You are hereby notified to meet at Rumney Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its highways and bridges.
- 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Library.
- 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Cemeteries.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Common and the daily raising and lowering of the flag.
- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights.

- 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the LaMott-Kenneson Post No. 76, American Legion for Memorial Day and other patriotic purposes.
- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Town Dump.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$285.86 to secure from the State \$1,905.74 to be expended for Town Road Aid.
- 12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town in co-operation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate towards the operation of the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital in Plymouth, N. H.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) for the control of the Pine Blister Rust disease.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a Tractor equipped with a Shovel and Heavy Duty Mower for use of the Highway Department and raise and appropriate or borrow the necessary funds for the same.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or borrow a sum of money sufficient for the purchase of a new truck for the Town Highway Department and to authorize the Selectmen to sell or to trade in the Dodge truck.
- 17. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the installation of a heating system in the Town Hall, and the raising and appropriating the necessary funds for the same.

- 18. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the installation of a heating system in the Town Library and the raising and appropriating of the necessary funds for the same.
- 19. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to Civil Defense and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 20. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for legal advice.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent, sell or otherwise dispose of any real estate or mineral rights acquired by the Town at any of its tax collector's sales.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Rumney qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the fifth day of March, 1955, at one o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income;

the school board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the District will vote to construct and equip a new Elementary School building and to purchase any land which may be necessary to locate such building, at a cost of not exceeding \$83,500; and for such purpose to raise and appropriate not exceeding \$83,500; such sum to be raised through the issuance of Serial Bonds under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act of 1953, and any amendments thereto; and to authorize the School Board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the Serial Bonds shall be issued, including their sale, and the time and place of payment of the principal and interest thereon.
- 10. To see what sum the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction, remodeling and equipping of new classroom facilities at one or more of the present Elementary School buildings; such sum to be raised through the issuance of Serial Bonds under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act of 1953, and any amendments thereto; and to Authorize the School Board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the Serial Bonds shall be issued, including their sale, and the time and place of payment of the principal and interest thereon.
- 11. To see if the District wishes to continue the special Buffalo Road Transportation Route.
- 12. If Article No. 9, as above, is adopted, to see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to administer, lease, rent, sell or otherwise dispose of any real estate now owned by the District.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT TO THE RUMNEY SCHOOL BOARD

I hereby submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools of the School District of Rumney.

During the period I have been with you I have become aware of some of the following phases of education in the Town of Rumney.

Very generally the education being offered to the school children of Rumney is of a high caliber and you should be commended for it. The children in all your schools seem to be happy and developing into well-rounded boys and girls.

Scholars' supplies are adequate and by the end of this year the textbook situation will be very well taken care of. The Curriculum Foundation Series that you use as your basal reading system is a good one, and I would recommend only that we purchase some supplementary texts from other basal systems to give your children more variety in reading. There has been a need for a new standardized arithmetic series, and also a new series of textbooks in the field of language arts. The arithmetic series has already been purchased and at this writing is being put into your schools. It is hoped further that a textbook committee in the near future will adopt a standardized language series which will give a correlated and integrated program in language for grades 1 through 8 as is now being done in arithmetic.

I am pleased to see that you are using the Rinehart Functional Handwriting System. Having had a great deal of experience with it during the past years, it has been my observation that it is a very valuable addition to the educational picture. Neat, legible handwriting has much value to both pupils and teacher, and has a decided positive effect on the learning situation.

The school housing situation in Rumney is acute, and as our enrollments continue to increase will become more so. We have already reached the point where 'the child's education may suffer because of crowded conditions. At present we have one classroom with over 40 pupils, and we have more approaching that figure which, as stated above, is not conducive to good education practices. The recommended class size of 25 pupils is exceeded in four of your five classrooms, and the situation will get worse rather than better. Generally speaking, the physical condition of your schools is not too good, and I feel also that none of them are suitable for enlargement. The situation as it now exists is one of a continual spending for upkeep and maintenance for which there is very little return. I am very happy to see that a committee is now working on your school problem and feel from meeting and discussion with them that sometime in the near future they will come up with a solution which will be acceptable to all. It should be borne in mind also in your planning that any future legislation which may be enacted to help finance school construction will probably be retroactive to 1947, so if a building program is indicated, as I think it would be, the town would be reimbursed at some later date.

