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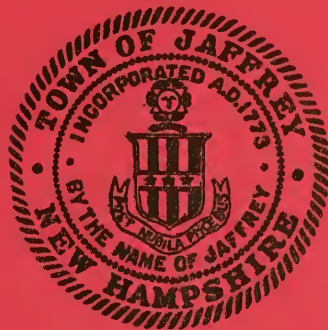

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TOWN MEETING WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, in the County of Cheshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall on School Street in East Jaffrey Village, in said Town, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, (polls to remain open until six o'clock in the afternoon) to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.
2. To hear all reports, except that of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee, and to raise such sums of money as may be required for the support of the poor, building and repairing highways and bridges, fire department, Memorial Day, street lights, and all other Town Charges.
4. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
5. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to establishing an Emergency Center, Red Net Work System, or any other means of assistance by telephone, in locating and calling for help in case of the development of a sudden crisis, wherein there may be drastic need for immediate aid. To raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of such system or act in any way relating thereto.
6. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the motion passed at the March 1953 Town Meeting pertaining to the reports of the Poole Fund Committee, or act in any way relative thereto. (By Petition).
7. To see if the Town will request the Poole Fund Committee to annually report its financial activities to the Office of the Attorney General at Concord, New Hampshire, and to the Trustees of Trust Funds of the Town of Jaffrey, or act in any way relative thereto. (By Petition).
8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the construction of a Town Office Building and to apply the money heretofore appropriated and held in the Town Hall Capital Reserve Fund, also the amount of money in the old Town Hall Fund created in 1927, to defray the cost of said structure.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 for furniture and equipment for the proposed Town Office Building.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,800 to construct a sewer on Howard Hill Road, beginning at the Squantum Road Sewer and extending to the residence of James Roberts, or act in any way relating thereto. (By Petition).

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$7,300 to be used for repairs to the Library Building or act in any way relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,700 for improvement of Trunk Line and State Aid roads within the compact area of the Town, providing the State will contribute a like amount.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the issuance of bonds to the amount of \$5,400 for improvement of Trunk Line and State Aid roads within the compact area of the Town; the Town to be reimbursed, one half of this amount by the State as its share of the 1955 Allotment.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$956.84 for Town Road Aid upon Class V Highways, on condition that the State will contribute the sum of \$6,378.92.

15. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the practice of electing our Chief of Police, and vote that said officer shall be appointed and hold office at the will of the Selectmen. (By Petition).

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$6,000 to purchase from Fred J. Butler, a tract of land in the rear of the fire station, the area of which is approximately 7,000 square feet (about 1/6 acre) to be used for a parking area, or to appoint an investigating committee to report to the Town at some future time as to the feasibility of the acquisition of said lot.

17. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to arrange for the installation of a street light on the Old Peterborough Road, in the vicinity of the residence of Stanley J. Bryant, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$23.50 to pay for the electric service for one year. (By Petition).

18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Water Commissioners to borrow money to make necessary repairs to the Mountain Reservoir; said money to be repaid at the discretion of the Water Commissioners from revenue derived from water rents. (By Petition).

19. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to arrange for the installation of a street light on Ridgecrest Road near the residences of Arthur DeGrandpre and Helen Belanger, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$23.50 to pay for the electric service for one year. (By Petition).

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000 to construct a sewer on Old Peterborough Road extending from a point near the residence of John B. Robichaud to the residence of Josephine Chouinard, or act in any way relating thereto. (By Petition).

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$538.00 (1/100th of 1% of the valuation of the Town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southwestern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$5,000 for the construction of sidewalks on various streets of the Town, or act in any way relating thereto.

23. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relating to games of Beano, be accepted in this Town.

ABSTRACT OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED AT THE ANNUAL TOWN
MEETING, MARCH 10, 1953

Art. 1. Election of Officers. As Arts. 5 and 8 had reference to method of choosing town officers at this meeting, the Moderator without objection took up these articles of order.

Art. 5. Highway Agent. It was voted not to change the present method.

Art. 8. Chief of Police. On a motion to leave the appointment of Chief of Police, a rising vote was "Yes," 104; "No," 109, and the method of election was not changed.

Art. 1. Officers Elected. Town Clerk, George H. Duncan; Selectman for three years, Lester F. Hammond; Town Treasurer, Eugene F. Boynton; Highway Agent, Henry J. Belletete; Chief of Police, Hubert F.

O'Neil; Chief Engineer, Fire Department, Philip C. Tremblay; Overseer of Poor, Hubert F. O'Neil; Tax Collector, Hubert F. O'Neil; Water Commissioner, Three Years, Frank E. Davis; Commissioner of Humiston Park, Three Years, Maurice J. LaSaulce; Auditors, Anne B. Gordon, Lewis S. Record, Jr., Edward L. Fay, Sr.; Trustee of Trust Funds, Three Years, Carl C. Spofford.

