

WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. S.]

To the inhabitants of the Town of Boscawen in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Boscawen on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing and one selectman for three years.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways.

4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sewers.

5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Old Home Day.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Library over and above the amount required by law.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the control of Pine Blister Rust.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the spraying of trees on the principal streets of the town.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for trimming trees.

12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the settees or seats for the Town Hall.

13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for salary of firemen.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Trunk line maintenance.

15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Trunk line construction.

16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid maintenance.

17. To see if the town will vote to raise two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for improving the sidewalk south of Carter's store and build a new fence on depot hill, allowing a committee from the Village Improvement Society to assist in the work.

18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of Fire Hose.

19. To see if the town will vote to raise six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) to immediately procure and buy an efficient automobile pumping engine for use over the whole town, to be housed at and operated by the Torrent No. 1 Fire Company at Penacook, N. H.

20. To see of the town will vote to permit an addition to be built to the town hall and consent to the reconstruction at the rear of the present Hall as such new addition would require.

21. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

FORESTRY DEPARTMENT

Board of Selectmen. Boscawen, N. H.

In accordance with the terms of an agreement executed between the town of Boscawen and the New Hampshire Forestry Commission, we are submitting a report of White Pine Blister Rust control work performed in your town during 1924. Before a summary of the past season's work is shown, a brief review of Blister Rust activities from 1918 to date is being given. The Department believes that the tax payers of your town will be interested in this review, inasmuch as the widespread interest in Blister Rust control strongly substantiates the judgment of your townspeople regarding the seriousness of the Rust and the necessity for its control.

From 1918 to the present date 167 towns and cities have financially co-operated in the destruction of currant and gooseberry bushes. Individuals, associations and firms to the number of 464 have paid nearly \$30,000 for control work on their land. The combined results of all this activity has brought about the removal of 16,258,443 currant and gooseberry bushes over an area of 1,360,312 acres.

It has become more and more evident that the prophecies made by the Federal Government and Forestry Department with reference to the seriousness of Blister Rust have been extremely conservative. Infected pines have been located in 219 towns out of a total of 235. There are hundreds of small areas where the pine is practically destroyed at the present time. In fact the Rust is now so common that it can be picked up in nearly every pine lot throughout the state. There are a great many pine lots throughout New Hampshire and adjacent states which have been irreparably damaged within a period of seven to nine years. It is unfortunate that there are still so many pine owners who insist on making light of Blister Rust and who believe that this matter is being unnecessarily agitated. This attitude is brought about largely because pines are not to be seen dead or dying on every hand. It is true, that taking the state as a whole, the effect of Blister Rust is not very evident, unless one makes a careful examination into the matter. Blister Rust is slow in development and infected pines will continue to look green and apparently thrifty for a number of years. In the meanwhile their growth continually slows down and when they do go backward the change appears to be very sudden.

It is quite evident to anyone well informed regarding the history of this state that the white pine industry has played a conspicuous part in its general welfare. This valuable tree should continue to contribute in a large measure towards the welfare of individuals, towns and state. In order that this may come to pass, it is necessary that energetic measures be continued which will result in its protection from the Blister Rust.

LIBRARY REPORT

The attention of the citizens should be called to the fact that we now have at the Library a catalogue printed in book form and, so bound, that space is available for the inserting of each successive yearly supplement.

These catalogues are sold at a nominal price of twentyfive cents (.25) each, although the cost was much more than that figure. The necessity of any charge being made is that the supply be not wasted by promiscuous distribution. It is hoped that the new catalogues will last a period of at least ten years, thus making the per annum cost to the town very slight.

The matter of fines seems to need a word of explanation. The fine is nothing that the trustees or librarian impose for revenge but rather it is to jog the memory of the patron who becomes negligent about returning books.

It is readily seen that if a person takes a book, let us say a new one, and after reading it neglects to return it promptly all the other potential readers of the town are deprived of the opportunity of securing the book and they own theoretically just as much in the book as the first borrower but are being deprived of their rights by another's carelessness. Now the way we can make people remember is through their pocketbook—thus the fine.

We know that all thoughtful patrons will understand the situation and return books promptly and if they neglect to do so to pay their fines promptly and willingly.

During the summer months the library was open three times a week. The evening hours proved to be popular and we hope to continue the practice during the coming warm weather and it is earnestly desired that all the citizens of the town will avail themselves of the opportunity thus offered to spend, at least, a few hours among our books. The association with books gives one an unconscious mental uplift that can be derived from no other source.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

February 5, 1925.

To the School Board and Citizens:

At the present time the schools of Boscawen are in a very satisfactory condition. Each one has a good teacher who is doing thorough, conscientious work.

By opening the High Street School the cost of transportation will be somewhat less than last year, but the saving will not approach the cost of maintaining the school. In spite of the high cost per pupil for supporting this school, I am sorry to report that the attendance there for the past twelve weeks has been less than 78 per cent of the membership, which means that on this account alone the efficiency of the school is reduced nearly one-quarter. The per cent of attendance for all the schools in Boscawen for the past five years has been over 90, while the present average for the state is about 93. Unless very unusual conditions prevail at High Street, the attendance record indicates that the parents fail to appreciate the effort of the district in maintaining a school for their children near their homes and the wisdom of our change of policy is subject to question.

The average membership of all our schools in the first year of my service (1918-'19) was 42. Last year it was 51 and at the close of the half-year just completed it was 55.

Tardiness continued to decrease last year, but for the past half-year it is again on the increase. Several items of interest are compared in the following table.

The increase of several hundred dollars in our expenditures, caused by the opening of a fourth school, means an increase of several hundred dollars in state aid. But this increase will not be paid to us until December 1925, as the state aid paid in December of each year is based on the budget of the previous year, not the current year. As this increase will not be available until six months after the present year closes, it will be necessary for the school board to ask for a deficiency appropriation at the coming district meeting. This deficiency appropriation is, in fact, an advance made by the district in anticipation of state aid.

If the High Street building is to be used for a term of years, a considerable amount should be raised to put it into proper condition. If this building is to be closed again, would not this be a good year to carry out plans we have long had in mind of increasing the window area at the Plains or of improving the light and installing a jacketed stove at Water Street?
