WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

1. s. THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Grafton, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

4. To see if the town will vote to elect one or more Road Agents for the ensuing year.

5. To see if the town will allow a discount of three per cent upon all property taxes paid on or before July 30, 1936.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended in proper observance of Old Home Day.

7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short term loans in anticipation of taxes.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining town highways and bridges, including the amount of 1-4 of one per cent.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments.

10. To see if the town will accept State Aid for construction of class 2 road, known as Grafton Turnpike, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$655.50 or will accept State Aid for construction of class 5 roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$572.23.

Note: No town may receive both class 5 and class 2 aid in the same year.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000 plus interest on \$5,500 to apply on town debt.

12. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by town through Tax Collector's deeds.

13. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to issue serial notes or bonds of the town to an amount not exceeding \$5,500 for the purpose of refunding outstanding temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of a like amount, as authorized by Chapter 48 of the Laws of 1935.

14. To see what action the town will take in regard to purchasing snow removal equipment and appropriate money for the same.

15. To see if the town will vote to accept a legacy as a trust fund from the estate of Emeline L. Davis of Canaan, N. H. of \$200.00 the income of same to be used for the perpetual care of the James M. Kilton burial plot in the cemetery at Grafton Center.

16. To see if the town will vote to accept a legacy of \$100.00 from the estate of Emeline L. Davis of Canaan, N. H., for the Public Library of Grafton.

17. To see if the town will vote to accept as a gift from Edward A. Moores of Chelmsford, Mass., a burial lot in the Grafton Center Cemetery.

18. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway beginning at the William Caswell place on Razor Hill so called and leading through Straw abutments to the State Highway.

19. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway beginning at the Boyle place on Prescott Hill so called and leading to the Williams Hill road so called.

20. To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

Dear Sir:

I herewith present my annual report as school nurse for the town of Grafton, N. H.

Number of pupils examined—108.

Number of pupils 10 per cent. underweight—20.

4 pupils showed defective vision, uncorrected.

3 pupils had defective hearing.

1 pupil had symptoms of cardiac trouble.

1 pupil deformed.

29 pupils had defective teeth.

9 pupils showed diseased tonsils.

1 pupil had defective breathing.

1 pupil probably has adenoids.

4 pupils showed enlarged glands.

4 pupils had defective speech.

Grafton received \$43.09 from the Child Health Recovery fund.

Four children had tonsillectomies, four had obstructions removed from their ears at the Hitchcock Clinic at Hanover. One child had glasses fitted with this money.

Seventeen children received 1-2 pint of milk daily during the winter months. Cod liver oil was given to all underweight and underprivileged children also during the winter months.

Hot lunches were served in one school to thirty-one children from money earned by the children from a party.

Hot soup or cocoa was furnished at another school by the Grafton Red Cross.

A Grafton girl attending Bristol High school had her dentistry paid by the Grafton Red Cross.

A case of cod liver oil was purchased by the Red Cross for use in the school.

Arrangements are being made to have three children have tonsillectomies done at Hanover hospital later in June.

Eighty-seven visits have been made in the schools.

Several calls have been made with members of the Red Cross Committee and with members of the School Board.

Reports of the children's growth have been sent home.

The class room inspections have been frequent. They were made for the control of pediculosis and skin diseases and to prevent other contagion.

Five children were transported to Canaan to attend the underweight clinic held there in May.

One child was taken to a diagnostic clinic at Laconia Hospital for further observation.

Twenty-nine visits have been made in twenty-one different families including thirty-nine children.

I wish to express my appreciation to the members of the School Board, Mr. Freese, and the local Red Cross Committee who have contributed so generously to the needs of the school children. My thanks are also due to the parents and teachers for their daily cooperation in making possible the health program.
