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

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, Trust Fund Trustee, three Hospital Trustees to serve for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for—

3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange and Rotary Club and all church organizations, for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.

6. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano.

7. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the present road from the Tedesco driveway to Bilodeau's when the new road is completed.

8. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a nonpartisan ballot system for the election of town officers, the same to take effect at the March Town Meeting, 1957.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$700 to complete new athletic field. This amount will complete landscaping, bleachers and backstop.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for Child Recreation, to be directed by the Recreational Committee of the Chamber of Commerce. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for band concerts.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$96 to flameproof the stage curtains at the Town Hall. This treatment will last three years. The last treatment was in 1952.

13. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

#### Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Whitefield for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1955, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

#### Scope of Audit

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

#### **Financial Statements**

## Comparative Balance Sheets—Dec. 31, 1954—Dec. 31, 1955: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1954 and December 31, 1955, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt increased by \$16,-799.97 during 1955.

## Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues:

#### (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1955, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net overdraft of appropriations of \$8,869.83, less a revenue surplus of \$1,911.26, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$6,958.57.

#### Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1955, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1955, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

#### Audit Procedure

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals or receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks.

#### **General Comments**

#### **Current Deficit:**

During the year 1955 the current deficit (excess of current liabilities over total assets) increased from \$13,109.04 to \$19,909.01, as shown by the following statement:

Attention is again called to the fact that sound financial condition of a town requires that the assets be sufficient in amount to offset the current liabilities. Provision should therefore be made for the liquidation of the current deficit. It is suggested that it may be advisable to do this over a period of four or five years with annual appropriations of \$5,000.00 or \$4,000.00, or until such time as the current deficit may be entirely liquidated.

Appropriation overdrafts were responsible for the increase in the current deficit during the year as indicated herewith:

#### Unredeemed Taxes-Prior Years' Levies:

It is noted that there were unredeemed taxes from the tax sales on account of the levies of 1952 and prior years as follows:

As the two year period in which redemptions may be made has expired, it is recommended that tax deeds be given by the Collector to the Town on properties represented by the unredeemed tax liens on account of the levies of 1949, 1950, 1951 and 1952.

#### **Conclusion:**

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Whitefield for their assistance during the course of the audit.

#### Be A Good Citizen—Cooperate

Smoking and debris burning caused more than 50 percent of the forest fires occurring in the state of New Hampshire in 1955—235 fires out of a total of 463 originated from these two sources. Lighted smoking material and matches thrown from moving vehicles along the highway or dropped by fishermen, hunters, hikers, berry and flower pickers accounted for 26 percent; debris burning in the wrong place or at the wrong time by those who failed to heed all pleas for safety or refused to recognize the logical, sensible rules and regulations set up under legislative authority governing the use of fire in or near woodlands accounted for more than 24 percent. This is inexcusable.

Everything possible is being done officially to remedy the situation. Since 1909 there has been a statute on our law books which requires everyone to secure written permission from the local forest fire warden before starting a fire in or near woodlands or where fire can be communicated to woodlands, unless the ground is covered with snow. A never ending program of educational work is being carried on by your local warden and state officials to inform the general public both of the value and necessity of securing the required permit for such burning. Much progress has been made, but there are still many who fail or refuse to cooperate. The value of our permit system was definitely proven in this district during the 1955 calendar year. District local wardens issued 959 permits for debris burning fires. That's a lot of permits. The records show only 2 permit fires got out of control. This proves several things-while wardens were liberal in the issuance of fire permits, accommodating every applicant so far as possible, they were cautious, following closely directives outlining overall policy governing the issuance of burning permits and thoroughly instructing permit users. The latter, too, fully appreciating their responsibility in using their permits, governed themselves accordingly. Result? Much burning done legally and safe.

But what of the smokers? Despite all the efforts of those officially charged with the responsibility of preventing fires, too many were careless or thoughtless in disposing of smoking material and matches. Why? It is difficult to say. Autos are now equipped with ash trays. Why not use them? The crushing out of a cigar, cigarette and the complete extinguishment of matches before being discarded is an easy chore.

If the costly habits of the careless and indifferent smoker and debris burner could be overcome, more than half of our annual forest fires would be eliminated. Will YOU do YOUR share to bring this about?

#### REMEMBER

- 1. Get a written permit from your local warden before starting your debris burning or camp fire. The law requires it.
- 2. Make certain they are dead out before leaving them.
- 3. Become a safe smoker by extinguishing smoking material and matches before discarding them.

# Your Town Report and Your People's Information

Your Region Association has had in 1955 one of the most active years. Naturally, the highlight was the Presidential visit in June, and we were honored by taking a direct part in various phases of the planning which went on for months previous. Seldom has the limelight been so directly centered on the White Mountains in a national scale.

Through all the complications and confusion surrounding that planning we somehow found time to carry on our normal schedule of work benefiting our towns. Much outside travel has carried the "message of the mountains" personally to Boston, Hartford, Springfield, New York, and Philadelphia. Events such as a Guides' Show and a Women's Golf Tournament were promoted and brought gratifying publicity. Stories and pictures were placed in many publications, and thousands of publicity folders distributed, as well as direct mail answering of several thousand letters and cards with information.

Our annual 4-H contest continues to have heartening results in encouraging young people's efforts through this fine organization. Another standby, the real-estate bulletin, has put property prospects in touch with property owners and realtors all over the region.

Is it all doing you, the tax-payer, any good? "Yes!" to that. We tracked down some of our mail inquirers in a random sample again this year. We found that out of just this small sample (500 letters and cards) we had 100 parties that spent just over 17,000 in the Region! That represents over  $2\frac{1}{2}$  times the amount appropriated by all our towns last year. We're sure you would all be glad to invest \$1.00 to get back \$2.50, any day.

Naturally this income isn't the only total we brought in, as there are many, many more we have no way of tracing. But it does show this is big business. It means that these people are paying big sums of tax money that doesn't come out of your pockets. With your continued help we can ease the burden of the tax load in all towns, bringing outside money to help pay for state and local services that otherwise you'd have to finance.