Art. 6 Department of Public Works. A motion to establish this Department was defeated.

Art. 2. It was voted to accept the reports as printed.

Art. 3. Appropriations. It was voted that the sum of \$99,803.50 be raised and appropriated for the following purposes:

Art. 7. Public Works. The article was passed over.

Art. 9. Town Hall. It was voted that a committee consisting of Ralph E. Boynton, Elizabeth D. Sawyer, Alfred S. Despres and W. Arnold Seale, be appointed to investigate the possibility of erecting a Town Hall or Town Office Building; to report their findings to the next annual town meeting and to draw on the Capital Reserve Fund for erecting a Town Hall for their reasonable expenses.

Art. 10. Capital Reserve Fund. It was voted to transfer \$5,000.00 from unencumbered surplus to the Town Hall Capital Reserve Fund.

Art. 11. Sidewalk Construction. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$5,000.00 for construction of sidewalks on Main Street.

Art. 12. Fire Alarm. It was voted that the Selectmen in cooperation with the Chief Engineer be authorized to install a fire alarm system in East Jaffrey and Jaffrey Center and to issue three bonds of \$5,000.00 each, payable in one, two and three years, to pay for the same.

Art. 13. Class V. Highways. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$942.98 for Town Road Aid on Class V Highways, provided the State contributes \$6,286.52 for the same purposes.

Art. 14. Trunk Line & State Aid Highway Improvement. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$2,700.00 for improvement of Trunk Line & State Aid Roads in the compact part of the Town, provided the State contributes a like sum for the purpose.

Art. 15. Monadnock Region Association. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$495.00 to the Monadnock Region Association.

Art. 16. Poole Fund Committee. The following motion was adopted: That the committee acting under section 37 of the will of the late Alice W. Poole shall furnish from the year of their first appointment to December 31, 1952, evidence of compliance with the terms of the public trust created under said will as follows:

1. Authenticated records of their appointments to the said committee each year, and if unable to furnish such records they shall so state, giving their reasons, from the following institutions named in said will:

- A. The Monadnock National Bank;
- B. The District Nurse Association;
- C. The East Congregational Church.

2. An accounting in detail of the expenditures of "Said income in providing additional comforts for elderly people, children and the youth of the Town of Jaffrey, to take steps to promote the health of said community—and to aid the elderly residents thereof."

If such expenditures are determined by said committee to be outright gifts or grants, their accounting shall so state, giving names, dates and amounts.

4. An accounting in detail, with names, dates and amounts, as well as interest paid if any, of all monies received in repayment of loans pupils to assist them in obtaining education.

5. A complete accounting, in detail, of their power "To make loans to pupils to assist them in obtaining education" and such accounting shall include the following information in each case:

- (1) Name of borrower;
- (2) Age of borrower;
- (3) Date of loan;
- (4) Term of loan;
- (5) Name of educational institution attended by borrower;
- (6) Whether the money is paid directly to the borrower or to the educational institution on his account;
- (7) State what evidence of debt is obtained from borrower;
- (8) If the borrower is a minor, whether parent or guardian has guaranteed his promise to pay;
- (9) If interest is charged, date when the borrower becomes subject thereto and the rate.

6. If the committee determines in the exercise of its discretionary powers, in the case of any grant or gift, that it might be uncharitable to publish the name of the recipient, he may be designated by the name of "John" or "Mary Doe," but only if the committee has first obtained a signed receipt, with the true name of the recipient for purposes of ex-

amination by the Town Auditors, who are hereby directed to make all audits in accordance with this motion.

7. That the committee report of the information hereby required be filed with the Town Clerk as a part of the Town's public records, together with the auditors' report thereon and that auditors' reports shall thereafter be filed with the Town Clerk annually.

8. That in case of loans made by the committee, the names of all borrowers still obligated shall also be filed annually with the Town Clerk, showing the date and amount of the loan; any payments and the date thereof until such loans shall have been liquidated by payments or have been determined by the committee to be uncollectible.

It is further moved, that the Trustees of Trust Funds make no further payments to said committee until said committee shall have filed its first report with the Town Clerk.

Art. 17. Tax-exempt Property. It was voted that all tax-exempt property within the Town shall be listed annually in the book publishing the invoice and taxes of the Town including (but without limiting) all buildings and land owned by the School District, as well as that owned by the Town, State or other tax-exempt entity or agency.

