## WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

### L. S. THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Grafton, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. Is it expedient to revise the constitution?
3. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
5. To see if the town will vote to elect one or more Road Agents for the ensuing year.
6. To see if the town will allow a discount of three per cent. upon all property taxes paid on or before July 30, 1937.
7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short term loans in anticipation of taxes.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining town highways and bridges, including the amount of 1-4 of one per cent.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments.
10. To see if the town will accept State Aid for construction of class 2 road, known as Grafton Turnpike, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$622.50, or will accept State Aid for class 5 roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$622.50.

Note: No town may receive both class 5 and class 2 aid in the same year.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$900.00 plus interest on \$4,500 to apply on town debt.

12. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by town through Tax Collector's deeds.

13. To see if the town will vote to plow all roads suitable for automobile travel which are inhabited by families having permanent residence. (Entered by petition.)

14. To see what action the town will take in regard to purchasing a road machine and appropriate money for the same.

15. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway beginning at the William Caswell place on Razor Hill so called, and leading through Straw abutments to State Highway.

16. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway beginning at the Boyle place on Prescott Hill, so called and leading to the foot of Livingston Hill.

17. To see if the town will vote to use the Australian Ballot system at all future March meetings.

18. To see if the town will vote to require all school buses to carry liability insurance.

19. To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.
