STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday the fourteenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget, and raise money for the same. If not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
 - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
 - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
 - (c) Election and Registration.
 - (d) Municipal Court.
 - (e) Town hall, lands and other buildings.
 - (f) Damage and Legal Expense.
 - (g) Health Department.
 - (h) Vital Statistics.
 - (i) General Expense Highway Department.
 - (j) Interest on Temporary Loans.
 - (k) Interest on Bonds.
 - (1) County Tax.
 - (m) Payment on Bonds.
 - (n) Payment on Temporary Loans.

- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of Poor.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Libraries.
- 5. To raise sum of money as may be necessary for the care of cemeteries.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise one thousand one hundred ninety dollars (\$1,190.00) for street lighting.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following departments:
 - (a) Police Department.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Department.
- 8. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the Town Road Maintenance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for winter roads.
- 10. To nominate and elect two members to serve three years on the Municipal Budget Committee.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the Municipal Year and to pay out of the tax money when it is rereceived.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to the White Mountain Region Association for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter, newspaper and advertising and otherwise calling attention to the resources and ad-

vantages for the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the White Mountain Region.

- 13. To see if the town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to purchase a five ton truck complete with plow, wing and hydraulic lifts not to exceed ninety six hundred dollars (\$9,600.00) and make appropriations for same. Arrangements to be made to hire the necessary amount at the Colebrook National Bank to be paid in a period of five years with interest at the rate of $2\frac{1}{4}\%$.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell the old tractor, snow plow and bulldozer.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to purchase one pump at five hundred fifty dollars (\$550.00) to be installed at Diamond Pond for fire fighting purposes in the Diamond Pond Area.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other town officers as required by law not elected by Non-partisan ballot.

To choose by Non-partisan ballot the following Town Officers:

- (a) Town Clerk.
- (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
- (c) Town Treasurer.
- (d) Three Road Agents.
- (e) One or more Auditors.
- (f) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
- (g) Overseer of Poor.
- (h) One or more Sextons.
- (i) Trustee of Trust Fund.
- (j) One Library trustee for three years ensuing.

To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District of Stewartstown:

Foreword

In making provision for the operation of our schools, there are two primary factors to be considered. The one uppermost in our minds, in all probability, is the amount of money which will have to be raised and appropriated by our local community. With the loss of state aid in most cases and with generally increased enrollments, higher tuition rates, continued scarcity of elementary teachers, plus necessary expansion and improvements to meet pressing needs, increases will result. The extent to which these growing costs are to be met brings us to the second and more important factor to consider, namely, the returns on our investment—the degree to which our boys and girls mature as a result of their school experiences.

As important as are the accumulation and organization of facts in this scientific age, of vastly greater importance is their application to improve life situations. How effectively this is done will be determined very largely by a mind that has been developed over a period of years in such a way that it functions in making its independent estimate of things and in drawing its own conclusions. In orded to provide opportunities for the building of this type of mature mind means, that throughout school, confronting it with problems to be solved, letting it search out relevant evidence, letting it learn to weigh this evidence, coming to a conclusion, and testing that conclusion. It means, further, the planning and maintaining of a long range program conducive, in so far as is possible, to the realization of this all important educational outcome which time alone can determine.

Teachers

The district is unusually fortunate in having but one change in its teachers this year. In East Stewartstown Doris J. Chappell became the teacher at Cedar Brook and Harriett O. Gray is again at the Hollow. At the West Stewartstown School the same staff returned, consisting of Velma H. Gray, Principal, Mae T. Drew, Junie S. Aldrich, and Cleora M. Richardson.

Notes on the Budget

The School Board's Budget and requested appropriation for 1950-51 is \$33,458.00 as compared to \$31,793.00 for this year. The budget is reduced by an estimated income of \$3,053.00 which leaves a balance of \$30,405.00 to be raised by taxes by the town in comparison to \$27,891.27 for the current year. Most of next year's increase in the budget is explained by increases in salaries and substantial increases in the high school tuition rates. The increase in the amount to be raised by the town is due to the two explanations just made, plus further loss of state aid and no anticipated balance from this year's operating expenses.

Buildings and Equipment

During the summer, in addition to the customary minor repairs necessary to keep the builddings in a good state of maintenance. a new sill was put in on the back side of the Cedar Brook School, the ceilings were resurfaced in the First and Second Grade rooms at West Stewartstown, and the Fifth and Sixth Grade rooms in the same school were completely redecorated. Much needed shelf space has been provided, also, in all the rooms in the latter building. The installation of sinks in both schools in the Eastern part of the town has helped materially in providing more adequate facilities for health and sanitation.

Enrollment and Attendance

At the time of this writing 120 pupils are enrolled in our schools. A breakdown of this number shows there are 68 at West Stewartstown, 23 at Cedar Brook and 29 at the Hollow School. The average percent of attendance at these respective schools during the past year was 94.85, 90.93 and 90.23, while the average number of tardinesses per pupil for the same period was .38, .56, and .11.

Tuition Pupils

At the present time a total of 34 high school pupils are attending schools outside the district. Of this number 21 are at Canaan High School and 13 at Colebrook Academy. Last year there were 33 and the previous year 32 high school tuition pupils. In light of the present 8th Grade enrollment and the general trend for more pupils each year to continue their attendance through the high school grades, it is anticipated that this number will be even larger.

One pupil, whose tuition is paid by the parents, is attending the Colebrook Elementary School. Five pupils are attending the West Stewartstown School

from Pittsburg.

Legislation

Little need be said under this caption. As a result of the big reduction in funds available for educational purposes and the reverting back to an old formula for their distribution, Stewartstown lost over \$6,000 of its state aid. With the exception of the teachers' retirement, which is to be taken up again at the special session this year, most of the other educational laws passed are confined to regulations governing the operations of our schools.

Conclusion

Although we may find ourselves unequipped with adequate facilities with which to measure the re-

sults, there is no more significant a task for our schools than to help prepare our young people to become mature thinking adults. The world needs, as never before, adults who meditate values, who consider the bearings of things, and who try to foresee the consequences.

As in the past, may I again express my deep appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and citizens for all the help received in our work together to maintain high standards in our schools.