During this Fall, Otis Quick Scoring Mental Ability Tests were given to all pupils, and during the Spring months they will all be given an achievement battery. It is not necessary to give mental ability tests every year, but due to the fact that it has been some time since this has been done, it was deemed wise to test every pupil this year and during ensuing years to test each child in this manner every third year. Achievement tests, of course, give the teacher and myself a basis for evaluating instruction, and in this respect very worthwhile.

My aim in education is to see that each youngster gets the best possible education from school funds allocated by the district, and please feel free to call on me at any time for advice or discussion which might improve this situation.

I appreciate very much the cooperative, consideration and courtesy given me by your School Board and Teachers of Rumney.

EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent as per the following quotation:

"REPORTS. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report showing the total salary paid to the superintendent, which report shall show in detail the amount derived from the per capita tax and the amount paid directly by each school district in the union."

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valualtion. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30th. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union No. 48 during 1953-1954 received a salary of \$5600 which was made up as follows: \$2500 paid from the per capita tax, \$3100 pro-rated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$750 for travel within the union was also pro-ralted as stated above.

The table below shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district.

School opens Wednesday, September 7, 1955.

October 7 (one session) Supervisory Union Teachers' meeting.

October 12, Columbus Day, schools close.

October 20th and 21st, State Teachers' Convention, schools close.

This school calendar allows for 180 days actually in session plus two days for State Teachers Convention which count as school days. This makes a total of 182 days for the school year 1955-1956 and no time will need to be made up unless more than two days are lost because of storm or various other reasons.

REPORT OF THE MUSIC SUPERVISOR FOR THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OF RUMNEY

During a weekly visit to each classroom basic routines are set up to help in the daily music period. Singing, note reading, rhythm, and listening are four main objectives in this program.

In the lower grades we concentrate on learning many songs by rote and by note reading. So that we may all sing in tune some remedial work has been started with individuals who need help. Many of our songs are action songs that help with co-ordination and rhythm. The children have learned new singing games and have dramatized songs with skipping and galloping, etc. The rhythm band is another help in developing timing, beat, and ear training.

In the upper grades we have instituted a square dance program. The children have advanced training in note reading, enunciation, phrasing, and tone work.

In all the grades we are expanding our listening program. Some new records are giving a better opportunity to hear and understand other forms of music, rhythms, harmonies, and techniques, as well as biographies of the composers. Through this medium we are also learning about the instruments of the orchestra.

The total estimated assessment required to cover the budget for 1955 and 1956 increased \$12,368.92 over the current 1954 and 1955 school year assessment voted in March of 1954. We feel that an explanation is necessary for a clear understanding, and offer the following information.

All items under Administration remain approximately the same except Supplies and Expenses. This item includes Rumney's share of Supervisory Union No. 48 operating expenses which increased about \$100.00.

Teachers' salaries increased about \$650.00. This is in line with our policy of increasing our teachers' salaries until they compare favorably with other teachers.

The transportation estimate has increased \$600.00 pending your action on the article in the warrant pertaining to the Buffalo Road Route.

The cost of High School tuition is the major item. It will increase about \$7,050.00 due to more high school students and increased tuition charge per pupil.

Under the receipts in our estimated budget, it appears that we will have no balance from the current year. Last year the balance was \$2,000.00

Also under receipts, the State Legislature has not yet passed a bill giving State Aid. Therefore, a receipt cannot be shown under this item. This increases our assessment by \$2,010.68, the amount of last year's guaranteed State Aid. When we are advised the amount of State Aid we will get, if any, the assessment will be reduced accordingly.

There are other minor changes in the budget but the above mentioned items account for the increase.

Three Dental Clinics, sponsored by the Firemen's Auxiliary and helped by other local organizations of Rumney, were held at Plymouth and 15 children were treated. Sixteen fillings, nine extractions and two cleanings were done.

Forty children of the 7th and 8th grades had skin tests by Miss Ellen Clough, R.N., Grafton County Tuberculosis Nurse. Only one child reacted and had a chest x-ray.

Few communicable diseases occurred during the year. Five cases of Mumps and one case of Chicken Pox were reported.

I have been your school nurse for 20 years and I wish to thank you all for your part in the many pleasant associations I have had in carrying on the health work in Rumney schools.
