TOWN WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE,

ROCKINGHAM, SS

[L. S.]

To the inhabitants of the Town of Derry, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- I. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools, for the maintenance of the poor, for the laying out and repairing of highways and building and repairing bridges, and for other necessary charges arising in said town.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of Upton Post, No. 45, Department of New Hampshire Grand Army of the Republic, to defray the expenses of Memorial Day.
- 4. To see what action the town will take relative to renewing the contract with the Derry Water Works Co., and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to publish and enforce such regulations as shall prevent children under sixteen years of age from loitering on the streets or in any public place in the night season after nine o'clock p. m., unless accompanied by parent or proper guardian.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to adopt the Australian form of ballot, as provided by statute, for use, hereafter, in its annual town meetings.

- 7. To see if the town will vote to place an electric light at the junction of the two streets opposite the place known as the Bowling Alley.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to build a concrete side-walk from the railroad crossing at the E. L. Fuller shoe factory on the southeasterly side of the street to the residence of Charles W. Davis on the Highlands.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to construct a concrete sidewalk along the southerly side of Franklin street from the residence of Frank N. Young to the corner of the street near the residence of Frank A. Ford.
- to. To see if the town will vote to establish a hydrant at the corner of Franklin and Rollins streets near the residence of George S. Rollins.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to locate and maintain a hydrant near John Duffy's corner.
- 12. To hear the reports of agents, auditors or committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to construct a concrete sidewalk from south side of Broadway along the west side of Oak street to the East Side Grammar school, also from Oak street along the north side of Exchange street to Birch street-
- 14. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of fifty dollars for a proper observance of "Old Home" day. Given under our hands and seal this twenty-third day of February, A. D., 1901.

SCHOOL REPORT.

REMARKS.

In the opinion of your School Board the condition of the schools of the Districts compares favorably with their condition at the beginning of the year. The appropriations were sufficient to maintain the schools for thirty-six weeks throughout the District, which in our opinion is as long a school year as is advisable at present.

The amount appropriated for concreting was expended in constructing walks on the grounds at both school houses in West Derry. By the generosity of the town officials and of citizens a sidewalk was also built along the street in front of the west side school house which adds much to the appearance and convenience of the school grounds. A small amount of grading would greatly improve the lot and should be done wherever funds are available. A room for the storage of supplies was built in the basement of the east side school house, which makes the handling of supplies more convenient. One-half of the basement was also floored over and it will be well to lay a floor over the remainder in the near future, but no special appropriation will be necessary for that purpose. The wood shed at No. 4 was too small and it was in such a condition that immediate repairs were necessary so it was decided to remove the old building and construct a new and larger one. The school buildings belonging to the District are in good condition, and during the past year they were insured for \$15,000 for three years.

The contract with the Trustees of Pinkerton Academy was renewed on the same terms as for the preceding year and the District paid the tuition of forty-two pupils for the spring term; forty-one for the fall term, and thirty-six for the winter term.

Following the policy of preceding School Boards, teachers who have proved themselves competent have been retained when possible, and in cases where a change became necessary we think that teachers were secured who were well fitted for their work and were generally satisfactory to all concerned.

Although it is but a repetition of what has been said by almost every preceding School Board, we must again urge upon parents the need of their co-operation with the teachers and the School Board in arousing and maintaining in their children an interest in the schools. An examination of the registers will show that in those schools where parents were frequent visitors during the term, the attendance of pupils was more regular, and a visitor finds the scholars more alert and ready to tell what they know. The attendance in some of the schools is very irregular, and in consequence the progress, not only of those who are absent, but also of the whole school is retarded and the work of the teacher is increased. This can be remedied by the parents easier than by any one else, and we ask that parents insist that their children attend each session of the school promptly.

Exclusive of the amount appropriated for insurance, concreting and tuition at Pinkerton Academy, it has cost to maintain the schools the past year, nearly twelve dollars for each scholar registered at the beginning of the school year.

If it seems desirable to the District to continue the schools thirty-six weeks next year we recommend a special school tax of \$2000, the same as for the past year.

Upon a petition, an article relating to the sale of a certain portion of the west side school lot is inserted in the wārrant. Thanking the citizens of the District for their generous support and hearty co-operation, we submit the following financial report:
