Resolved, to adopt the budget as recommended by the Finance Committee, with the exceptions of schools and other fixed items.

Article. 3. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to deliver the inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory.

Resolved to adopt the article.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow on notes on the credit of the town, such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

Resolved, to adopt the article. Unanimous vote.

Article 5. To see what action the town will take in respect to appointing three members of the finance committee for the ensuing three years.

Resolved, to appoint the following as members of the finance committee for three years, and to instruct the Town Clerk to cast one ballot for each.

Donald Galbraith, Sr. Walter D. O'Hearne Ralph K. Weeks

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to accept all trust funds of \$100.00 or more for perpetual care of lots in the cemeteries.

Resolved, to adopt the article with the following amendment: "That the town vote to accept all trust funds of \$50.00 or more for lots of three graves or less,

and \$100.00 or more for larger lots. For perpetual care of such lots in the cemeteries."

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 to pay the town's share of Social Security for its employees for the year 1955.

Resolved, to adopt the article.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow up to the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of installing adequate flashing red light warning signals at the North Charlestown Station crossing, under the following conditions:

- That the State Public Utilities Commission decides that the Boston & Maine Railroad shall pay at least half of the installation cost.
- 2. That one half of the money borrowed plus interest be repaid in 1956, and the other half plus interest be repaid in 1957.

Resolved, to adopt the following amendment in place of the article. "That Article 8 be amended to read: That the Town Selectmen recommend to the Public Utilities Commission that the crossing at North Charlestown Station be closed to vehicular traffic but be kept open for pedestrians."

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow up to the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of installing adequate flashing red light warning signals at the Bowen Mill crossing, under the following conditions:

- That the State Public Utilities Commission decides that the Boston & Maine Railroad shall pay at least half of the installation cost.
- 2. That one half of the money borrowed plus interest to be repaid in 1956, and the other half plus interest be repaid in 1957.

Resolved, that the article be adopted. Unanimous vote.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for the purpose of having all taxable property in town appraised by the State Tax Commission. (By petition)

Resolved, to dismiss the article. Yes 104 No 25

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow a sum of money not to exceed \$2,000.00 for the use of the water department, to replace the 2 inch pipe with 6 inch cast iron pipe, from E. Paquette's residence in a westerly direction to the so-called River View Park, and install a hydrant at the westerly end, this money to be repaid out of the earnings of the water department. (By request)

Resolved, to dismiss the article.

Article 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Motion made and adopted that the committee of Future Development of Charlestown study the possibility of setting up a precinct area in Charlestown and report their findings at the next meeting.

Article 1. To choose the necessary town officers for their respective terms.

- Art. 2. To consider the budget. To raise such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for the maintenance of the poor, laying out and repairing highways, building and repairing bridges, street lighting and for the necessary charges arising within the town.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to deliver the inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory.
- Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow on notes on the credit of the town, such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expenses in anticipation of taxes.
- Art. 5. To see what action the town will take in respect to appointing three members of the finance committee for the ensuing three years.
- Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to accept trust funds, in the amounts voted at the 1955 Town Meeting, for the perpetual care of lots in the cemeteries.
- Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to rescind the action taken at its annual meeting on March 8, 1955 under Article 9 of the Warrant for said meeting, relating to the installation of adequate flashing red light warning signals at the Bowen Mill crossing.
- Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to petition the Public Utilities Commission to require the Boston & Maine Railroad to install

adequate flashing red light warning signals at the Bowen Mill crossing and to borrow the necessary funds on the credit of the town, to defray such cost of installation as the Public Utilities Commission may assess against the town.

- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$600.00 to provide police protection during the hours children are going and coming from school. (By request)
- Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate sufficient money to install four street lights in the area known as Crown Point Heights, one street light to be on Summit Street near the residence of Harry Noyes, one street light to be between the residences of Robert Stone and Albert King, one street light to be between the residences of George Collins and Arthur Parsons, and one street light to be near the residence of Cedric Lumbra. (By petition)
- Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$25.00 to be contributed to the New Hampshire Marine Memorial Commission.
- Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to accept Crown Point Heights as part of Zone A in the Town of Charlestown. (By petition)
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to name the cemetery in Snumshire the Pine Crest Cemetery. (By request)
- Art. 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Town Road Aid Report

Town road aid is for work on Class 5 roads, which are school bus and mail routes. \$6,195.81 was expended on this work in 1955 in Charlestown. The town spent \$808.15, and the State furnished the balance of \$5,387.66. The work this year was mainly a continuation of work started on the Hemlock road. Banks were cut back and curves were widened at three places; namely near the residences of Lewis Russell and Rex Smith on the Acworth road, and Edward Merrill on the Hemlock road. All work was under the supervision of a state highway engineer from the Keene office. Mr. Kenneth Whitney was the state timekeeper on this job, and Mr. Whitney's report shows the following:

- 1. Cut 30 trees over 6 inches in diameter.
- 2. Cut 8/10 mile of brush.
- 3. Used 4,920 yards gravel.
- 4. Used 3 tons of chloride.
- 5. Set 50 fence posts.
- 6. Installed 8 culverts each 32 ft. long by 15 in.

