**STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE  
TOWN WARRANT**

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To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. The polls shall open for voting after the reading of the last article and shall not close before six o'clock in the afternoon.

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, Trust Fund Trustee, three Hospital Trustees to serve for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for—

3. Election and Registration Expenses
4. Municipal Court Expenses

3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange and Rotary Club and all church organizations, for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.

6. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 171A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano.

7. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 37, of the Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, N. H., being an act authorizing Towns to establish the office of Town Manager, and to raise and appropriate monies for the expense of the same.

8. To see if the Town will vote to eliminate the office of Road Agent, if the Town Manager Plan is adopted.

9. To see if the Town will vote to purchase and maintain a police cruiser, and to see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for the expenses of the same, said sum not to exceed \$4,000.

10. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote taken at the March Town Meeting, 1956, adopting a



non-partisan ballot system for the election of town officers, the same to take effect at the March Town Meeting in 1958.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750 for Child Recreation, to be directed by the Recreational Committee of the Chamber of Commerce.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to be used to build an infield at the Athletic Field.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to reduce the town debt.

14. To see if the Town will vote (a) to authorize and empower the Selectmen on behalf of the town to sell and convey by warranty deed to the Whitefield Industrial Corporation for such price as in their judgment may seem best, all of the so-called factory site and any buildings thereon now owned by the town, but excluding the so-called Red Acre property, also all of the rights of the town to take water from Mirror Lake for said factory site, including dam and flowage rights on said lake, also the right of aqueduct between said lake and said factory site, also the water and flowage rights on Johns River, and all other rights appurtenant thereto and owned by the town, and (b) to rescind the action taken by the voters under Article 14 at the March, 1955 annual meeting and instead thereof to authorize the Selectmen to grant the use of said fire insurance fund now amounting to \$45,010.28 to the said Whitefield Industrial Corporation, without interest, to aid the latter in the building of a new industrial plant on said site in order to give employment to as many as possible of those needing financial assistance, on condition, that said industrial corporation repay said principal sum to the town as soon as it can conveniently do so, but not

requiring it to use any of the stockholders' money in repayment? (By petition)

15. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

Given under our hands and seal of the town this twenty-fifth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven, and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and eighty-first.

Summary of Findings and Recommendations**

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Whitefield for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1956, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

**Scope of Audit**

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

**Financial Statements**

**Comparative Balance Sheets—December 31, 1955-December 31, 1956: (Exhibit A-1)**

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1955 and December 31, 1956, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$3,770.12 during 1956.

**Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)**

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

**Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues:****(Exhibits A-3 & A-4)**

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1956, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$2,758.37, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$1,328.68, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$1,429.69.

**Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)**

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1956, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1956, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

**Audit Procedure**

The accounts and records of all town officials charged

with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

### General Comments

#### Current Deficit:

It is noted that the current deficit (excess of current liabilities over total assets) was only slightly reduced during 1956, as shown by the following statement:

It is again recommended that provision be made for the liquidation of the current deficit. This may be done by annual appropriations over a period of years until such time as the current deficit is entirely liquidated.

#### Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

Through the generous help and cooperation of the Women's Hospital Auxiliary we have been able to purchase stainless steel operating room equipment, linens and dishes. This group also assisted in the purchase of a "Lifteze", to aid in moving patients easily and safely to and from bed, and conductive tile flooring for the operating room. We wish to thank the Auxiliary, not only for this great financial help but also for their moral support in improving the hospital.

Many thanks are extended to citizens, visitors and hotels for their many gifts throughout the year. We

also appreciate the nursery unit given by the Nurses' Alumnae Association.

The cooperation of the hospital staff is appreciated.

A room for the safe storage of oxygen and other gases has been finished off in the basement, which, together with the new operating room flooring, meets with State requirements.

We were very fortunate in being able to procure a more efficient operating room light through Federal Surplus Property.

The arrival of a new doctor in town has helped during the last half of the year and the Medical Staff has been reorganized. We appreciate this cooperation on their part.

We have had a good year as regards new and modern equipment installed, but a very poor year in the number of patients admitted.

## Report from the White Mountains Region Association

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Thanks to the fine cooperation of the towns in our Region, the Association has been able to carry on an extremely busy program aimed, as always, toward the benefiting of the entire northern part of New Hampshire.

To this end we have cooperated wherever it has been possible with any and all agencies that have been working along any lines that promised eventual benefit to any sort of business within our state and region borders. This is in line with the original Regional concept, that pooling of efforts can accomplish more than can be done by a lot of separate, smaller and uncoordinated efforts. Nevertheless, along with this we continue our own individual projects and plans, where these promise to be more directly productive.

Again we have distributed all over the United States nearly 100,000 pieces of promotional literature of all types—maps, lists of places to stay, picture folders, hunting-and-fishing folders, and winter-vacation brochures. We know these arouse interest and bring business because people write for them from all over the map; they also tell us later on that these folders were of definite help in causing them to decide where to spend their vacation time—AND MONEY! Your town was represented in each and every one of these folders.

Our 4-H Awards Program continues to encourage boys and girls to take part in, and do better in, this fine and worthwhile program. Through cash awards to members and clubs, we are proud to be helping these youngsters to be the constructive farm citizens of our Region in the future.

We have planned and cooperated with the planning and carrying out, as well as the publicizing of Old Home Days, Woodsman's Contest, Guides' Show, Community Festivals, Horse Shows and the like, as well as planning and setting up one of our own, the White Mountains Region Art Center. We have spent a lot of time on the road attending shows visited by hundreds of thousands of people in Boston, Hartford, and Philadelphia, and are planning more of such work.

As to results, we have again run a mail survey to find out what good we were accomplishing. From just one small sample (10% of 4000) of our mail requests, we turned up 148 parties numbering 440 people who came here. Only part of those told us how much they spent here, but that small part spent \$18,571.00!! Seems unbelievable until you realize you can't get by vacationing on much less than \$7.00 a day. Anyway, what they alone spent means that from that small group came back into this Region  $2\frac{1}{2}$  times the total amount appropriated by our towns.

What this means to every taxpayer is that much money, either direct income or tax income, came here to help take the burden off the local people. The man who never sees a tourist would be paying much more on his tax bill all through this state if visitors were not paying a substantial share of the freight!! With your help, we'll continue to do our part in keeping the money coming in.
