

TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L.S.] To the inhabitants of the Town of Unity qualified to vote in town affairs:

> You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on the 10th day of March next at 9 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

2. To hear the reports of the selectmen and other town officers and pass any vote in relation thereto.

3. To choose a member of the board of Selectmen for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Trustee of the Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.

5. To choose a Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.

6. To choose all other necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.

7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay deficit of 1935.

8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Librarian's salary.

9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Old Age Assistance and Town Poor charges.

10. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise to pay other necessary town charges.

11. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise to pay the just debts of the town.

12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance, including snow removal of highways and determine the price to be paid per hour for labor.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$485.24 for the construction of Class V town roads provided the State shall appropriate the sum of \$1,940.96 for the same purpose it

being understood that if said appropriation is made by the State and the Town accepts said special aid that the Town shall not be entitled to State aid for Class II roads.

14. To see if the Town will vote to accept State aid for construction of Class II road known as Second New Hampshire Turnpike and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$540.00 the State will allot \$1,080.00.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

16. To see if the Town will vote to discount on taxes paid on or before June 1st and September 1st, 1936.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$300.00 for white pine blister rust control.

18. To see what action the Town will take to purchase snow removal equipment.

19. To see whether the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to issue a note or notes of the town in an amount not exceeding Four Thousand Five Hundred (\$4,500.00) Dollars to meet outstanding and maturing obligations, under authority of Chapter 63 of the Laws of 1933, as amended, provided the Governor and Council authorize the issuance of such a note or notes.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

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SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Unity School Board:

I hereby submit my third annual report as your superintendent of schools.

Two teachers of last year's force accepted positions in other systems to begin work at the opening of the fall term. Their places have been filled by Miss Janet Whitcomb at the Center School and Miss Ada Perkins at the Church School. They are graduates of Keene Normal School and they have been very successful with their work thus far. Miss Irene Tupper at the County School, Miss Gretal Palmer at the Center School, and Mrs. L. Alice Douglass at the East Unity School are able teachers of whom any school system might feel proud.

The Church School was opened in the fall to care for the four upper grades of West Unity. The County School and the Church School were painted inside and improved. Both show good workmanship. Last year the Center School was painted and repaired. I still hope that the WPA will help to bring water into the East Unity School and make other repairs there.

With fourteen graduating from the eighth grade next spring it is to be expected that there will be an increase in the number of high school pupils next year, and therefore in the cost of tuitions. There will be a fair sized balance this year to help meet the excess costs. This balance should be left with the town as long as not needed by the district, but it should be reappropriated at the school district meeting to cut down taxes and with the dog tax should be paid to the school district by the town before any appropriation of 1936-1937 is paid. I believe that this arrangement will be acceptable to all state officials. It would seem to be poor business for the town to pay interest while the district has money that is idle. It also would be unfortunate for the district to appropriate new funds while leaving the town with debt that really does not exist except on paper.

By agreement with state officials all obligations of the town to the district on appropriations and dog taxes prior to those of 1935-36 have been cancelled thus erasing a fictitious debt.

Again I wish to thank the Unity School Board, the teachers and the citizens of Unity for their kindnesses and help.
