## Town Warrant

State of New Hampshire.

Carroll SS.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sandwich, in said County and State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following articles:

- 1. To see if the Town will determine by vote the salary to be paid any of its officers or agents.
- 2. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 3. To raise money to pay the interest on the School Fund Note for the ensuing year. The sum required is \$133.92.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the support of the Library in addition to the amount required by law. The sum recommended to be raised by vote is \$420.00.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the observance of Memorial Day. The sum recommended is \$100.00.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the observance of Old Home Week. The sum recommended is \$150.00.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the repair of the Notch and Dale Road. The sum recommended is \$400.00.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the oiling of the Little's Pond Road, or take any action relating thereto.
- 9. To see if the Town will accept state aid for the construction of Class II roads known as the Squam Lake and Whiteface Roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for that purpose the sum of \$1936.50, the State contributing \$1936.00 or accept Class V assistance and raise for that purpose \$818.78, the State contributing \$3275.15.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for replacing the old wooden bridge on Whiteface Intervale with the steel bridge moved from Whiteface Village. The estimated cost is \$500.00.
  - 11. To raise money for the repair of highways and bridges

for the year ensuing, and pass any vote relating thereto. The sum suggested is \$7000.00.

- 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate money for the support of either the Laconia Hospital or Huggins Memorial Hospital, or both.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the support of the Fire Department for the ensuing year. The sum suggested is \$500.00.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the eradication of the White Pine Blister. The sum suggested is \$100.00.
- 15. To hear the report of the Zoning Commission and take any action thereto.
- 16. To raise by vote such sum of money as shall be necessary to pay the expense of general government. The sum suggested is \$1800.00.
- 17. To raise by vote such sum of money as shall be necessary to pay Town Charges for the ensuing year. The sum suggested is \$2200.00.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to use money, in their discretion, for the carrying on of relief projects, said money to be taken from the treasury, to be used with State or Federal funds.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the purchase of snow fence. The sum suggested is \$200.00.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to grant to Agnes Y. Hamilton, as agents for the Town, a right to draw water from the spring on the Beede Hill land, lay and maintain a pipe line and erect such structures as may be needful for the enjoyment of the easement.
- 21. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

#### SANDWICH VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

During the past year your volunteer fire company has responded to numerous calls for help, principally chimney fires, several of which have been "still alarms" which have required the services of only three or four men.

It has been our desire to improve our equipment from time to time, and we have purchased 400 feet of 1½ inch hose as replacement. In addition, a booster pump has been installed on the Model T truck and a tank ordered, so that as soon as the latter arrives and has been set by our men, it will be possible for the company to have on hand and ready for immediate use, 100 gals, of water which the new pump can throw upon a fire merely by the shifting of a lever which transmits the power of the truck motor to the pump. In the work of designing and attaching this new pump, we are much indebted to Deputy Chief Howser, of the Fire Department of Concord.

One of our handicaps, especially in winter, has been our lack of space and equipment for properly drying and caring for our hose. At time of writing, a new hose drying tower, as a part of the Town Building Project, is under construction. Its completion will be a great help in keeping our hose and equipment in order

and ready for any emergency.

The members of the Company have shown their usual loyalty and interest in looking out for the property belonging to the department, and have given much free time in its care and betterment. As typical of the spirit shown, I will simply mention the fact that we have had about 4,600 lbs. of coal hauled without charge by Walter Burrows.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

I herewith submit my second annual report as superintendent of schools.

Rollo G. Reynolds has pointed out four things which should be the heritage of every American child.

1. He has the right to a strong, healthy body.

2. He has the right to develop an honest mind and ability to think in face of evidence.

3. He has the right to trained hands.

4. He has the right to a living soul from which comes the good in life.

Schools in Sandwich are seeking these objectives. With faithful teachers and active school board, property is improved, equipment provided and teaching efficiency maintained. Fine boys and girls are pressing on to enter Quimby School. Practically all of those who graduate from eighth grade enter high school. Provision should be made as far as possible for them to go from high school to higher institutions of learning. Youth at this point often finds it hard to adjust itself to social conditions as it meets them.

High School

The Quimby School offers fine opportunities to boys and girls to prepare for actual life work. Sandwich is indeed fortunate to have located at its Center such a well-equipped and well organized school. Appreciation is expressed to the trustees for wise management of this special school. Teachers here are working hard for the school welfare.

Repairs

Following its wise policy, during the summer the school board improved the property by painting Chick's Corner, Lower Corner and Center Schools. New ceiling and foundations were provided at Lower Corner and new slate blackboards at North Sandwich. A case for books was built at Chick's Corner and Center. Fire escapes were provided at the Center School. All buildings were cleaned and checked on minor repairs.

#### Visual Instruction

During the fall term a large audience in the town hall saw the historical picture, "The Covered Wagon." This gave the pupils a very clear idea of the experiences and hardships of pioneer life in days when adventurous spirits crossed the western plains and mountains in covered wagons drawn by horses and oxen. An instructional reel is now on hand, entitled "From Flower to Fruit," showing how the seeds develop, ready to grow new plants in the spring.

#### Health Work

The health work is still in charge of Miss Helen H. Nichols, R.N. and Dr. Thompson. Inspections have been made and correction of defects is now being sought. For the physical welfare of the boys and girls warm lunches are served in all the schools to those who are obliged to remain at noon. Appreciation is hereby expressed to organizations which financially aided in this good work—especially the Red Cross. Parents and teachers are cooperating splendidly.

Miss Nichols' report is appended.

#### **Statistics**

Last June we graduated, with fine exercises, a class of eight from the eighth grade: Ida Brown, Roland Dearborn, Roger Deming, Jeannette Nixon, Pearl Smith, Robert Peaslee, Ellen Plummer and Kenneth Nelson. All of these are now in Quimby School.

For the year ending June 30, 1935, we had an average attendance of 139.4, an average membership of 148 and a percent of attendance of 94. This is a gain of 2% over the previous year's record. It should not be less than 95%. Schools having an attendance last year of 95% or above are as follows:
