#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Epsom in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Epsom on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty dollars for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Four hundred dollars for the White Pine Blister Rust control.
- 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Five hundred forty dollars and eighty-two cents for the construction of Class V. Roads, T.R.A., so called; the State to contribute Two thousand one hundred sixty-three dollars and twenty-seven cents.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six hundred dollars to provide for additional fire protection due to the war emergency.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One thousand dollars to reduce long term note on Fire Truck.
- 8. To see if the Town of Epsom will accept the following sums as Trust Funds, the interest, only, to be used for care of Cemetery lots:—\$100.00 for William

Babb lot; \$100.00 for E. R. and A. J. Yeaton lot; \$100.00 for Joseph Cass and George S. Bixby lot; \$50.00 for Unknown Soldier's lot; \$200.00 for Capt. Arthur C. Locke and Frances T. Locke lots; all in McClary Cemetery.

\$200.00 for Augusta A. Fiske lot in Gossville Cemetery.

\$100.00 for Daniel S. Jones lot in Short Falls Cemetery.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to use the State system of paying the road help.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any property acquired by the Tax Collectors' deeds or otherwise. This vote to stand until rescinded.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.
- 12. To see what discount, if any, the Town will allow on all property taxes paid previous to July 1, 1942.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before said meeting.

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Epsom:

In addition to their regular work, the schools are engaged in defense activities. Junior Red Cross groups have been organized. General instructions based on principles recommended in the one-day air-raid school conducted in Concord and attended by Mrs. Nutter (Chairman of the School Board), Mr. Henry Dowst, and the Superintendent, have been sent to all schools. Details as to shelters, drills, and warnings, are being worked out by teachers, wardens, and school board members in the different localities. Where schoolhouses serve as shelters, the school board should see that hazards are reduced so far as possible. Interested organizations might help with this project. Teachers have taken courses in first aid and home nursing, and have been instructed to stress similar units of instruction in the school program. Now it is said that teachers are to administer the sugar rationing program. All pupils follow the meaning of current events, through periodical literature furnished in the schools for the various ages. Arrangements have been made with the State Police to fingerprint children for their own protection. These records will be kept in a separate file. All persons having the guidance of children should help them cultivate an attitude of calmness, assurance, and obedience to recognized authority, worthy of our pioneer forefathers.