Art. 18 White Pine Blister Rust. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for control of White Pine Blister Rust.

Art. 19 and 20. It was voted to accept \$300.00 in trust, the income to be used for the care and upkeep of the Cutter Cemetery, with particular attention to the Gilmore, Messerli and Akers lots.

Art. 21. Sewer, Squantum Road. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 to extend the sewer about 1000 feet on Squantum Road.

Art. 22. Squantum Street Lights. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$23.50 to install two new street lights in Squantum Village.

Art. 23 It was voted to raise and appropriate \$9,000 for the purchase of a new fire truck.

Art. 24 Mills Road Lights. It was voted to raise and appropriate \$23.50 to install two new lights on the Mills Road in Jaffrey Center.

Art. 25. Beano Referendum. The vote under this article was "Yes," 624; "No," 194.

The meeting adjourned at 8:50 P.M.

At a legal meeting of the School District of Jaffrey at the Auditorium in said Town and on the 9th day of March at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon pursuant to the foregoing warrant:

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Jason C. Sawyer, and the warrant was read by him with the return of the same.

Article 1: To choose a Moderator for the coming year. It was moved by Lloyd Wellington and seconded that the Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for Jason C. Sawyer for Moderator. Jason C. Sawyer at this time turned the chair over to the Clerk, Evelyn H. Ruffle. The motion was put by the Clerk and was unanimously carried. The Clerk cast one ballot for Jason C. Sawyer and he was declared elected and took the oath in open meeting.

Article 2: To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year. It was moved by Homer Belletete that the Moderator be instructed to cast one ballot for Myrtle J. Hazleton for Clerk for the ensuing year. The motion was seconded and unanimously carried. The Moderator cast one ballot for Myrtle J. Hazleton for Clerk and declared her elected and administered the oath of office in open meeting.

Article 3: To choose two members of the School Board for the ensuing three years. Vernon Bean moved the Moderator be instructed to case one ballot for Robert P. Haynes for a member of the School Board for three years. Motion seconded, and lost. Prescott Duncan nominated Francis E. Devlin for a member of the School Board for three years. Delcie Bean, Jr. nominated Robert P. Haynes for a member of the School Board for three years. Tellers appointed: Lloyd Wellington, Ferdinand Gordon, Randy Cournoyer and Homer Forcier.

Mr. Alfred Despres nominated George C. Robinson as a member of the School Board for two years (to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Robert M. Grummon). Motion was seconded. Mr. George Austermann moved the Moderator cast one ballot for George C. Robinson for member of the School Board for two years. Unanimously carried.

Article 4: To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year. Mr. James Austin moved the Moderator cast one ballot for Lawrence W. Brown for treasurer for the ensuing year. Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

Oath of office for Francis E. Devlin, Ernest J. Pratt, George C. Robinson, members of the School Board, and Lawrence W. Brown, treasurer, administered in open meeting.

Article 5: To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district. Hubert S. O'Neil moved that the salaries of the School Board and other district officers be as follows:

Motion was seconded and unanimously carried.

Article 7: To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant. Mr. Lewis S. Record, Sr., moved the auditors appointed at Town Meeting as town auditors serve as school auditors. Seconded and unanimously carried.

Article 8: To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town. Phyllis C. Walkonen moved that the school district raise and appropriate \$150,425.00 and to authorize and direct the school board to apply against said appropriation such income as is estimated by the school board, exclusive of state aid, and upon the determination of the amount of state aid to be received by the school district during the next fiscal year, to authorize and direct the school board to apply against such appropriation the sum to be received from state aid and with the school district clerk certify to the selectmen the balance as an assessment to be raised by the town for school purposes. Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

Article 9: To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,200 for the installation of a ceiling in the Grade School lunch room. Mary B. Davis moved that the district raise and appropriate \$1,200.00 for the installation of a ceiling in the Grade School lunchroom. Seconded and carried.

Article 10: To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate \$500 for adapting the Grade School library for use as a projection room. Robert P. Haynes moved that the district raise and appropriate \$500.00 for adapting the Grade School library for use as a projection room. Seconded and carried.

Article 11: To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate \$125 for the installation of electric outlets at the High School. Robert P. Haynes moved that the district raise and appropriate \$125 for the installation of electric outlets at the High School. Seconded. Motion made to lay on table, seconded, not carried. George H. Duncan said he thought the School Board would not spend the money if they felt it unwise. Motion carried.

Article 6: To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto. Alfred Despres reported on the Building Committee. Plans will accommodate a student enrollment up to 400. Buildings connected with a covered passageway. New building 40 feet or 50 feet away, connected with a convenient passageway to allow for light in classrooms. Buildings to be connected (1) if on Fitzgerald land—at one door in back, (2) if on Stratton Road—connected through one of the classrooms above the present shop. General discussion.

