To the Inhabitants of Dalton, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dalton on Tuesday, the 13th of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects The polls will open at 11:00 o'clock.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To see if the Town will accept the Budget for 1956 as prepared by the Selectmen and appropriation of the amounts therein or to make any changes.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$61.53 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 1/100th of one percent of the Town Valuation.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$100.00 for the Control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$50.00 for Civilian Defense, and make appropriation for same.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to issue temporary loans in the anticipation of Taxes.
- 7. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town a sum not to exceed Twelve Thousand Six Hundred Ninety Four Dollars Thirty Six Cents to finish Construction of the Manns Hill Road to the Littleton Town line, also to tar the French Road. This is to be paid over a period of four years. The Town's share to be \$413.95 for each of four years. The rest of this to be made up by State Funds of \$2,759.64 for each of four years. Payments to start in 1962.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,582.00 for 20 street lights to be put over Town at the Selectmen's direction, or a sum of \$79.80 per light per year for any number of lights.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

To the Inhabitants of the Town School District in the Town of Dalton, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the school building in said Dalton on the twelfth day of March 1956 at 8:00 o'clock in the evening, to act on the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
 - 5. To choose an auditor for the ensuing year.
- 6. To hear the reports of officers, auditors or committees of the district and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$2,500.00 as a capital reserve fund for the construction of a new central school, said funds to be placed in the custody of the trustees of trust funds and reserved for the construction of a new central school in accordance with the Laws of 1943, Chapter 160 as amended by the Laws of 1945, Chapter 35 and Laws of 1947, Chapter 8.
- 8. To see if the district will vote to appoint a building committee consisting of three persons, to be elected from the floor, to advise with the school board in drawing up plans for the construction of a new elementary school, in recommending a site, in selecting an architect and report their findings to a legally called special meeting or the next annual meeting of the district.
- 9. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Dalton:

It is with pleasure that I submit my annual report relative to your schools.

This past year brought one change in the faculty. Mrs. Claribel Blakslee of Dalton was elected to replace Mrs. Marion Clarkson in Grades five and six.

The enrollment this year in the six grades is 86 as compared with a total of 83 last year. The enrollment in the Whitefield School at the present time is 59. Twenty-nine of this number are enrolled in the elementary grades and thirty in the senior high school.

The report of the school nurse is in a separate health report following this report. Mrs. McGinley continues to do an excellent job for your school.

This spring all children in Grades one through six will be given both mental maturity tests and achievement tests. This is part of a program set up by the North Country superintendents and the State Department of Education. Receipts from National Forests in the area will finance the program.

All classes have adequate books, supplies and teaching aids. This past winter two teachers participated in an extension course in The Teaching of Science in the Elementary School.

The school lunch program is still being carried on through the cooperation of the Community Club and the able direction of Mrs. Eleanor Bell.

The budget for this coming year is not too different from the budget of this year. There are small increases in several areas. State-aid was increased considerably this past year, over previous years, due to the increased appropriation by the legislature. I anticipate that Dalton will receive approximately the same amount this coming year.

In closing, I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the citizens of Dalton, the school board, teaching staff and other district officers for their continued cooperation.
