# Town Warrant

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

- To the inhabitants of the Town of Cornish qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet in the Town House on the second Tuesday, being the eleventh day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:
- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will raise for repair of highways and bridges in addition to that required by law.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to dispense with the services of a liquor agent for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen not to deliver the blank invoice bills until the time of taking inventory.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Memorial Day.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to pay librarians.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the repair of cemeteries.
- 9. To see what action the Town will take in regard to making up any deficiency in the interest of the William Mercer fund, and to raise money therefor.
- 10. To see if the Town will instruct the Selectmen to apply for State aid on highways.

- 11. To see if the Town will raise the necessary amount for maintenance of the State road.
- 12. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise to continue widening road west of house occupieed by C. B. Titus.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 to gravel road, beginning at a point near residence of Charles Robbins, continuing westerly along north side of mill pond.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to finish graveling river road.
- 15. To hear the reports of the officers, agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

# Report of School Board

Because of the change in the school year the only report we can make at this time is for the spring term beginning April 1st, 1918, and ending the last of June.

With two or three exceptions the teachers were the same as for the two previous terms. Where changes were made, we were able notwithstanding the number who had gone into government work, to secure competent teachers who worked faithfully with their pupils to

complete their years' work.

Perhaps we should say a few words concerning the present school year. We had some difficulty in securing our full number of teachers in September but finally all the schools were supplied. The work of the fall term was interrupted by the influenza epidemic, but by shortening vacations, we hope for a school year of thirty-four weeks.

The schools of Cornish as well as the community suffered a distinct loss in the removal from town of Rev. F. J. Franklyn, who had served most efficiently on the school

board for several years.

We should all appreciate the interest taken in our schools by Mr. and Mrs. Robert Barrett and the help they give in so many different ways—particularly having the school supplies and supplies from the library taken

to each of the schools every week.

The Educational Bill now before the State Legislature will, if passed, make such changes in the management of the schools that school boards have been advised by the State Board of Education not to hold the school meeting as early as usual.

Because of this bill too, we are unable at the present time to give the usual estimate of the amount of money needed for the use of the schools for the coming year.
