TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

L. S.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Croydon, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon (the polls not to close earlier than 6 o'clock in the afternoon) to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose one (1) Selectman, for a period of three years, a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, two Auditors, one Trustee of Library for three years, and all such other officers and agents as may be necessary for the transaction of the Town's business for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see if the Town will elect one or more highway agents for one year who perform their duties under the direction of the Selectmen.

Article 3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V roads, and raise and appropriate money for the same. Town to raise \$393.34 and State to give \$2,622.25.

Article 5. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for Class V highway bridges, and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for that purpose.

Article 6. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for highways and bridges and keeping the roads open and sanded during the winter.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for maintaining Town Dump.

Article 8. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the General Expense of the Highway Department.

Article 9. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a new roof for Town Hall and painting inside of Town Hall.

Article 10. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting brush on the roadsides of Town highways.

Article 11. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the upkeep of cemeteries.

Article 12. To see if the Town wishes to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for Capital Reserve Fund for acquisition of equipment.

Article 13. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting and for lighting Town buildings.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire all necessary sums of money for its use during the year, in anticipation of taxes.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40.00 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, together with other Towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control to be spent in co-operation with the State Forestry Department.

Article 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for road construction and/or to eliminate snow traps on Town Roads.

Article 18. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for aid age assistance.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road between Fowles and Hartley residence approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ mile long located east of Newport town line, running parallel with Croydon highway near Reed's Mill.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase property where purchase of such property shall save the Town excessive school charges.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to give Henry Sawyer the privilege to move the stones from the Pinnacle Cemetery to the Four Corners Cemetery and to reset them.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate funds for surveying and laying out the lots on new plots; to decide on price per lot for residence and non-residence at the Croydon Flat Cemetery.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise funds for a plaque commemorating Henry Sawyer over at East Village Cemetery.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to buy a rake for use on the roads; to rake stones off road.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road formerly passing to the west and south of the Lewis residence.

Article 26. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Croydon:

In my second report since the Croydon School District became a part of Supervisory Union No. 43, I wish to call several items to your attention — some as a matter of record and others as recommendations for your consideration.

Pursuant to the vote of the 1955 District Meeting, members of Grade 8 are attending school in Newport. I am most happy to report not only from my own observation, but from the comments of the parents, pupils and teachers that this change has been a good one for the pupils. The upper grades (4-7) were transferred to the Flat School and Mrs. Doris Kibbey is now teaching that level. This move also, I believe, was an excellent one for the welfare of the students. The primary grades (1-3) are now housed at the Village School. We were able to secure the services of Mrs. Lucy Rogers, an elementary teacher with several years' experience, for this school.

STATE AID

Under the provisions of the State Aid formula as set up by the 1955 Legislature, Croydon is this year receiving \$6,123.88 from State Aid. This is an increase of \$4,655.71 over the figure of \$1,468.17 which was received the previous year. The entire amount was used to reduce taxes.

Croydon received 100 per cent of the State Aid for which it qualified under the formula, whereas many of the communities receiving State Aid were pro-rated. Approximately the same amount of State Aid will be received for the coming year, subject to local membership and total state membership.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The purpose of providing State Aid funds to needy districts is to "equalize educational opportunity among the several districts of the state." In other words the purpose of this money is not for tax reduction alone. Some of it should make it possible for school districts to provide buildings and services and help to pay teachers more in line with the educational level of wealthier communities.

I believe few people in Croydon are completely satisfied with the present facilities in the schools. Many improvements are desirable but they would be expensive and could not be accomplished in a year or two. However, I would like to suggest that consideration be given to doing something each year to bring about these desired improvements. I would list several as follows:

1. Better Lighting
2. Better Heating Facilities
3. Water Supply
4. Modern Plumbing

These improvements will not come about unless the people take steps to provide them. I would suggest as a start that improved lighting and an improved heating system might be provided for one school for the coming year.

Unless you do start on some system of providing these improvements — if you desire them — it will be years before the Croydon schools have what many one-room schools have today.

CONCLUSION

In conclusion I would like to pay my respects to the work of the late Ernest P. Kibbey who served as a member of the School Board for a number of years. He was an honest, faithful and conscientious servant of the people whose devoted service to the schools — in many instances far beyond the call of duty — should be appreciated by all.
