To the Inhabitants of the Town of Eaton in the County of Carroll in the State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at Odd Fellows Hall in said Eaton on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:—

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same, including Town Officers' salaries, Town Officers' expenses, Election and Registration expense, Town Hall expense, Fire Department, Health Department, Highway and Bridges, Town Maintenance and General Expense, Street Lighting, Libraries, Old Age Assistance, Cemeteries, Legal Expenses, Interest, Town Road Aid, Payments on Town Debt.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's Deeds.
- 4. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes, if necessary.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27.00 to the Lakes Region Association.

- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to purchase Fire Fighting Equipment and provide a building for the storage of same.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money to repair the roof of the Town Vault.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the renewing of Doctor Toppan's bridge and the first bridge on the Conway Lake Road.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 as a special appropriation for the repair of the Potter Town road.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the cutting of bushes on back roads.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board of Eaton:

It was fortunate that Mrs. Mabel Linscott of Brownfield was willing to teach until Christmas recess, and she plans to return as early in March as traveling conditions permit. Mrs. Alice Merrow of Center Ossipee is substituting for the present.

The problem of housing the number of pupils in Eaton is not improving. I recommend that a complete census be taken next September so that the approximate number who will enter school for the next five years will be known. This year there are 33 in grades 1-6, and 6 are now attending grades 7-8 in Conway. Only 3 are in grade 6, and there may be as many as 9 enter next September. No complete educational program can be carried on with more than 30 in a school of six grades. The problem is one of a building program, or continued transportation.

The teacher shortage continues as the two Teachers Colleges combined graduate less than 20 elementary teachers. Salaries increase along with a national demand by organized labor for higher wages.

It is highly gratifying that the average attendance has improved. The increased transportation service may be a factor in this. It is gratifying, whatever the cause, because the State Aid is partly determined by the average daily membership.

The per pupil cost for elementary education paid by Eaton in 1945-46 was \$107.93 as compared with the State average of \$109.11, and the cost in Conway of \$86.02, in Chatham of \$134.73, in Madison of \$121.14, and in Freedom of \$179.15.
