TO THE TAXPAYERS OF MADBURY:

In presenting this report and asking for a deficiency appropriation, we wish to give an explanation to point out that the School Board was forced to this deficit by circumstances apparently beyond its control.

During the school year 1923-24 we were allowed for State Aid \$532.12. Among the items for this aid was one for transportation of pupils. Since the Board was allowed money for transportation we believed we were justified in spending it for that purpose.

At the time of the school meeting in 1925 we had not received any notice from the State Board as to what our state aid would be. In presenting our budget therefore, we allowed for state aid an amount as nearly as possible to what we thought it would be.

After the School meeting we received a notice from the State board to the effect that, since we had spent the transportation money of pupils living within the 2 mile limit, that this amount would not be allowed and we owed the sum of \$379.21 to the State.

This meant that in place of receiving State Aid we fell short this amount. We were able by cutting our expenditures this year to cut our deficit to quite an extent but cannot fully overcome the failure to receive the State Aid.

This year we were notified that we were entitled to State Aid next year, but since we owe the State, this amount would be credited on our account.

We ask for a deficiency appropriation of \$100.00 which includes an item of \$38.00 for a bill not presented last year.
