### TOWN OF BARRINGTON

### TOWN WARRANT

### March 13, 1956

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Barrington, County of Strafford and State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in town affairs —

You are hereby notified to meet at the Grade School in Barrington on Tuesday, the 13th day of March A.D. 1956, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles:

Art. 1. To choose by ballot and major vote, one selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, and two Auditors for one year.

Art. 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.

Art. 3. To raise such sums of money as are necessary for the support of the town poor and other town charges.

Art. 4. To raise state and county tax.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the maintenance of town roads and bridges.

Art. 6. To see if the town will raise the sum of \$884.10 for town rural aid—the state share—\$5,894.01.

Art. 7. To see if the town will raise the Town Officers salaries.

Art. 8. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow the sum of \$10,000 in anticipation of taxes — if necessary.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Civilian Defense.

Art. 10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$126.89 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town — for the Lakes Region Association.

Art. 11. To see if the town will accept the road or lane from the old Green Hill Road to the house of Lucien J. Caron.

Art. 12. To see what the town will do regarding the Swain's Pond or Union Lake flowage rights, and to give the Selectmen the power to appoint comittees, to work with them in negotiating with the owners. — (Sawyer Realty Co. Inc.) of the so-called flowage and water rights.

Art. 13. To see if the town will contribute \$25.00 or more to the N. H. Marine Memorial Fund.

#### **REPORTS OF THE BARRINGTON FIRE DEPT.**

The reports of the Barrington Fire Department show 17 calls for the year. These consisted of 2 dump, 4 chimney, 1 truck, 2 house fires of which one was a complete loss, 3 brush and 5 out of town calls to adjoining towns.

New equipment added consisted of a Harodike tank, 3 gas masks, a portable generator and the placing in operation of the base radio station (K C E No. 345), with remote control from the Chiefs house.

We also joined the Mutual Aid set up.

The Fire Department appreciates your continued support and will make every attempt to justify your faith in us.

### BE A GOOD CITIZEN - COOPERATE

Smoking and debris burning caused more than 50 percent of the forest fires occurring in the state of New Hampshire in 1955 — 235 fires out of a total of 463 originated from these two sources. Lighted smoking material and matches thrown from moving vehicles along the highway or dropped by fishermen, hunters, hikers, berry and flower pickers accounted for 26 percent; debris burning in the wrong place or at the wrong time by those who failed to heed all pleas for safety or refused to recognize the logical, sensible rules and regulations set up under legislative authority governing the use of fire in or near woodlands accounted for more than 24 percent. This is inexcusable.

But what of the smokers? Despite all the efforts of those officially charged with the responsibility of preventing fires, too many were careless or thoughtless in disposing of smoking material and matches. Why? It is difficult to say. Autos are now equipped with ash trays. Why not use them. The crushing out of a cigar, cigarette and the complete extinguishment of matches before being discarded is an easy chore.

If the costly habits of the careless and indifferent smoker and debris burner could be overcome, more than half of our annual forest fires would be eliminated. WILL YOU do YOUR share to bring this about?

#### REMEMBER

- 1. Get a written permit from your local warden before starting your debris burning or camp fire. The law requires it.
- 2. Make certain they are dead out before leaving them.
- 3. Become a safe smoker by extinguishing smoking material and matches before discarding them.

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the School district in the town of Barrington qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 12th day of March 1956, at 8 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto. 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

11. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for re-surfacing the main driveway in front of the school and for surfacing a part or all of the playground.
