## TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Lyman, in the county of Grafton and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lyman Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, polls to be opened at nine o'clock in the forenoon and will not be closed before five o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and to make appropriations for the same.
- Art. 3. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 4. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its winter roads.
- Art. 5. To see what action the town will take towards fixing the compensation of the tax collector.
- Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

- Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the White Pine Blister Rust control.
- Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to grant a discount of 2 per cent on all taxes paid on or before such time as the selectmen may designate.
- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes.
- Art. 10. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper observance of Memorial Day.
- Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate to the White Mountains Region Association, for its program of advertising, etc., as a part of its cooperative investment by regional towns, an amount equal to ten cents per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation of the town for 1943.
- Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate not exceeding \$500 for the purpose of making an appraisal of the real estate and wood lands in town, in accordance with an act of the Legislature passed at the last session.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road which turns to right just below Mrs. Sims' place and continues to Littleton line near Fern Foster's farm.
- Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to remodel the tool shed, to be used as a garage and to house fire equipment, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

- Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of municipal accounting, and to make an approprirtion to cover the expense of such audit.
- Art. 16. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen, and pass votes relative thereto.
- Art. 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting. Given under our hands and seals this 26th day of February, 1944.
