# TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Gilsum in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Gilsum on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To receive the report of the Budget Committee and act in any manner relating thereto.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to anthorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to donate to the Griggs-Strickland Post No. 85. American Legion, a burial lot in the Centennial Cemetery, or act in any manner relating thereto.
- 6. To appoint a Committee to take charge of the observance of Memorial Day.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell either by auction or private sale any or all pieces of real estate now acquired by tax deed.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$3,500.00 for the purpose of State Aid Construction, such sums to be raised through the issuance of serial notes under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bonds Statute, and amendments thereto, and to authorize

the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such notes, and to determine the time and place of payment thereof, under such terms and conditions as they may deem to be in the best interests of the Town.

9. To transact any other business which may regularly come before it.

# THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the school district of the Town of Gilsum qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said district on the 11th day of March, 1952, at 7:30 in the evening, to vote upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officer or agent in the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose agents, auditors, and committees, in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums, as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$ for the purpose of insulating certain sections of the School-house.

# REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Gilsum:

I herewith submit my seventh annual report as superintendent of your school:

The enrollment at this time is just what is was last year, 88, although the grade distribution is somewhat different. A number of families have moved away which accounts for some of the decrease.

There are fewer pupils in high school this year than anticipated. Some of the boys left school to enlist in the armed forces, and some lost interest in further education. It is regretable that so many of our young people fail to realize how much a high school education might mean to them until it is too late to get it.

School costs, as everything else, continue to rise. Your school board recommends only enough money to cover actual costs for next year. The teachers and pupils have been most cooperative in obtaining the maximum use from textbooks and supplies. Teachers' salaries continue to rise, yet are lower than those in industry.

The supply of qualified teachers gets less each year. Increased enrollments require more classrooms and teachers, yet the number of young people entering this field is not increasing fast enough to meet the needs. Better working conditions and contractual relations, adequate supplies and facilities are some ways of attracting the better candidates.

Last summer the building was painted on the outside, and the usual cleaning and minor repairs attended to. There is a great deal of heat loss through the walls and ceilings, particularly in the older rooms. Considerable work needs to be done on the storm windows to make them as effective as they should be. Several more windows are needed, also. Insulation should help a great deal in making the building more comfortable and in saving fuel.
