#### WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Freedom, N. H., in the County of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three thousand and five hundred and ninety dollars to defray town charges consisting of town officers' salaries, town officers' expenses, election and registration, town hall expenses and appropriate money for the same.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars for the use of hydrants and appropriate money for the same.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of eight hundred and seventy-five dollars for street lights and appropriate money for the same.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand dollars for general expenses of highway department and appropriate money for the same. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and seventy-five dollars for Public Library and appropriate money for the same.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five thousand dollars for winter roads and appropriate money for the same.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of six hundred and fifty-five dollars and forty-five cents for class five roads and appropriate money for the same.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars for town needy and appropriate money for the same.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand dollars for insurance and appropriate money for the same.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two thousand and three hundred dollars for old age assistance and appropriate money for the same.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to help defray the expenses of Old Home Week Celebration for August, 1959 and appropriate money for the same.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four thousand and five hundred dollars for summer highways and appropriate money for the same.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars for the fire department.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars for maintaining the town dump and appropriate money for the same.

17. To see if the town will vote to use the revenue from 1958 Severance Tax to cover any overages.

18. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and make an appropriation to cover the expenses of such audit.

19. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and one dollars and eighty cents, which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town: to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources for the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

21. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars for Social Security and appropriate money for the same.

22. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred and seventy-five dollars for interest on long term notes and short term notes and appropriate money for the same.

23. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two thousand dollars to be applied on the long term note taken out for the Effingham Falls Bridge and appropriate money for the same. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be given as a donation to Huggins Memorial Hospital.

25. To Transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

NOTE: Since this copy of the Town Warrant is required by the printer at an earlier date than the legal Town Warrant posting date, it is not necessarily complete, and therefore, the Posted Warrant may contain additional articles which are not included in this publication.

#### FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

#### Dear Mr. & Mrs. & Family:

Once again our region is covered with snow and the forest fire hazard has disappeared, but to your local forest fire warden it is just a time to check over his equipment and check the causes of the fires he has had. We know that our biggest cause of forest fires are careless people burning rubbish, brush or debris without a permit or in an unsafe place. When this fire gets away from them and help is needed to put it out they then plead that they did not know a permit was required for the incinerator or this type of burning. Well, the old saying, ignorance of the law is no excuse, fits in here very well. The forest fire laws have been in the newspapers, on the radio and on television and are on some posters, and there should be no excuse for not knowing a permit is required for all outdoor burning. In this year's report we are going to quote the law of the State of New Hampshire in regards to permits, this is found in Chapter 233 - Section 35 revised laws. State of New Hampshire.

Permits

35b No person, firm or corporation shall kindle or cause to be kindled any fire or shall burn or cause to be burned any material, and no city or town shall kindle or maintain a fire or a public dump in or near woodlands, pasture, brush, sprout, waste, or cutover land or where fire may be communicated to such lands, except when the ground is covered with snow, without first obtaining a written permit from the forest fire warden of the town where the burning is to be done unless the same is in the presence of the warden or his agent. Liability for fires without permit.

36 Any person causing or kindling a fire without permit of the forest fire warden when such permit is required and any person by whose negligence or the negligence of his agents any fire shall be caused, shall be liable in a civil action for the payment to the town or the state or both, of the expenses incurred by the forest fire warden or his deputy warden in attending or extinguishing such fire.

#### Penalties

38 Any person violating any provisions of section 35 shall be fined not more than two hundred dollars or imprisoned not more than sixty days.

To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for transportation of high school pupils on the Ossipee late bus.

10. Resolved that the Freedom school district petition the State Board of Education to become a member of a cooperative school district which may include, in addition to this district the following districts, namely Brookfield, Effingham, Madison, Ossipee, Tamworth.

11. To elect two representatives of the district to serve on an interim committee to prepare a financial budget for the operation of the proposed cooperative school district.

12. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to make application for and accept in the name of the school district for educational purposes such funds or grants-in-aid as may be obtainable from the State or Federal Government or any department or agency thereof, or any other sources.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Freedom:

During the school year 1957-58 the teachers in the Freedom School were Mrs. Ethel Ramsdell, grades 1 to 4, and Mrs. Esther M. Walker, grades 5 to 8. Mrs. Walker resigned in the middle of the year and was succeeded by Mr. Ralph Staples. At the end of the year Mrs. Ramsdell retired and was succeeded in September by Mrs. Edith Plant of Holderness, N. H. Mrs. Plant is a graduate of Plymouth Teachers' College and has had several years of teaching experience. Mr. Staples who has a bachelor's degree, attended Plymouth Teachers' College during the summer and returned to his teaching position in September. We are fortunate to have such competent teachers who are devoted to their work.

Last year the total enrollment in the Freedom School was 46 with an average membership of 39.3. In September of the current year the school opened with an enrollment of 38. The census report of September, 1958 shows that the probable enrollment for 1959-60 will be about 41 pupils.
