To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bennington in the Countyy of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Bennington on Tuesday, the nineth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.

4. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid for class V roads and raise and appropriate money for the same.

5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes. 6. To see what action the town will take in regards to real estate taken over by the town for non-payment of taxes.

7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$156.00 for the Monadnock Region.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to purchase 200 ft. of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " hose.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1.500.00 for tarring.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

11. To see what action the town will take in regard to the sum of \$800.00 raised and appropriated last town meeting to move or improve the town dump.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to be used in co-operation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister within the confines of the town.

13. To see what action the town will take in regard to sidewalk construction and raise and appropriate money for the same.

14. To see what action the town will take in regard to buying a new portable forest fire pump and raise and appropriate money for the same. 15. To see what action the town will take in regard to joining the Firemen's Mutual Aid Association.

16. To see what action the town will take in regard to redecorating the interior of the town hall and raise and appropriate money for the same.

17. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for statutory requirements and to carry the articles and appropriations of the school district into effect.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The Pierce School meets all standards of modern school construction and has extra room for expansion. It looks as if our enrollment would decrease for the next few years since we have large classes graduating and small classes entering. These large high school classes will give Bennington a heavy tuition burden for some years. As long as Peterboro and Hillsboro are able and willing to accept these students the problem is only one of money.

The quality of instruction in the school is good. Standardized examinations show our pupils to be holding their own with children throughout the nation. Our graduates are doing better than average job in high school.

In conclusion I would like to thank the School Board, the teachers, and the towns people for their cooperation.

PIERCE SCHOOL

To the Superintendent, School Board and Citizens of Bennington:

It was most gratifying in September 1953 to learn that. each member of the group graduated the previous June was attending an approved High School.

The enrollment of Pierce School in September 1953numbered 68 in grades 1 - 8. These groups are divided in the following manner:

Grades 1 and 2 — Miss Elsie MacDonald Grades 3, 4 and 5 — Mrs. Jessie Black Grades 6, 7 and 8 — Mrs. Ruth Cody

The following have maintained perfect attendance from September 1953 — February 1954:

Grades 6, 7 and 8 William Cleary, Arthur Cernota, John Robertson

Since September 1953 a slight tendency toward tardiness seems to be evident. We would like to remind the parents that the morning session begins at 8:45 and the afternoon session at 12:45. We would certainly appreciate cooperation from all parents in this matter of getting children to school on time. This habit of punctuality will be most valuable to them in the future. For some years now the need for a Long View policy toward individual pupils has been becoming more and more evident. This recognition of individual differences has become increasingly more important as the present practice of grouping continues. By means of annual Standardized testing and keeping Cumulative records a valuable pattern of the child's educational growth has been maintained.

The teachers of this Area are fortunate this semester in having an opportunity to attend a class in Remedial Reading from Dr. Wolffer of Keene Teachers College. The importance of reading efficiency to the child can not be over estimated.

We are fortunate in Pierce School in having excellent equipment with which to work. The new Ginn Reading Series has proved to be most beneficial to the children. A new interest in arithmetic has developed with the use of the new Arithmetic Series. Our motion picture projector, mimeograph duplicator, work tables and reference books continue to be indispensible. A film strip projector would be a valuable teaching aid at all grade levels.

It has been a pleasure for us to work with the Bennington pupils. I also wish to express my appreciation for the fine cooperation and participation of the townspeople and the organizations in school affairs.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Bennington which was made by this Division, acting under authority of Chapter 82, Section 27, of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, which provides in part as follows:

"Audit on Motion of Commission. The commission may cause an audit to be made of the accounts of any city, town, school district, village district or precinct, as often as once in two years, or whenever conditions appear to it to warrant such. ******"

This audit covered the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, and the period from January 1st to August 31st, 1953.Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report which is made up in three sections as follows:

Section I — Fiscal Year Ended December 31, 1952

Section II — Period January 1st to August 31st, 1953

Section III—Ten Year Statement of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets - December 31, 1951 - December 31, 1952: (Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1951 and December 31, 1952, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein, the financial condition of the Town changed from a Surplus of \$3,337.80, to a Net Debt of \$3,374.61 during 1952.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$1,593.22, plus a net revenue surplus of \$1,197.08, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$2,790.30.

Summary of Receipts and Expendituress (Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is indicated in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of August 31, 1953, is indicated in Exhibit O.

Statement of Long Term Indebtednesss (Exhibit N)

A statement of long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1952, showing annual maturities of principal and annual interest requirements, is contained in Exhibit N.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes:

Table I presents a ten year statement of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes, covering the fiscal years of 1942 to 1952, inclusive. It is noted that during that period the Net Debt decreased from \$9,404.50 to \$3,374.61.

The assessed valuation of taxable property increased by more than one half million dollars, or 53%, while the annual tax levy increased from \$26,569.62 to \$52,890.68, or 99%. The local tax rate increased from \$2.57 to \$3.40 per hundred, compared to an increase in the average State tax rate during this period of \$3.23 to \$4.52. Closing Accounts: The fiscal year of towns ends on December 31st. The books and accounts of all town officers, therefore, should be closed as of December 31st. The Town Treasurer should, if necessary, hold his accounts open for a few days after the closing date in order that all receipts of the Tax Collector, Town Clerk or any other fiscal officer of the Town, up to and including December 31st, may be remitted to the Treasurer and included in the Treasurer's accounts for the fiscal year.

Town Treasurer:

In the current year of 1953, the Treasurer's bank deposits exceeded the recorded receipts, as shown by the cash book, by \$599.59. This amount is indicated in Exhibit O, "Summary of Treasurer's Account and Proof of Balance — Period January 1 to August 31, 1953", as Unidentified and Unrecorded Receipts."

The Treasurer should furnish the Selectmen a month-

ly detailed statement of receipts on the form provided for this purpose.

Town Clerk:

It is noted that the Town Clerk made only one remittance during 1952 on account of motor vehicle permits and dog licenses issued. In this connection attention is called to Section 22, Chapter 116 of the Revised Laws, which provides as follows:

"Each designated city official and town clerk shall keep an account of the money received by him for said permits and deposit the same in the city or town treasury on the last Saturday of each month, to be used for the general purposes of the city or town. Failure to deposit shall be cause for immediate removal from office. ****"

Tax Collector:

Payments on account of redemptions from tax sales should be made to the Tax Collector rather than to the Selectmen. The Collector should adopt the use of the standard form of loose leaf tax sale record book in which a complete account of each tax sale and all redemptions should be kept. Redemptions should also be recorded in the Collector's cash book.

Abatements:

All abatements should be authorized by the Board of Selectmen on the proper forms which are provided for this purpose.

Water Department:

The adoption of individual ledger sheets for water customer accounts was recommended.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual Town report. This letter of transmittal should be included in its entirety but the metusion of Exhibits is optional.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Bennington for their assistance during the course of the audit.
