TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dublin Qualified to Vote in Town Affairs:

You are herby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the eleventh of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First. To bring in your votes to elect a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention to be holden at Concord on the first Wednesday of June next.

Second. To choose all necessary town officers, agents,

auditors and committees for the ensuing year.

Third. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Fourth. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and for any other purposes as mentioned in the budget.

Fifth. To see if the town will vote to apply for State Aid

for highways for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for reconstruction on the trunk line highway.

Seventh. To see what action the town will take in regard to making alterations and improvements in the Town House, raise and appropriate money for the same or pass any vote relating thereto.

Eighth. To see if the town will vote to accept the gift

of certain fire apparatus for the use of the town.

Ninth. To see if the town will vote or instruct the selectmen to hire a janitor and caretaker for the care of Town buildings, parks and playgrounds, raise and appropriate money for the same, or pass any vote relating thereto.

Tenth. To see what action the town will take in regard to granting the use of the Town Hall for the purpose of prac-

ticing and playing Basketball.

Eleventh. To see if the town will vote to purchase a new Town Clock, raise and appropriate money for the same or

pass any vote relating thereto.

Twelfth. To see what action the town will take in regard to the preservation of certain Town documents, raise and appropriate money for the same or pass any vote relating thereto.

REPORT OF THE DUBLIN SCHOOL BOARD

To the Citizens of the Dublin School District:

We herewith submit the one hundred and eighth annual

report of our schools.

The work of both teachers and pupils proved to be very satisfactory during the past year. This fact is emphasized by the number of scholars from Dublin attending high school and the standing they are maintaining there.

The present school year commenced with the appoinment of three new teachers: Miss Dorothy Whytock and Miss Irma Middleton at No. 1, and Miss Harriett Hemphill at No. 2. All of these teachers are Keene Normal School graduates. Owing to the resignation of Miss Middleton, Miss Elizabeth Seckendorf, a Perry Normal School graduate, was appointed in her place.

The grading in front of No. 1 school has been completed, and ample playground space has been made in the rear of the building. Painting and other necessary repairs have

been done in the various school buildings.

Basketball equipment for both boys and girls has been placed in No. 1 school, and the board plans to further encourage athletic games during the coming year.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Superintendent's Report to The School Board of Dublin:

The cost of items supplied by supervision is \$4.34 per pupil against \$4.89 as the average for the State of New Hampshire. Three dollars and seventy-eight cents per pupil was expended for teachers' salaries less than the State average. During the past four years Dublin has dropped from the 13th to the 8th position in point of current costs per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation. This is not an argument in favor of extravagance but shows that because of the great wealth of Dublin in comparison to its school population legitimate increases for educational costs will not appreciably burden the tax rate. At present 4 4-10 mills out of each dollar of equalized valuation of the town of Dublin are expended for education. The achievement of the pupils within the schools during the past year is a matter of record and not of argument. Only exceedingly backward communieducationally speaking, are without the knowledge of the purposes and results of a standardized program for supervision. It is equally certain that if changes from modern type of supervision are brought about the quickness of the decline in school efficiency will be far more marked than the gradual steady assent to the high level reached last June. Nothing fails quite so quickly in modern times The Board has been supplied with as old style methods. all standard statistical data extending as far back as ten years in the finances and four years in the educational prac-It can itself make its decisions upon recorded data rather than upon expressed opinions.

For the many courtesies extended and in particular for the numerous expressions of confidence made to me by the parents of the school children, and for the cooperation of all individuals interested in retaining the 1929 status of the Dublin Public Schools, the Superintendent and his associates express their sincere appreciation.
