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

Two of the four major projects which were authorized in 1973 and 1974 were completed this year: the tax map and substantial repairs to the Town Hall. John E. O'Donnell Associates are now updating the final revisions to the map as suggested at the public hearings held on January 26 and 27. We expect the tax map to be available for use by mid-February.

The remaining two projects, the Sanitary Landfill and the property reappraisal, are still being worked on. We have been assured by the authorities in Concord that the state assessors will complete the reappraisal in time for this year's (1976) property tax assessments. C. E. Maguire will be presenting a report on the Sanitary Landfill on February 12. The present town dump area has been approved as a Sanitary Landfill site by Thomas Sweeney, Director of Solid Waste Division, N. H. Department of Health.

The most pressing issue facing the Town of Troy at the annual meeting will be the proposed sewerage system. We hope every voter will give thoughtful consideration to this issue. It is a fact that the Town is under orders to stop polluting the South Branch of the Ashuelot River. It appears that the proposals advanced by C. E. Maguire specifically, tieing in with Troy Mills on the treatment plant and the basic system, would be the most economical for the Town's interests.

If the voters will approve the necessary funds for town officers' salaries, we hope to have the Town Clerk-Tax Collector on a fulltime basis. The decision to employ any individual on the full-time basis will remain with the Selectmen.

The citizens of Troy are to be congratulated on the renewed interest in civic affairs which has taken place with the formation of the Bicentennial Committee, the Concerned Citizens Committee and the willingness of so many groups and individuals to work together on town affairs. It should be noted that Troy has been disignated a Bicentennial Town and the Bicentennial Committee has received a grant to be used in compiling a historical brochure. A special vote of thanks ought to be given to the Committee which secured the services of Dr. Hamm.

We urge all who can to support the fund raising drive of the Troy Emergency Ambulance Service Inc. This dedicated group of volunteers, when successful, will have provided Troy with a service and a form of protection which is invaluable.

The Selectmen accepted with regret the resignation of John O'Brien, who has served the town for so many years in several offices.

Even in retirement he has continued to assist us.

Our law enforcement has been much more effective since late summer as the direct result of citizens' willingness to sign complaints and to appear as witnesses in court. Without this kind of support, there can be no effective law enforcement in this or any other town.

So many citizens have extended themselves to cooperate with Town officials that we are reluctant to single out individuals, but we must thank the members of the Fire Department especially for their work in taking the Town Census and Mrs. William Hyatt for her unpaid hours of work with the Police Department.





#### TROY WATER WORKS

We the commissioners, wish to express our appreciation to our water patrons for keeping your water bills paid promptly.

Again we lost our secretary treasurer and collector, Marilyn Woods. Constance Poirier has added this position to go with her other town work.

This year we hope to get on to correcting the water contracts with the water users. Your help in these corrections will be appreciated.

Under the Federal act of "Safety of Public Water Systems," we expect an expensive change in filtering and changing our water system.

We feel that soon we will have to raise our water rates to help offset this increase.

Again due to the high water in the fall, leaves and dirt washed into the reservoir, causing unpleasant odors in the water at times. We have raised our chlorine treatment of the water from .2 to .75 P.P.ML. to be sure of the water safety factor. Our water continues at state test of less than .1 coliform count per 100ml.

Then the citizenry of Troy, the so called "Silent Majority" coming forth, speaking out and appearing as witnesses, has been instrumental in accomplishing better prosecution and results in our court activities, and in eliminating a great many problems that existed, and have existed for many years.

I certainly want to thank the people for their efforts in developing a better community to allow the pursuit of peace, tranquility and happiness as everyone deserves.

We would especially like to thank Mr. Robert Harkins for his time, effort and support to this Department, and for being the one instrumental in the creation of the EMT group, an action making this community a better and safer place in which to live.

#### TROY VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION

The services provided by the Troy Visiting Nurse Association include skilled nursing care and treatment and Occupational Therapy for patients after returning to their homes from hospitals. This home care is provided for the convenience of the patients so they do not have to travel to and from a hospital or Doctor's office on "Out-Patient" status. The nurse is instructed by a patient's Doctor as to the care that patient is to get in their home. A fee is charged for this service and in some cases, where warranted, this fee is covered by Medicare or Medicaid.

In accordance with State Public Health policies, visits are also made to individuals at no cost for the purpose of Health Supervision and providing pre-natal, post natal and adult health advice.

Immunization clinics have been held every year, but in the past year or so have not been very successful. We would like to try one more time to hold a successful immunization clinic in this area since this type of clinic is most important to the good health of children in the Troy-Fitzwilliam area.

