

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

#### To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stratford qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Knights of Pythias Hall in the village of North Stratford on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1: To elect by ballot and major vote, a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

2: To elect by ballot and major vote, one Selectman to serve for the ensuing three years, five water commissioners, and all other necessary Town Officers.

3: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for repairs of highways and bridges, state aid maintenance and trunk line maintenance.

4: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for town expenses, observance of Memorial Day, sewers, street lights, town libraries, cemeteries, town debt and interest, for use of hydrants for fire protection, and any other necessary moneys to be used by the town.

5: To see if the Town will vote to continue the employment of a night watchman at North Stratford and raise money for the same.

6: To see if the Town will vote to assist the farmers now served by electric light lines by reimbursement for certain construction costs, and to raise money therefor.

To see if the Town will vote to observe 7: "Old Home Day" and to raise money for the same.

8: To see if the Town will vote to continue the services of a district nurse, and to raise money for the same.

9: To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the support of the North Stratford band.

10: To make final arrangements for the publication of the Town History together with disposition of the same after completion, and to raise money for the same.

11: To hear the reports of agents, auditors, officers and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relative thereto.

## STRATFORD CORNET BAND.

In view of the appropriation made by the town for this Band, it is proper that a report of its activities should be given.

Beginning with the middle of winter, weekly rehearsals were held in the chapel of the Baptist Church. During the five years of our existence we have averaged about 80 per cent. attendance, which is a remarkable record for a yolunteer Band.

The Band played on Memorial Day, on Graduation Day, and on Old Home Day.

Concerts have been given on the Band Stand as follows:

June 27; July 11 and 25; August 8 and 22; and September 22. Total of six concerts.

In Stratford Hollow concerts were given on June 20; August 1 and August 15. The last two times no preparation had been made for the concerts, and the Band decided that, since these concerts were for the benefit of the people, if no provisions were made for the people to hear them, they would not go again until sent for.

September 2, we played at the Town House at Stratford Center.

Concerts on the Band Stand were given on the dates advertised unless a storm prevented.

The crowds that came on concert nights show the appreciation of the people. The Band would be glad to play every week, but that would not give any opportunity for practising new pieces. Being composed of those who work, it is impossible to give more than one night a week for practice; consequently on the weeks of concerts we find it difficult to hold rehearsal also.

For the third consecutive year we have played for the Farmers' Field Day at the Lancaster Fair Ground; and during the season we played at Groveton, July 4th, at Lancaster, August 5th, for the Knight Templar's Field Day, and for the Republican Rally in Lancaster on November 3rd.

It will probably be remembered that one year ago it was estimated that our deficit for the year 1923-24 would be \$1400 and that amount, in addition to the regular appropriations, was raised at the 1924 meeting. When our state aid for 1923-24 arrived it was larger than we had expected, so our overdraft was less than we had estimated.

It looks now as tho the money raised last March will be sufficient to pay the bills of the present year and show a small balance. The voters should take satisfaction and pride in knowing that the last payment on the bonded debt of the school district was paid last August.

Previous to 1919 the school year ended in March. The state law was then changed so that the school year should end June 30th. Under the new arrangement the money raised at the March meeting was to be used in paying bills for the year beginning on the following July first. The State Board of Education recommended that special appropriations be made on the first year that the new law went into effect, to pay bills from March to July first of that special year. At that time conditions were such in Stratford that it seemed more advisable to pay the bills from March to July by borrowing from the next year's appropriation. This has been done each year since that time. Under this arrangement the School District is always in debt to the town for part of the money required to operate the schools from March first to

40

July first. Now that our bonded debt has been completely paid, the School Board recommends the raising of enough money this year, in addition to the regular appropriations, to cover this old debt so that the money raised in March of each year may remain untouched until the school year actually begins, according to the state law. The amount required to cover this is \$2500.

According to our estimate, the cost of running the schools next year will be approximately the same as during the past year except for the fact that there will be no bonds or interest to pay. The School Board proposes the following budget:

A tax of \$5 on each \$1000 of equalized valuation. (This sum should take care of the teachers' salaries, fuel, janitors, water and lights and for text books and supplies for elementary schools.)
