To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hampton Falls in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Hampton Falls on Tuesday, the Ninth day of March, next, at Ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To vote on the following question: Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to elect one road agent instead of three road agents beginning in 1938.
- 5. To see if the town will accept State Aid Construction of ClassII roads known as Kensington Road and Cock Hill Road and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,059.00 for said purpose, or will accept State Aid for Construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$185.76 for said purpose.

- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$64.00 for the N. H. Seacoast Regional Development Association.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to erect a suitable sign on the Town Hall and raise and appropriate money for same.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen power to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to give a discount on taxes paid on or before a stated date.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to appoint an Investigating Committee to act with the Selectmen, as to the possibilities of enlarging the present dining-room. Said committee to make a detailed report at the 1938 Town Meeting.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

THE REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board of Hampton Falls:

I herewith submit to you my seventh report as superintendent of your schools.

In the published report of last year we stated that we should attempt to measure as accurately as possible the scolastic achievement in our school during the then current year. We stated that the most reliable of tests had already been given to your pupils and that a second test would be given near the end of the school year. A comparison of these two tests would give us as accurate an idea of the school's progress as can be obtained in mathematical terms. The two standardized examinations were given on November 19, 1935 and May 12, 1936 — a period of five months actual school instruction. These were graded to numerical figures and then transferred into terms of school progress. The final results were thus obtained in terms of years and months of school accomplishment. These tests were given to grades four, five and six with the following results:

The fourth grade accomplished during these five school months exactly five and one-half months work in Arithmetic, and five months work in Reading. The fifth grade did an outstanding piece of work by progressing 6.78 months in Reading and 14.4 months in Arithmetic. This unusual achievement in Arithmetic may perhaps be the result of too great an emphasis upon the subject or it may be the culmination of several years exceptional training. The sixth grade record was very commendable with a progress of 5.33 months in Reading and 9.5 months in Arithmetic. It will be seen from these figures that the school as a whole averaged to do 5.7 months work in Reading and slightly better than nine months work in Arithmetic. This is a fair accounting of the efficency of the Hampton Falls School.

This year we are attempting a new method of Spelling. The new books are here. They are the most up-to-date and most authoritatively approved texts on the market. You, as a board, may justly expect improvement as a result. The results will be reported as soon as a fair test has been made.

A noted speaker once said, "It is dangerous to have the other peoples know more about us than we know about them." That is becoming more forcefully true as contacts between peoples and nations become more frequent. For this reason, I believe, the study of Geography will be given more and increasing emphasis year by year. This subject must no longer be a mere memorizing of names, places, rivers, products, etc. Geography must now show us the life of other people - their likes and dislikes, their customs, means of livelihood. their joys and troubles and, more important than these, the way in which they think and reason. Miss Tucker has realized the growing importance of Geography and has made it a subject of live interest to her pupils by means of correspondence with pupils of their own age in nearly every other state of the Union. The next step will be personal pupil to pupil letters with children of foreign countries. Letters and packages received by the school have frequently contained samples of products from distant places. I wish that each parent might visit the school, at least once this year, and ask to see the geography booklets and the sample products on exhibit in the room. Miss Tucker has been so successful in this work that she was called upon to explain it at a meeting of the teachers of Union 21.

Miss Angwin in the primary room following the Reading and Arithmetic methods begun so successfully a few years ago. The progress of the pupils is satisfactory and, I feel sure, a full year's work will be accomplished.

Mr. George Wilson of Dover is in charge of the school Music in Hampton Falls. Without taking an undue amount of time from other school work, he has reawakened the pupils not only to an appreciation of melody but to an interest in the reading and interpretation of music. His own enthusiasm is clearly evidenced by the eagerness of the children to give of their best in response to his endeavors.

The attendance record of 91.52 per cent is the lowest in recent years. This was due in part to the prevailing illness in the primary room, althought the upper grade room percentage was but 93. The attendance during the current year has been better. I am urging the parents to help us in the work of the school by seeing that their children attend regularly.

The course of study is planned for continuous attendance and each day lost means a new alignment of work and a readjustment peculiar to the individual pupil. Continual readjustment deprives the pupil of the smooth progress through the school grades which is his right.

The people of Hampton Falls are interested in their children's welfare, This is shown not only by the financial support given their schools in general but by their response to special need. Card parties held as benefits for dental clinics and other health measures have been generously supported. Such help has materially aided the school nurse in securing the satisfactory results which we have learned to expect from her work.

May I express my thanks to the school board for continued help and guidance in the duties of my office. Such help must result in more effective work through the entire system.
