REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the School Board and Citizens of Stoddard:

It is with pleasure that I herein submit my fourth annual report as superintendent of schools.

Our great problem is to maintain our school in creditable condition and at the same time keep within the limits of our appropriations.

America's greatest problem today is to train the rising generation of boys and girls into useful citizenship. This implies a thorough preparation in the fundamentals of mental, moral and religious life. No generation of boys and girls ever faced so many temptations, trials and society pitfalls as modern life presents today.

It is the duty of the home, the school and the church to train and guide the emotions of children to a greater degree than ever before.

During the entire year the school was under the cadet system of teachers from the Keene Normal School.

Following is a list of teachers with time of service for year 1925-1926:

Edith M. Barnaby, from Sept. 8 to Nov. 13. Ruth L. McLeod, from Nov. 16 to Jan. 29. Sarah L. Jenness, from Jan. 29 to April 9. Velma I. Lover, from April 9 to June 11.

For the year beginning September, 1926, the teachers have been:

Marion E. Hall, from Sept. 7 to Nov. 15. Teresa A. O'Mara, from Nov. 15 to Jan. 28. Miss Idella Farnum of the Keene Normal School has been critic teacher and through her faithful service the jar from change of teachers every nine weeks has been almost eliminated. The school has been fortunate in the type of young ladies that have served it. All have been well prepared, and are alert to the interests of the children and their work through the efficient direction of Miss Farnum, which has been excellently motivated and directed.

All instruction has been along phychological and pedagogical lines.

Spelling has been presented to the pupil through the ear, eye, muscles of throat, arm, and hand and powers of imagination.

In reading, the first three years are devoted largely to the mechanics of reading. After the third grade, attention is turned more particularly to

- (1) the getting the thought from the printed page,
- (2) the giving of that thought to another with clear enunciation and proper expression,
- (3) a desire for good literature.

In number work, the methods of your teachers have followed the following standard laws: proceeding from the concrete to the abstract; from the known to the unknown, from particular to general; from problem to rule.

As far as possible, we keep the work practical and confined to principles that enter into the needs of the ordinary eitizen.

In writing, Houghton's system has been followed and we have aimed at neatness, legibility and a fair amount of speed.

In English much time is given to the development of proper speaking and writing, and emphasis placed on technical grammar.

·Good work has been done in geography, history, drawing and nature study.

In conclusion, I desire to express my appreciation of the helpful assistance of the School Board, of the courtesy and hearty co-operation of the teachers and of the hospitality and support of parents and citizens.
