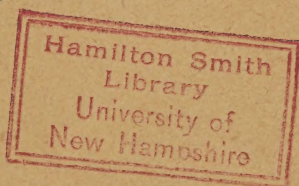
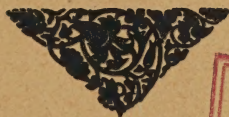
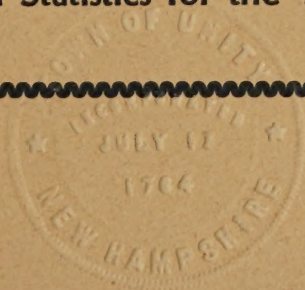

TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L.S.] To the inhabitants of the town of Unity qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the ninth day of March next at 9 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
2. To hear the reports of the selectmen and other town officers and pass any vote in relation thereto.
3. To choose a member of the board of selectmen for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a trustee of the trust funds for the ensuing three years.
5. To choose a library trustee for the ensuing three years.
6. To choose all other necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.
7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Librarian's salary.
8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Old Age Assistance and Town Poor charges.
9. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise to pay other necessary town charges.
10. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise to pay the just debts of the town.
11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance including snow removal of highways and determine the price to be paid per hour for labor.
12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$529.50 for construction of Class V town roads provided the State shall

appropriate the sum of \$2,293.41 for the same purpose it being understood that if said appropriation is made by the State and the Town accepts said special aid that the Town shall not be entitled to State aid for Class II roads.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept State aid for construction of Class II road known as Second New Hampshire Turnpike and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$529.50 the State will allot \$1,058.00.

14. To vote by ballot to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

15. To see if the Town will vote to discount on taxes paid on or before June 1st, and September 1st, 1937.

16. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for white pine blister rust control.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue serial notes or bonds of the town in an amount not exceeding \$4,000.00 for the purpose of refunding outstanding indebtedness of a like amount.

18. To vote by ballot on a question as provided in a resolution of the General Court and approved February 18th, 1937, to wit: Is it expedient to revise the constitution?

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To The Unity School Board:

I hereby submit my fourth annual report as your superintendent of schools.

Mrs. L. Alice Douglass, who for three years had done excellent work at East Unity, was placed in charge of the Church School last fall, and Miss Claire Sing, a Plymouth Normal graduate and experienced teacher, was hired for the East Unity position. No change has been made in the other three positions. Miss Irene Tupper is at the County School, and Miss Gretal Palmer and Miss Janet Whitcomb are at the Center School. Unity is certainly fortunate in having five able and industrious teachers.

Education has been forced to change with the times. No longer do we consider it important for a pupil to be able to work a partial payment problem, or that every graduate of high school be versed in Latin, algebra and geometry, or that every eighth grade pupil be able to analyze correctly a complicated complex sentence. All of these have their value in their place, but we know that many men who have been of great value in this world have been weak along some of these lines. We cannot use one standard to measure the quality of all men—nor can all methods of teaching be judged by the same standards.

Some years ago we taught the alphabet first and oral reading through the eighth grade. No study was made as to the speed and understanding of silent reading, and not much stress was placed on dramatized reading and vocal expression. Most of us were taught to "mouth" the words while reading to ourselves. This prevented us from reading faster silently than we could orally. Most of our reading in later life is silent, the rest is oral to entertain others. The modern school tries to develop the pupil to read silently with speed and understanding, and as far as possible to read orally in such a way as to be understood and to be entertaining.

Unity is faced with one problem. The pupil population shifts from the Center toward the East. We now have the two-room building at the Center and the pupils at the East. We felt at first that this would soon change back, and with the approval of the

State, we transported pupils toward the Center, but the condition grows worse. If we had two rooms at the East we could place two teachers there and one at the Center. The State will not approve two teachers at the Center next year unless enough families move in to make the number of pupils at least thirty-five.

It would not be a very expensive task to change the East Unity building into a satisfactory two-room building.

I wish to thank the Unity School Board and the teachers for their loyalty and help and the citizens for their patience and kindness.
