# Warrant

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Colebrook, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Colebrook, on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for the election of all Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.

  To act upon all other following articles contained in this warrent:
- 2. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to approve Town Charges as shown by the Budget and raise money for the payment of same.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Poor.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction of Highways and Bridges.
- a. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for summer and winter

maintenance of Town Roads for 1949.

- b. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$778.68 for maintenance, construction, or reconstruction of Class V Highways, in which event the state will contribute \$ 3,114.71.
- c. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for bulldozer or shovel work and gravelling following such work, to facilitate the plowing of winter roads.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to purchase a new truck.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to remove the snow from the business area of the village, defining the area to be cleared, and to raise money for the same.
- 9. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for tarring streets.
- 10. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the construction and repair of sidewalks.
- 11. To see what sums of money the Town will raise for sewer maintenance.
- 12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Police.
- 13. To raise such sums of money as may be neccessary for the care of cemeteries.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate towards the salary of a year round recreational director.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise toward the maintenance of a free skating rink.

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300. for the observance of Memorial Day and the care of the monument lots.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to give free use of the Town Hall to Public Sihools in said Town, for school purposes, including heat, lights and janitor's service, whenever such use does not conflict with the best interests of the Town, for the year next ensuing.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250. to be used by the Chamber of Commerce for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter to advertise the Town of Colebrook and for the maintenance of an Information Booth.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200. to the White Mountains Region Association, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and otherwise calling attention to the resources and advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the White Mountains Region.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to extend the sewer on Park Street to a point on the west side of Route 126 opposite the dwelling of Lawrence Bean and if so to raise money for same.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a caterpillar snow plow commonly used for the purpose of plowing sidewalks in said Town of Colebrook. In the event of an affirmative vote to purchase the snow plow, at a price not to exceed \$2,450., to raise money for same.
- 22. "To see if the Town will vote to make by-laws relating to the licensing of taxicabs within the said Town, and for the regulation of said taxi-

cabs, fixing reasonable license fees therefor, and requiring proof of reasonable insurance or bond for the protection of passengers riding therein, and to enforce said by-laws by annexing suitable penalties thereto," pursuant to chapter 51 of the Revised Laws as amended chapter 146, laws 1943.

- 23. To see if the Town will vote to have three Road Agents; one in each District of said Town, this article to take effect for 1949, immediately upon passage.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to defray the expenses of the Town in anticipation of taxes, for the year next ensuing.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to sell at public auction, any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds, and until such sale is made, to administer such property in the interests of the town.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of Agents, Selectmen, Auditors, Committees and all other Town Officers as contained in the annual report of said Town for the year ending December 31, 1948.
- 27. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

#### REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER

The clinics held in May and June at the Town Hall for the immunization of children against diphtheria, pertussis (whooping cough) and tetanus were very well attended. Diphtheria has become a very rare disease. Eventually whooping cough should become just as rare.

Colebrook had the largest epidemic of measles in 1948 which it has had for at least twenty years.

There were six cases of scarlet fever reported, two cases in each of three families. These occurred at such long intervals it was not thought necessary to close the schools.

One case each of poliomyelitis and undulant fever were reported. The case of undulant fever was outside the village on a farm.

There have been a few sporadic cases of chicken-pox reported through the year.

### COMMITTEE'S REPORT ON TOWN MANAGER ADOPTION

Mr. Walter Hicks, Chairman Board of Selectmen Colebrook, N. H.

The committee as elected at the March meeting in 1948 for the purpose of investigating the advisability of the town adopting the Town Manager plan and reporting to your Board not later then February 1st, submit the following:

The committee have contacted officials and leading citizens in the following towns: Littleton, N. H., Lancaster, N. H., Newport, N. H., and Meredith, N. H. These towns all adopted the plan in 1948 and the information received was not concrete, figures being based only on estimates and opinions on PERSONAL preference. It appeared to us that the Plan had not had sufficient time in the above towns for a fair appraisal and that figures and facts would not be available until their 1948 reports were printed.

The committee as a whole are favorable to a Town Manager or Council Manager for the cities and large towns but the question seems to be, "How large should a town be for a Town Manager?" In contacting the New Hampshire Federation of Taxpavers Association at Concord, New Hampshire through John Langmuir, its executive secretary, who is a strong proponent of the Manager plan, we got lots of information, figures and estimates but all applied to the large towns and cities. He stated that from experience in Maine and Vermont Manager Towns and in Conway, New Hampshire, "That a Town Manager can more than save his annual salary when he has under his supervision the spending of \$50,000.00 or more of Town money." This sum of \$50,000.00 is very close to what Colebrook probably would have to spend or be handled by a Town Manager. There is nothing critical in the Towns financial standing but the disturbing factor is the advancing Tax rate. To the committee this is chiefly a reflection of rising costs of doing business plus a higher standard of Town expenditures represented by better roads, schools, equipment and recreational facilities. These collectively create a larger load for the selectmen to administrate however we hesitate to recommend a change at this time until more information is at hand pertinent to a Town of your size.

