#### **TOWN WARRANT**

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon, the County of Sullivan, said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

Art. 3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to repair the Tool House and make appropriation for the same.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of highways and bridges and make appropriation for the same.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Metal Pipe Sluices for the Town Roads and make appropriation for the same.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for State Aid Construction.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for State Aid Maintenance.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Trunk Line Maintenance.

Art. 9. To elect a Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$100.00 for control of the White Pine Blister Rust, and make appropriation for the same.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 12. To transact any other business that may come before the meeting.

Art. 13. To allow accounts.

# SCHOOL REPORT DISTRICT OF LANGDON, N. H.

#### Report of the Superintendent of Schools to the Langdon School Board

To the Members of the School Board of Langdon, N. H. Gentlemen:

The loss of two excellent teachers, Miss Eleanor Bartlett and Miss Hope Johnson, made it imperative that their successors should be able to carry on the work with equal merit. Miss Rachel Merrill and Miss Ruth Nims have proven themselves, already, to be worthy successors.

The progressive program of building repair is showing good interest in the continued cleanlines sand sanitary conditions of the buildings. At the Hill School there is need for repair on the woodshed, which at present offers an unsightly appearance from the road.

Probably for the first time in Langdon, a school nurse was available during the period for which school money was was available to pay for her services. It is to be regretted that no more persons took advantage of the opportunity to secure expert counsel and to follow it.

The superintendent desires heartily to express his appreciation for the courtesy and co-operation shown him in his work.

Specific recommendations for the ensuing year are made as follows:

1. Installation of a school bell on the village school building. Too great a number of tardinesses continually pile up. Some means of warning laggard children of the approach of school opening would relieve the parents from the necessity of starting children so early. Prompt attention to duty is worthy of being instilled in children. Tardinesses are symptoms of careless habits.

2. Completion of a set of maps for the upper grades

in the rural school, and the addition of a partial set to the upper grades of the grammar school.

3. Grading of the ground in front of the village school.

4. Filling up the unsightly cavity left by the removal of the scale house, and the setting up of some inexpensive playground apparatus on that site.

5. Adjustable shades for Hill school.
