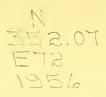

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REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

1956-57

To the School Board and Citizens of Errol:

Once again it is time for the annual report as Superintendent of Schools in Errol. During the past year every effort has been made to get our schools up to proper standards and maintain them at this level. Physical properties of the district are in excellent repair and with the exception of some minor vandalism have been kept that way. The recent installation, a new heating system, has proven most satisfactory. Installing a new entrance in the rear of the building is not only a safety measure but is a direct convenience for children going to and from the playground.

Loss of our two upper grade teachers by resignation presented the problem of teacher replacement. Two satisfactory candidates were found in Mr. Robert Dunham, as Principal, and Mr. Carl Farnham as 7th and 8th Grade teacher. Naturally with a complete change of teaching staff on the upper grade level certain adjustments had to be made. However, rough spots are being ironed out and as this is written the program is progressing favorably.

The chief difficulty is to find time to get in all the required subject matter required to have a State Board of Education approved high school and yet teach such courses as the young people need if they are to continue their work in the 11th and 12th grades in other high schools.

The comparatively large 10th Grade (as measured by recent standards) has made it possible to have some degree of competition within the class. On the other hand there are certain problems of preparation in that the nine members are planning to go on to at least four different schools for their 11th Grade work. Each young person is given individual help along the lines of his greatest need.

Unexpectedly large tuition receipts plus transportation reimbursement from the State on the Millsfield pupils made it possible for the district to amass a creditable balance of \$6,401.75 last year. This balance was credited on this year's account automatically reducing taxes in a like amount.

The children have continued to benefit by the excellent hot lunch program conducted by Mrs. Margaret Hawkins with Miss Gloria Porter assisting. Approximately 55 pupils are served daily. Thanks to surplus foods received from the U. S. Government the program is practically self supporting.

All school authorities recognize limits in the small school program. Within these limits the Errol children receive very good training. In a Union wide examination program put on last April covering the first eight grades they made a very creditable showing.

A grade placement chart follows this report showing the present enrollment.