We are convinced that the Town Manager plan has many benefits even to a Town the size of Colebrook.

The committee does not wish to convey the idea that this report should be considered final but rather they question if 1949 is the time to take the step.

### REPORT ON RECREATION AND ATHLETIC PROGRAM

September 1, 1948 to Present Date

### RECREATION CENTER

The receation center in Colebrook is what was formerly the basement of the town hall. In early fall, with the aid of high school students, it received a thorough house-cleaning and measures were taken to make it more attractive for the young people. Curtains made by the Home Economics classes were hung and a soda bar was built to make the serving and selling of candy and soft drinks more systematic. The juke box which was purchased last year adds much to the entertainment as do ping pong and pool tables. There is

much for one to do at the "Center" and many have been enjoying its offerings.

### RECREATION-NON-SCHOOL

### Fall Program:

On Saturday morning there are tap dancing and baton classes free of charge for grammar school girls. Saturday afternoon is devoted to the younger boys for baseball, hikes, bicycle trips, games and basketball. On Saturday night from 7-9 there is social and square dance instruction for grammar school boys and girls and from 9-11 social dancing for the teen age group. On Tuesday and Friday afternoon the "Center" is open to grammar school children and games are played.

On Monday, Tuesday, Friday and Saturday evenings this Center is open with an average attendance of 25 boys and girls each evening. On Thursday, there is roller skating in the town hall for all age groups.

### Winter Program:

Basketball is substituted for baseball and on Saturday afternoon instruction and small fry games are played.

The skating rink, erected next to the Academy, is in full swing and the flood lights make it very desirable for night skating. Informal hockey teams are to be started as soon as the basketball season is over and several games are hoped to be played. Skiing will be more prominent now that we have more snow and a competent skier may spend a day in Colebrook every other week giving helpful hints and information about correct form etc., to the boys and girls interested.

### Spring Program:

Basketball will be taken over by baseball and spring track with these sports being in full swing on Saturdays. Bicycle trips will be here again and several out of door activities will be resumed.

Summer Program:

This program will center mainly around playground activity and swimming. It is hoped that the land purchased by the schools can be regraded and leveled in order to develop and adequate playground and playing field for the younger people.

### Parties:

Halloween Parties were held for the grammar school children and the high school students in the Town Hall this year. Both were free of charge. Games were played, prizes awarded, and refreshments served.

Christmas Party. This party was for grammar school children and was also held at the Town Hall. It was much the same as the Halloween Party with the exception of a 15 cent admission added to cover expenses. An Easter Party is also being planned for the children.

### SCHOOL PROGRAM

The development of physical education in the local elementary school and three rural schools was started this fall. On Wednesday, each class in the grammar school has one period of physical education being outside play, weather permitting. On Thursday, each of three rural schools has one hour of participation in games and physical education acivities.

The equipment for this program at present includes balls, jump ropes, and books for teachers.

It is hoped that this has been a supervisory program in order that the respective teachers may carry on the various activities throughout the week.

On Tuesday and Friday afternoons a one hour lecture period is held for 8 grade boys at the grammar school under the heading of "Personal Hygiene."

Varsity Sports:

Cross Country. This sport was introduced to Colebrook last fall. Uniforms were purchased and meets were held with Errol, Laconia and a combined meet held in Colebrook with Pittsburg, Errol and Lancaster. Colebrook's varsity squad was the victor in all these meets. The New Hampshire State Championship meet was held in Durham and Colebrook placed 3rd in the class B. groups. As a result two boys from the team were invited to participate in the New England meet in Boston.

### Basketball:

Varsity and grammar school basketball for boys and girls have been included in the winter athletic program. While not scoring many wins the teams show marked improvement in playing style and team work. New basketball uniforms have been purchased for the girls' varsity team and cheer leading uniforms were also added to the budget this year. Excellent traveling conditions were secured for the teams this year and individual insurance for each player was taken out before the start of the season. Hot lunches were served after all home games to the visiting and Colebrook teams.

### Baseball, Track and Field, and Girl's Softball:

This spring, two new sports are to be added to the roster. Track for the boys and softball for the girls. Plans are underway for scheduling track meets and softball games with schools in the surrounding area. New baseball uniforms for the varsity will be purchased for the boys this spring.