Report for the Year of 1955 by Road Agent John Morris

In the maintenance of town roads this past year, this department used as follows:

8560 cubic yards of gravel.

1500 cubic yards of sand.

2 carloads of salt.

6 tons of calcium.

The road south of the Alfred Smith saw mill was graveled and widened. Three bridges were re-planked and repairs made to the abutments. The so-called Trybulski bridge in South Charlestown was replaced with a metal culvert, 10 feet in diameter by 50 feet in length. Abutments were built, and a 24 foot roadbed was made.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Taking the suggestion of the Selectmen, the Charlestown Police Department will this year, try to give a written picture of the variation in calls received during the year 1955. A total of 408 calls and complaints were received. Some are listed in part in the following:

January:

6 auto accidents. Juveniles broke into B. & M. Railroad Depot, and destroyed property, were apprehended by local police and B. & M. R. R. officials. Numerous complaints of dogs chasing deer were taken. Calls requiring investigation ranged from locating missing persons to a husband whose life was threatened by his wife.

February:

7 auto accidents, three of which involved three cars, including an ambulance that had arrived to remove the injured. There were several complaints on dogs barking and killing chickens, An officer was posted to protect ice sculptures.

March:

6 auto accidents. Various complaints received on Peeping Tom and a theft reported at filling station. Both offenders were apprehended by local police. Assisttance asked for and given Claremont Police Department in trying to locate a hit & run driver. Transient with partially paralyzed limbs turned over to proper authorities April:

3 auto accidents, 1 airplane accident, 1 fatality, 1 suicide. Numerous complaints of rubbish being left on other's property, and garbage left on side of road creating foul odors. Offenders were apprehended. Brawl reported and taken care of.

May:

2 auto accidents, road check made by local & State authorities. 1 brawl taken care of, mad dog turned over to Dr. Haubrich. Complaints received of stray cattle, child reported missing (found by police), and several calls on stranger behaving in odd manner. (Transient looking for night's lodging in P. D.)

June:

4 auto accidents, burglar alarm set off by person entering through a window. Subject apprehended.

July:

2 auto accidents, several calls on electric light wires arcing, and caused by electrical storm. Policed swimming pool while foreign matter in pool was investigated. Painted yellow lines and No Parking signs around business section.

August:

2 auto accidents. Calls included a child bitten by dog, cows feeding in neighbor's garden, disputes over children, man struck on the head by the falling limb of tree and was hospitalized, a driverless car obstructing traffic, and duties at Old Home Day Celebration.

September:

1 auto accident, complaints of tree across the road, domestic animals being poisoned, brawl, and a call from the Springfield Police Dept. to try and locate an A.W.O. L. Subject was located by this department and held for proper authorities. 2 way radio installed by State Police in Concord, through Civilian Defense Director, Archibald Sayce. Brought back radio equipment for Fire Department.

October:

4 auto accidents. Various complaints of stray dogs, dogs killing sheep, and ducks. Owners of offending dogs located and they made restitution for damage caused. Reports of cars passing school busses, while red lights were on, call on bicycle running into an automobile, and a breaking and entering complaint. (Offenders apprehended.)

November:

1 auto accident. Halloween with 6 men on duty. Air raid alert sounded. Complaint of resident that gun shots were fired at them while passing in a car. (Subject apprehended.)

December:

4 auto accidents. Call from Springfield Doctor to locate two of his patients to deliver messages to.

Included in the activities of the Police force, are reporting doors of business establishments found to be unlocked, street lights found to be out, directing traffic at fires, and policing all dances and basketball games. Emergency and death messages are delivered.

The chief fills out forms for the U. S. Government on every man or woman who enters any branch of the armed services, on anyone applying for a Civil Service appointment, and on anyone seeking employment in an aircraft plant. Correspondence is also heavy from insurance companies, concerning auto accidents.

Files are kept by the Chief on arrests made by this department, and are used frequently on file checks requested by other police departments and the F.B.I.

A copy of every suspension, revocation, denial, and financial responsibility proof, issued by the N. H. Motor Vehicle Dept., is sent to the Chief and kept on file at his home.

