TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Epping, in the County of Rockingham, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to Vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for roads and bridges.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money as per the contract with Portsmouth Power Co.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Public Library.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Decoration Day expenses.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for winding and care of Town Clock.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of trunk line, on condition that the state will contribute an equal amount.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of state aid road on condition that the state will contribute an equal amount.
 - 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and ap-

propriate a sum of money towards suppressing Pine Blister Rust.

- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for removal of snow from trunk line, on condition that the state will contribute an equal amount.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to install electric lights from residence of W. J. Feildsend to residence of James D. Whittemore.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from the corner of Elm street and Mill street to state road.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to purchase a new transmission for fire truck.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to install a cement bridge at Proulx's Brick Yard.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to repair bridge near Hedding Station.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to continue the electric lights from Cyrus Sanborn residence to residence of Irvin Norris at West Epping.
- 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER

I herewith submit my report as health officer for the year ending January 31, 1927.

In the past year we have had but few contagious diseases. Whooping cough, measles and scarlet fever were the only ones reported and none were fatal.

Clean-up Week in our town, I believe, has much to do in keeping our town free from contagious diseases, and I would recommend that we have one in the spring and another in the fall.

I believe some action should be taken regarding the town sewerage system, so that our citizens would be able to connect with the same. It would thereby eliminate several nuisances that now exist.

We have received orders from the state board of health that our water system must be properly filtered and action taken at our next town meeting or the same must be discontinued.

The vaccination law has been enforced as usual by the assistance of the district nurse and our proficient Dr. A. W. Mitchell.

It is to be regretted that some of our business men still persist in violating the law relating to the display of goods to dirt and dust.

In conclusion, I wish to thank all who have assisted me in performing my duties, especially the Community Club, who assisted in Clean-up Week, and to our district nurse and our Dr. A. W. Mitchell. Let us endeavor in the coming year to co-operate to a greater extent than in the past, to the end that we may enjoy better surroundings, health and happiness.
