REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH 1, 1900.

In trying to keep pace with the roll of time we now find ourselves dealing with the close of another school year. With the money intrusted to our disposal we have been able to give to the scholars the benefit of a full thirty weeks of school.

As in the past so for the year just ended we deemed it wise to secure largely our teaching force from home teachers who have proved themselves by the experience of the past to be very efficient, while the others came from training schools fully prepared to meet the needs of the day. As a whole the result has been a very pleasant and successful school year.

The teachers have worked hard and conscientiously, bringing many new methods to the front which we believe to have been very helpful.

Glad to note that due attention has been given to the sounds of the letters, reading, composition writing, and the free use of the blackboards for examples and mapping.

Singing has been taught in several of our schools with very pleasing results. All of our schools have adopted the vertical writing system which we believe has come to stay, and the pupils have taken to it quickly, making marked progress along this line.

Some of our teachers availed themselves of the aid received by way of suggestions from the Teachers Journal and we would advise that others become its patron, while others have decorated their school room walls with drawings and fine specimens of school work, also pictures of the day giving it that attractive and homelike appearance.

All of our buildings in use are in excellent condition, well lighted and cheerful.

The addition of Metcalf's Grammars have given good satisfaction.

The Shaker school has maintained its former high reputation.

It has been a great pleasure while visiting most of our schools during the past year to find that teachers and pupils have worked together harmoniously and our schools now stand in a highly progressive condition.

We feel that the presence of so many parents and friends at the closing exercises of all our schools should be favorably mentioned and commended.

Assuring the friends of our schools that we have fully appreciated all favors shown, we herewith submit our annual report.
