WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL MEETING MARCH 10, 1953

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects: said meeting to be held open until six o'clock in the afternoon.

First To see if the Town will vote to accept the report of the Budget Committee and vote to adopt their recommendations as printed.

Second To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Third

To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Committion to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division.

Fourth

To see if the Town will vote to purchase from the Northern Railroad the land upon which the West Lebanon Primary School, the West Lebanon Fire Station and the West Lebanon Library are situated, for a sum not to exceed \$100.00; and to authorize the Selectmen to convey by deed a parcel of said land to the West Lebanon Fire Precinct, a parcel of said land to the West Lebanon Library Association and a parcel of said land to the Lebanon School District, or act thereon.

Fifth To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,700.00 for the purpose of building a new ski jump, or act thereon.

Sixth To see if the Town will vote to authorize and

direct the Selectmen to enter into a written lease with Connecticut Valley Airways, Inc., for a period of twenty years with an option of renewal for a further period of ten years under such terms and conditions as the Selectmen may deem satisfactory, or act

thereon.

Seventh To choose a Selectman for the ensuing three

years.

Eighth To choose a Town Clerk, a Tax Collector,

Overseer of the Poor, Treasurer, a Highway Agent and a Chief of Police for the ensuing

year.

Ninth To choose two Library Trustees for the en-

suing three years.

Tenth To choose a Trustee to administer the Trust

Funds for the ensuing three years.

Eleventh To choose four members to act on the Bud-

get Committee for the ensuing three years.

Twelfth To bring in your ballots on the following question—"Shall the provisions of Chapter

question—"Shall the provisions of Chapter 171 A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this

town?"

Thirteenth To transact any other business that may

properly come before the meeting.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Lebanon for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the audit and examination were the accounts and records of the board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds, Library Trustees and Library Treasurer, Lebanon and West Lebanon Cemetery Associations and the Municipal Court.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets — December 31, 1951 - December 31, 1952: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets for the fiscal years ended December 31, 1951 and December 31, 1952, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the financial condition of the Town changed from a Surplus of \$27,286.68 to a Net Debt of \$5,326.07, during 1952.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures — Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$21,442.23, plus a revenue surplus of \$22,722.20, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$44,164.43.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1952, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus position of the Town was maintained in 1952, as indicated by the following statement:

It is noted that the maintenance of the current surplus in 1952 was accomplished notwithstanding the fact that \$49,570.08 of the 1951 cash surplus was used to reduce the 1952 tax rate.

Taxes Assessed in Excess of Budgetary Requirements:

As indicated by Exhibit A-4, "Taxes Assessed in Excess of Budgetary Requirements" amounted to \$1,353.88, and "Added Taxes", \$687.71. These two items which totalled \$2,041.59, were comprised almost entirely of poll taxes. Taxes included in the original warrant committed to the Collector exceeded by \$1,353.88 the amount included in the budget estimate which was used in determining the 1952 tax rate. The added taxes of \$687.71 were added to the Collector's list after the commitment of the original warrant.

It is recommended in this connection that the amount of poll taxes which is used in determining the tax rate be based upon the actual inventory of polls rather than on an estimated basis as has been the practise.

Tax Accounts:

The accounts of the Tax Collector Bert P. Shores were audited for the period from June 23rd to December 31st, 1952, and Exhibits C-1 and C-2 reflect the activity in these accounts during this period.

The accounts of former Tax Collector Milo L. Knight were audited as of June 23, 1952, a report of which audit was made to your Board on July 14, 1952.

Conclusion:

The accounts of all town officials which we examined were found in good condition and the accounting and financial procedure conformed to the prescribed methods and procedure.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual

town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Lebanon for their assistance during the course of the audit.

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

I have had the usual number of reports of dumps and nuisances of all kinds, and again particularly concerning smoke and stench from attempts to burn garbage and green grass in incinerators.

I have also received several complaints of sewers which I have reported to the sewer department.

The following contagious diseases have been reported to me by doctors, nurses and parents: 71 cases of measles, 38 cases of chicken pox, 1 case of scarlet fever, 1 case of German measles, 12 cases of mumps, 1 case of pneumonia, and 2 cases of poliomyelitis.

The State Nurse assisted by our local doctors and nurses have held the usual clinics at the Community building.

The Mobile Chest X-ray unit was here for five days in November and was well patronized by our citizens.

I wish to thank the Selectmen, other town officers and all who have in any way assisted me in the discharge of my duties as your Health Officer.

REPORT OF MILK INSPECTION FOR LEBANON

A close check has been made this year on Lebanon's milk supply not only by checking milk samples at intervals but also by checking producer facilities. We have also worked with state inspectors on barn inspection with ventilation, light and cleanliness being of prime importance here. Then utensils and milk rooms are also inspected. One case of high bacteria count was corrected by merely having the air hose to the milking machine cleaned more often.

An outstanding problem this year seems to be mastitis which is very dangerous in unpasturized milk. In spite of the newer antibiotic in use today mastitis is the leading problem with some producers, not only in this area but nationwide. If cattle cannot be cured producers won't sell the milk from these cows and usually sell them for beef.

Bacteria counts have been better this year and butter fat is again averaging above $4.0\,\%$.

Collections for the past year amounted to \$1,616.40.

The work relief fund was used to very good advantage and \$1,212.63 was paid out for this purpose.

During the past year several cases were transferred from Town Aid to Old Age Pension, Aid to Dependent Children, and to Grafton County.

An interesting case during the past year was a Court case between Bethlehem and Lebanon. There were four children to be boarded out in this case. By my interpretation of the Settlement laws the town legally liable was Bethlehem but when I notified that Town they decided to fight the case. The Selectmen and I went to Concord where Commissioner of Welfare Barry arranged a hearing at Woodsville. This hearing was attended by Selectmen of Bethlehem, Overseer of the Poor and their Attorney, the Grafton County Commissioners and County Solicitor Jones, the State childrens Welfare representatives and ourselves. No agreement was reached at that time so Bethlehem appealed to the Superior Court. At the September term of the Superior Court held at Woodsville we appeared with Attorney Charles Tesreau, Bethlehem and their Attorney, Grafton County and Solicitor Jones. The Judge handed down a decision in favor of Lebanon. Had we lost this case or failed to protect our interests the cost to Lebanon would have been more than \$8,000.00. The cooperation of the Selectmen in appearing at these hearings and securing an attorney was greatly appreciated by this Department.

The following is a report of the activities carried on in Lebanon and West Lebanon for the year 1952 by the N. H. Department of Health.

Lebanon:

A Child Health Conference was held at the Carter Community Building on March 18, 1952. A total of 31 babies and pre-school children were given a thorough physical examination by local physicians.

A series of three immunization clinics were held on March 18, April 15, and May 13, 1952. A total of 184 children attended these clinics. Infants under 1 year 18, pre-school children 119, school age children 47.

At its annual meeting on March 11, 1952 your town voted an appropriation for White Pine Blister Rust Control, to be spent in cooperation with this Department. In addition to this action, there were 104 other towns and cities making available funds for blister rust work, in fact, the total funds appropriated amounted to more than any one year since the control of this disease was undertaken.

Conforming to our annual custom with towns cooperating in this program, we are attaching a statement briefly summarizing the accomplishments in your town during the 1952 season.

The details of blister rust control are many and varied, and therefore, it is impossible to mention them all in a brief report. Such information as to the location of the pine protected in 1952 or previously, infected white pine growth, or other points pertinent to this program will be gladly given by the District Leader who supervised the work in your town.
