## Superintendent's Report

---

To the School Board and Citizens of Bethlehem:

It is with pleasure that I submit to you my annual report relative to your schools.

This past year brought two changes in the teaching staff of the school. Mr. Walter Tibbetts of Groveton, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, was elected to teach Grades 7 and 8 to replace Mrs. Marion Lewis who resigned to assist her husband in business in Woodsville. Mrs. Romina Boemig of Lisbon, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, with experience in No. Lisbon was elected to teach Grades 1 and 2, to replace Miss Roberta Christie who resigned to accept a position elsewhere.

The enrollment for the year 1950-1951 for the twelve grades was 157 which is a decrease of 8 under the previous year. Registration figures of this year to date show a slight decrease may result for the third consecutive year.

This past year the rooms behind the stage in the auditorium and the primary room were redecorated. The steel doors in the corridors were painted and a new stoker was purchased as a result of a complete breakdown of the one in use. New window shades were purchased to replace a number that were beyond repair. Inspection of the building reveals that it is in excellent condition after twenty years of service.

The report of the school nurse shows that 84 pupils were examined by the school doctors. Eighty were given tuberculosis test, sixty were tested for blood pressure and twenty-six underwent laboratory tests. Miss Bryant examined 142 for vision, height and weight and reported the following:

A total of 38 pupils were treated in the various clinics held throughout the year.

The penny milk program is being continued for the pupils from fall to spring. The hot lunch, consisting of one hot dish to supplement the lunch brought from home, is served during the months of January and February. The hot dish program is self supporting, while the milk program is supported by the district and the pupils as federal funds are no longer available.

Due to recent legislation relative to insurance on buildings of the type of the Bethlehem School, the building was re-evaluated and the amount of coverage was doubled. Your school building is now covered by fire insurance to the extent of \$160,000.00.

One member of the teaching staff attended summer school this past year and three teachers participated in an extension course in elementary reading this winter with Madeline E. Bartell, State Supervisor of Elementary Education, as instructor.

The supply of elementary teachers is still short of the requirements in the state, and the drafting of young men by the Armed Forces is again causing a decrease in the number of secondary teachers that will be available to accept teaching positions this coming year.

It is gratifying to note that the amount of money necessary for the support of schools for the coming year is less than that of the past year. This decrease is due to the fact that the last of the \$100,000.00 bonds issued twenty years ago have been redeemed and the school district is once more free from all debt.

In closing, I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the citizens of Bethlehem, the School Board, teaching staff and other district officers for their splendid cooperation throughout the year.