No Parking signs are put up, and road markings are painted by the Police Department on any road maintained by the town.

A total of 99 dog tax notices were addressed and mailed by the Chief, and all unpaid taxes after the 10 day period allowed were given to the Chief for collection.

All Jury notices are delivered by the Chief.

My thanks to all who have shown cooperation to this department in the preceding year.

WATER COMMISSION

Superintendent's Report - Earl P. Putnam

During the past year the Water Department has attempted to fulfill some of its numerous obligations. A few of the important ones being the installing of six meters, two new extensions consisting of 305 ft., $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. cement line pipe and 200 ft., 2 in. cement line pipe; the cost being shared by the property owners. Also, we added on five new services, replaced ten services with new pipe and repaired two major breaks in the water mains. We replaced a total of 190 ft., $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. galvanized pipe, 185 ft., $3\frac{1}{4}$ in. copper pipe with 375 ft., 2 in. cement line pipe.

Our aim for this year is to make as many, if not more, improvements in our water system.

Report of the Secretary and Treasurer of the Water Commission

In order to meet the increasing cost of operations, the Board of Commissioners found it necessary to readjust the water rates. The rate structure now compares favorably with our neighboring communities.

With this increase we have been able during the past year to meet our outstanding obligations, correct or repair numerous faulty conditions in the system, as well as make a number of new installations. In many cases, the cost of the new installations were shared by the home owner.

The survey authorized at the 1953 Town Meeting was completed the latter part of this summer; being approved and accepted. Among other things, it was recommended that a gradual change-over from our present rate structure to a metering system would be desirable. The increased revenue has allowed us to make a substantial start on this program.

We anticipate continuing a conservative program of repairs and improvements which will enable us to better serve the community.

REPORT OF TOWN PLANNING COMMITTEE

The survey of the water and sewer systems by the engineering firm of Barker & Wheeler has been completed and a very comprehensive report made. A copy of this report is in the hands of the Water Commissioners and another in the Selectmen's Office, together with complete maps of the water and sewer systems, and may be seen by anyone interested.

In general the report is more optomistic than we had been led to believe, and we do not see that any major undertaking needs to be started at the present time.

The watershed of the Charlestown water system seems capable of producing at least 6,000,000 gallons of water during the driest month of the year, and the average monthly consumption is about 3,630,000 gallons, so we are using about 60% of the available output of the watershed. This should take care of the normal growth of the town, by increasing the capacity of the reservoirs when necessary.

The average daily water consumption per person is 68 gal., which, while not excessive, is rather high. It is suggested, and we recommend, that hourly meter readings, especially during the night hours, be taken for a few days, to see if the high flow of water at night

might indicate leakage somewhere in the lines. Records of these readings, along with the daliy readings now taken at the chlorination plant, should be retained by the water commissioners for use in future studies.

Water pressure and flowage is fairly satisfactory at all points on the system except on the upper Claremont road. Here the water pressure with hydrant closed is 37.5 lb., but this drops to 0 with a hydrant open, and the flowage only 170 gal. per min., whereas it is over 500 gal. per min. down street. Water for use in fire fighting can be available under pressure by use of a pumping truck, such as we have available in the fire department.

Many of the water lines in Charlestown are of 2 in. or less diameter, some as small as ¾ in., giving unsatisfactory flowage in some areas. We recommend that new lines or replacements be of 6 in. pipe, if adequate fire protection is to be provided.

The North Charlestown water system seems to be adequate for the number of families served.

No particular recommendations are made in respect to the Charlestown sewer system, as used at present, with discharges into the Connecticut River. When the time comes that the Connecticut River is cleared from sewage disposal, it will be necessary to have two disposal plants in Charlestown.

For the main outlet at Lower Landing, a digestion and filter system is recommended which will cost approximately \$70,000. The sewage from the Cheshire Bridge area can be taken care of through a large septic tank and filter bed, which would be much less expensive. Recommendations are made for further study and collection of data, before more exact estimates can be made, but we feel that there will be time for such studies later, when there is more evidence of immediate need of such disposal plants.

As in the past year, the Granite State Electric Company is replacing old street lighting fixtures with more modern types at no cost to the town.

By request at the last Town Meeting, the committee has discussed the possibility of a Precinct Area. We feel that such areas would mean considerable extra book work and no advantage, since the cost of each area is comparatively large, even to the taxpayer.

Town areas have sidewalks and street lights, but less roads to maintain and school transportation costs.

The water and sewer upkeep is paid by the user.

We wish to thank the Selectmen and Water Department for their help at our meetings in the past year.
