REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

TO THE SCHOOL BOARD AND CITIZENS OF MADBURY:

I always anticipate a visit to the North Madbury School, with pleasure. The pupils are attentive and happy, and you are fortunate in having a teacher who enjoys the love of the pupils, and the confidence of the parents. A new ventilating stove has just been installed. The school-house is now very comfortable.

The attendance at the Central School is much improved, but there are still too many cases of absence, and tardiness. The interest in school work is increasing, and the pupils under the direction of Mrs. B. E. Carter, are making commendable progress.

During the year 1926-27, there were twelve days lost in the Central School, and eleven at the North Madbury School. This is an improvement over the seventeen and a half days lost during the previous year. But this is altogether too many; and I urge the importance of regular attendance. School life is altogether too brief, and time should not be unnecessarily wasted.

The Supervisory District, at its annual meeting, voted to employ a trained nurse for work in the entire district, and Mrs. Anna Clow, was selected for the position. During the fall term, she examined forty-four pupils, and made five visits to your schools. She reports that she found twenty pupils with bad teeth, and twelve with hypertrophied tonsils, or adenoids; and five with defective vision. She found nineteen children who had not been vaccinated. This is a bad condition, and it is not fair to the other

people in the community. Smallpox is not entirely extinct, although it is not so common as it once was. I picked up a paper today, and read of several cases of smallpox in Boston. It might find its way to Madbury, and if so, what would be the result? I urge all good citizens to use their influence to have the law requiring vaccination of all school children enforced.

Mrs. Clow made fourteen visits to homes in Madbury, to consult with the parents in regard to the welfare of their children. As a result of her work a number of the pupils have received attention. We all sympathize with Mrs. Clow, in the sad accident by which she lost her children, and are sorry that she cannot continue her good work among us.

During the past year your schools have made progress, and I anticipate still further improvement.