The total number of visits made in the Troy-Fitzwilliam area for the year 1975 is 901; 511 being made in Troy and 390 being made in Fitzwilliam.

#### TROY WAR MEMORIAL

To the Taxpayers of Troy

The summer recreation program began its season on the 24th of June and ran through the 22nd of August. Mornings were set aside for swimming lessons and water safety classes, for a total enrollment of 137 children. Swimming tests were given on Friday as needed. The afternoons were used by the instructors for organized athletics, softball, baseball, vollyball, basketball and tennis. Also recreational swimming and boating. A few field trips were held on Friday.

The complete program was supervised by five qualified instructors, with safety of the children their most important responsibility.

About 90% of the sports and recreational equipment had to be replaced or repaired and should last with the proper supervision and care.

A chain link fence was installed around the basketball court, and a few log and plank barriers placed on the foot paths to stop the damage being done by vehicles that raced through the area.

For residents of all ages, the tennis courts proved to be the big attraction, and again this year we will open them up as soon as possible in the spring and turn on the night lights, so they can be enjoyed by all.

The War Memorial Committee feels that a big improvement has been made in the complete recreation area, landscaping, trees planted, brush cut, swimming area cleaned and a general improvement in the looks of everything.

Much of this is due to Robert Judd who took a personal interest in the complete recreation area. Although he worked there, many hours of his own time were put in insuring that the area was kept clean and that vandalism was kept to a minimum. We thank Clarence Baird for his time and equipment and Cleon Rouleau for his donated labor. Also Bert Lang for repairing the playground equipment and Harold Newell for rebuilding the benches.

Many others helped and we thank them.

We hope and plan to have a good program this year for the children; to fence in the ball field at the sand dam; and to develop two more ball fields on town property off Marlborough Rd. for the use of all teams in Troy, young and old.

### TROY BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

Upon passage of the Troy Zoning Ordinance the Board of Adjustment was formed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Hampshire.

The duties of the Board of Adjustment as mandated by New Hampshire State Law and in accordance with Troy Zoning Laws are to hear and decide appeals where it is alleged there is an error on a determination made by an administrative official or in enforcement thereof, or to hear and decide special exceptions and variances. Because of special conditions, a literal enforcement of the provisions of the Troy Zoning Ordinance will result in unnecessary hardship, and so that the spirit of the Zoning Ordinance shall be observed and substantial justice be done.

- Article 14. To see if the town will vote and appropriate a sum of money for the continuation of the War Memorial Program. Passed.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,156.00 for the studies and operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. Passed.
- Article 16. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Gay-Kimball library. Passed.
- Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the care of the cemeteries. Passed.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for Old Age Assistance and public welfare. Passed.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the support of the Monadnock Regional Association. Passed Over.
- Article 20. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the payment of the water bonds and interest thereon. Passed.
- Article 21. To see if the town will vote a sum of \$1,000 for the balance due on the tax map. Passed.
- Article 22. (By Petition) To see if the town will vote to adopt Chapter 155 of the Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire relative to fire prevention standards relating to factories, hotels, tenement houses, public buildings, school houses, places of assembly and other buildings used as public resort, to be so erected as not to endanger the health and safety of persons who may occupy them, or act in any manner relating thereto. Passed.
- Article 23. (By Petition) To see if the town will vote to reopen and maintain that section of road off Route 12 leading to the residence of Chester Priest. Passed Over.
- Article 24. (By Petition) To see if the town will vote to reopen and maintain that section of the Bigelow Hill Road for a distance of 1/2 of a mile from the Richard Pelto residence. Passed Over.
- Article 25. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges. Passed.
- Article 26. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to a capital reserve fund for the fire department. Passed.
- Article 27. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to a capital reserve fund for the highway department. Passed.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote and appropriate a sum of money to provide engineering services to develop a sanitary landfill and necessary contractual services until a landfill is developed. The amount of \$27,000 was changed to read \$15,000. This passed.

Article 29. To see if the town will vote to apply all uncommitted Federal Revenue Sharing Funds now on hand and any funds received during the calendar year to the development of a sanitary landfill.

Amendment #1. Motion to limit amount to \$8,622 plus interest. This Passed.

Amendment #2. Motion to delete the words "and any funds received during the calendar year" and the word "land-fill" was changed to read "solid waste disposal." Passed.

Article 29 as it now reads:

To see if the town will vote to apply all uncommitted Federal Revenue Sharing Funds now on hand to the development of a sanitary solid waste disposal. This Passed.

Article 30. To hear reports of committees, agents or officers heretofore chosen and take any action relative thereto. There were none.