Philip Darling reported on the Cooperative School Committee. Vernon Bean reported on the location, operating costs and transportation. Robert P. Haynes reviewed "Summary of Estimated School Costs—Grades 7-12—with Conversion to Tax Rate."

Article 13—To see if the district will vote to become a member of Cooperative High School District No. 2, grades 7 through 12, as laid out by the State Board of Education, comprising the school districts of Francestown, Greenfield, Hancock, Jaffrey, Peterborough, Sharon and Temple, and take any necessary action relating thereto. Philip Darling moved that the district become a member of Cooperative High School District No. 2, Grades 7 through 12, as laid out by the State Board of Education, comprising the school districts of Francestown, Greenfield, Hancock, Jaffrey, Peterborough, Sharon and Temple. Seconded. Discussion—Mr. Haynes—transportation. Further discussion.

Article 12: To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,341 for the purchase of new equipment. Ernest J. Pratt moved that the district raise and appropriate \$1,341.00 for the purchase of new equipment. Seconded and carried.

Mr. George Austermann moved we pass over Article 19: To see if the School District meeting will vote that the Moderator shall be required to admit to the School District meetings only those persons who are registered voters according to the Check List of the qualified voters of the Town of Jaffrey, beginning with the present meeting and all meetings thereafter. Seconded and carried.

George Austermann moved we pass over Article 20. To see if the School District meeting will vote that the Moderator shall be required to disallow any non-resident to address a School District meeting upon the objection of one or more citizens of the Town of Jaffrey, if Article 19 is not adopted. Seconded and carried.

George Austermann moved we pass over Article 21: To see if the Moderator shall be required to disallow the voting of any non-registered voter, and to effectuate the purposes of this article, (if Article 19 shall not have been adopted), that all voting hereafter, and from the beginning of this meeting, shall be according to the Check List of the qualified voters of the Town. Seconded and carried.

Article 22: To see if the School District meeting will vote that upon the request of ten (10) or more registered voters, any vote taken shall be by secret ballot. George Austermann moved that upon the request of ten (10) or more registered voters any vote taken shall be by secret ballot. Seconded and carried.

Article 23: To see if the School District meeting will vote that because of the considerable amount of money appropriated in our Annual Meetings for school purposes, it is considered advisable to recommend to the School Board that the date for said Annual Meeting should coincide with the date of the Annual Town Meeting, and that because the qualified voters of both the School District and the Town are identical, the said School District Meeting shall be held at, or immediately before or after, one-half of the Articles comprising the Town Warrant will have been acted upon. George Austermann moved that because of the considerable amount of money appropriated in our Annual Meetings for school purposes the date for said Annual Meeting of School District coincide with the date of the Annual Town Meeting because qualified voters of both School District and Town are identical, School District Meeting shall be held at or immediately before or after one-half of the Articles comprising the Town Warrant have been acted upon. Seconded and lost.

Article 24: To see if the School District meeting will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 34 of the Revised Laws of the State of New Hampshire, providing for a non-partisan ballot system. Ernest J. Pratt moved that the district adopt the non-partisan ballot system as provided in Sections 112-120, Chapter 34 of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire. Seconded and carried.

Article 14: To see what action the district will take in the selection of a suitable site for an addition to the High School, and authorize the acquisition of any real property for the location of such building. Alfred Despres moved to take up Article 16. Seconded and carried.

Article 16: To see what sum the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction, equipment and furnishing of such an addition to the High School and the acquisition of any real property that may be necessary for its location; and whether the district will vote to raise such sum through the issuance of serial notes or bonds upon the credit of the district for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the school board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued, including their sale and the time and place of payment of principal and interest, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bonds Statute, N. H. Revised Laws, Chapter 72, and any amendments thereto. Moved that the District appropriate a sum not exceeding \$340,000.00 for the acquisition of necessary land; the construction of an addition or annex to the present high school building, for the equipment of the same and the renovation of the present high school building. Seconded. Discussion.

Alfred Despres moved the adoption of the following resolution: Resolved, that the district raise and appropriate \$340,000 for the construction, equipment and furnishing of such an addition to and make alterations as necessary to the present High School and the acquisition of any real property that may be necessary for its location; and that the District raise such sum through the issuance of serial notes or bonds upon the credit of the District for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the school board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued, including their sale and the time and place of payment of principal and interest, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bonds Statute, N. H. Revised Laws, Chapter 72, and any amendments thereto. Seconded.

James Austin moved that vote be taken by a rising vote. Seconded and carried. Discussion.
