THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Barnstead in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Barnstead on Tuesday, the Thirteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on property taxes paid on or before the first Saturday of July next.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to buy liability insurance, on Town labor and pay for same out of the Highway Department.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$857.84 the State contributing \$3,431.34 for Town Road Aid.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to buy road scraper and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for same
- 8. To see if the Town will vote money to improve the Beauty Hill road (by request).
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$200.00 from Clarence O. Emerson as a trust fund, the income only to be used for the care of the Adams Cemetery in South Barnstead.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$300.00 from Mrs. Harry Lang as a trust fund, to be known as the Lang Fund. The income of \$100.00 to be used for perpetual care of the Dr. Hawley lot, \$100.00 for perpetual care of the Sylvester J. Powell lot at the Cemetery in Center Barnstead and \$100.00 for the perpetual care of the Dr. Hawley lot in Riverview cemetery.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from Charles B. Davis as a trust fund, the income to be used for the perpetual care of the Timothy Emerson lot (No. 18) in Center Barnstead cemetery.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from the estate of Annabel Hayes, the income to be used for the perpetual care of her lot in South Barnstead cemetery.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from the estate of the late Annie B. Perry, as a trust fund, the income to be used for the perpetual care of her lot in Riverview cemetery.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the purchase of snow fence.
- 15. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

The whole situation can be attributed to the war and the unstable condition prevalent in business and industry. The amount of money to be appropriated this year is somewhat greater than last year. This can be attributed to several factors.

- 1. It was found necessary to increase the teachers' salaries after the budget had been voted upon last spring. A general salary increase has been noted throughout the state and the country as a whole. If you are to hold your teachers you must pay them an amount comparable to what they might receive in other schools. Their salaries are now about equal to those of other towns having schools of similar size.
- 2. Transportation costs are about the same as last year, and are figured quite close. If any more back wood-lots are opened and the lumber-men have school-age children it will mean added demands on the transportation system with extra costs. Eventually the district should consider the purchase of a larger unit that would take care of several of the present routes at a considerable saving in costs. This program will have to wait until after the war, but it is well to consider it.
- 3. Much of the increase in the amount to be appropriated is due to the fact that last June there was a balance of \$1,000. left, (due to closing of 3 buildings) while this year the anticipated balance is only \$200.

PART V. AUXILIARY ACTIVITIES AND SPECIAL REPORTS

(a) Report of School Health Work

To the Townspeople, School Board and Superintendent of Schools:

There were no epidemics of contagious disease in Barnstead last year. The only reportable infections were several cases of pediculosis which were cleared up in a short time.

Only one case of tonsils and adenoids was operated on in clinics but several were done privately. There are several more urgent cases to be done this year if the parents are willing.

One emergency dental case was taken in for X-Rays and emergency treatment. He was subsequently put under the care of a physician and made a good recovery from a serious complication.

An accident case was attended when a child got an arm into an electric wringer. First aid was done by a teacher and the nurse and the child taken to a physician. The arm came out without too much permanent injury.

One case was referred for a check up. A complete examination from a physician resulted in a clean bill of health. An attempt was made to check the source of the complaint.

Other routine work was completed in the Barnstead Schools. No regular clinic work is possible at this time. A statistical report follows:
