TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

L. S.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Croydon, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 11th day of March next at 10 o'clock in the forenoon (the polls not to close earlier than 6 o'clock in the afternoon) to act upon the following subjects:

- ART. 1. To choose one Selectman for a period of three years, a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, two Auditors, one Trustee of Library for three years and all such officers and Agents as may be necessary for transaction of the Town business for the ensuing year.
- ART. 2. To see if Town will elect highway Agent for one year.
- ART. 3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.
- ART. 4. To see if Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V highways and raise and appropriate money for same, Town to raise \$480.75, State contribute \$3,205.01.
- ART. 5. To see if Town will accept State Aid for Class V highways and bridges and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for that purpose.
- ART. 6. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for highways and bridges and keeping roads open and sanded during winter.
- ART. 7. To see what sums of money Town will raise and appropriate for Town Dump.

- ART. 8. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the General Expense of the highway department.
- ART. 9. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cutting brush.
- ART. 10. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries.
- ART. 11. To see if Town will vote to raise \$500.00 for Capital reserve fund.
- ART. 12. To see what sums of money Town will vote to raise for street lighting and for Town buildings.
- ART. 13. To see if Town will vote to raise \$40.00 for Dartmouth Lake Sunapee Region.
- ART. 14. To see if Town will vote to authorize Selectmen to hire all necessary sums of money for use during year.
- ART. 15. To see if Town will vote to raise \$300.00 for White Pine blister control.
- ART. 16. To see if Town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 for snow traps.
- ART. 17. To see what sums of money the Town will vote for old age assistance.
- ART. 18. To see if Town will vote to close road from Kirk's Farm to Grantham town line.
- ART. 19. To see if Town will vote \$1,000.00 to bull-doze and grade road leading to Rockybound Pond (Kemp's Road so called) and install necessary culverts and accept as town road.
- ART. 20. To see if Town will vote to raise \$500.00 for Insurance.

- ART. 21. To see if Town will vote sufficient funds for surveying the Flat Cemetery to be laid out in Lots.
- ART. 22. To see if Town will vote to raise \$............ to be expended in co-operation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25.00 for this purpose.
- ART. 23. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

- 5. To choose one or more Auditors and such other Officers and Agents as the voters may judge necessary.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Croydon:

Enrollment

This year we are operating Grades 1-4 at the Village School. Mrs. Doris Farrington is again teaching the school which has an enrollment of twenty-one pupils divided as follows:

Grade 1 - 4; Grade 2 - 9; Grade 3 - 5; Grade 4 - 3.

With the closing of the Flat School, twenty-four students in Grades 5 - 8 are attending school in Newport. These are divided as follows:

Grade 5 - 10; Grade 6 - 4; Grade 7 - 7; Grade 8 - 3.

Twenty-two students are attending High School (Grades 9 - 12).

Repairs and Improvements

New cement steps were made and one side of the roof was shingled at the Village School. Some additional book shelves were constructed.

Two pieces of playground equipment — a jungle gym and a 2-unit teeter were installed. Contributions were received to cover nearly all the cost of these items.

Facilities

The Inspector of the State Board of Health periodically visits the school and makes a written report on sanitary conditions. Each time he indicates the need for running water and modern plumbing. On his last visit in December, 1957, the Inspector indicated that in his territory in the western part of New Hampshire, extending from Hanover to the Massachusetts border, there was only one other school together with the Croydon Village School that still provided a "privy" for toilet facilities.

By digging a well and providing an electric pump, it would be possible to have both fresh drinking water and

modern plumbing. It would also be necessary to have heat for the toilet rooms.

The cost of providing these improvements would involve an expenditure of several thousand dollars. If, however, the parents and citizens desire to continue to operate a one-room, four-grade school for a number of years, serious consideration should be given to raising the money and installing these necessary improvements.

REPORT OF HELPING TEACHER

The position of Helping Teacher in this supervisory union is now in its fourth year of providing services as directed by the Superintendent of Schools and as established by law: "... to give helpful advice, counsel, and assistance to teachers, pupils and parents of a school system as a constructive means of improving the educational growth and development of children, solving pupil problems of retardation and maladjustment, adapting the program of studies to meet the needs of children and the community, bringing resources outside of the school to classroom teachers, pupils, and community, and in general acting as consultant to the entire staff and community in recognition of educational needs."

These are some of the responsibilities and services I have undertaken with the Croydon school as one of the five districts of this union:

- 1. TESTING PROGRAM This includes the planning and administration of tests of achievement in all four grades; tests of mental ability in grades 1 and 4; and administering any individual tests as needs arise. These tests are of value to the teacher in determining level of progress and achievement in light of each pupil's ability.
- 2. CLASSROOM VISITS Visits make it possible to share the physical, emotional, and educational atmosphere of the classroom. Follow-up conferences with the teacher when necessary are intended to exchange ideas, review general observations, and to promote instructional improvement.
- 3. RESOURCES AND MATERIALS New texts, references, movies, bulletins, and other memoranda bring to the classroom a variety of teaching aids and all help to

strengthen the overall curriculum.

4. AUDIO-VISUAL AIDS — The filmstrip is still the most useful and effective teaching aid in this field. This year, with new filmstrips added in the fields of social studies and science and with those available at the Croydon school, our library has seen considerable use in all schools.

The work of Helping Teacher shares in many other services and responsibilities of education throughout the union, including conference with parents, provision for extension courses for teachers, assisting teachers with problems of keeping the school register, and many other interesting and varied experiences. The cooperative spirit of all teachers and the mutual interest in the best education for all make this work a purposeful pursuit.
