WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Freedom, N. H., in the County of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four thousand and sixty-five dollars to defray town charges consisting of town officers' salaries, town officers' expenses, election and registration, town hall expenses, and appropriate money for the same.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars for the use of hydrants and appropriate money for the same.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand dollars for street lights and appropriate money for the same.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand dollars for general expenses of highway department and appropriate money for the same.

- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred and seventy-five dollars for Public Library and appropriate money for the same.
- 8. This article is in two parts; If part (a) is passed part (b) may be stricken from warrant. If part (a) is not passed then the money of part (b) must be raised to balance 1960 & 1961 budget.
- (a) To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of twelve thousand dollars to purchase the presently rented 1954 Austin Western grader, snow plow, and wing; and authorize the selectmen to borrow such a sum of money on a long term note.
- (b) To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three thousand four hundred dollars to reimburse the town treasury for grader rent paid from May 1960 thru March 1961. This amount is the difference between full amount of rent paid, four thousand dollars, and the amount received from sale of bulldozer and small grader, six hundred dollars.
- 9. This article in two parts; If voted to purchase grader, part B may be stricken from warrant.
- (a) To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four thousand five hundred dollars for winter highways and appropriate money for the same.
- (b) To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of six thousand five hundred dollars for winter highways and appropriate money for the same.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars to be used in co-operation with State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust within the confines of the town.

- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of six hundred and forty-seven dollars and forty-seven cents for class five roads and appropriate money for the same.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars for town needy and appropriate money for the same.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand and two hundred dollars for insurance and appropriate money for the same.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two thousand dollars for old age assistance and appropriate money for the same.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to help defray the expenses of Old Home Week Celebration for August, 1961 and appropriate money for the same.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four thousand and five hundred dollars for summer highways and appropriate money for the same.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of seven hundred dollars for the fire department, four hundred dollars for maintenance and three hundred dollars for new hose.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars for maintaining the town dump and appropriate money for the same.
- 19. To see of the town will vote to use the revenue from 1960 Severance Tax to cover any overages.

- 20. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and make an appropriation to cover the expenses of such audit.
- 21. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and ten dollars and seventy-one cents, which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town: to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources for the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred and twenty-five dollars for Social Security and appropriate money for the same.
- 24. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars for interest on long term notes and short term notes and appropriate money for the same.
- 25. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars to pay the balance on the long term note taken out for the Effingham Falls Bridge and appropriate money for the same.
- 26. To see if the town will vote to raise one hundred dollars to be given as a donation and divided between North Conway and Huggins Memorial Hospital.
- 27. To Transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

NOTE: Since this copy of the Town Warrant is required by the printer at an earlier date than the legal Town Warrant posting date, it is not necessarily complete, and therefore, the Posted Warrant may contain additional articles which are not included in this publication.

GRADER

This is the same Austin Western power grader as was discussed at the special town meeting last spring. A 1954 thoroughly reconditioned grader with a new nine foot plow and a new eleven foot wing and lifts. This grader has been rented since May 1960 with the intention of buying at the March 1961 town meeting. The amount of rent paid for this period is four thousand dollars. However should the town decide to buy this grader 85% of the rental cost or three thousand and four hundred dollars will go towards the purchase

price leaving a balance of nine thousand and four hundred dollars.

The appropriation of twelve thousand dollars could be raised by a long term note paying back three thousand dollars yearly to start in 1962. Our present Falls Bridge note has a balance of two thousand and five hundred dollars and will be paid in full this year. (1961).

This grader came to town last spring with a new machine guarantee as agreed by the owners, Scott Machinery Co., in Concord. Since that time we have had four service calls for minor troubles and at no cost to the town.

We have used this power grader a total of three hundred and seventy-seven hours in widening, smoothing, and building roads under summer maintenance at an hourly cost of one dollar and thirty-five cents per hour for the operator, plus fuel and wear and tear on the grader. Using the old scraper the hourly cost would be four dollars and sixty cents; three dollars and thirty-five cents for tractor and operator, one dollar and twenty-five cents for the machine operator.

In winter maintenance this power grader can can very nearly pay for itself as is proved by the comparison of appropriations in Article 9 of the Town Warrant. The hourly cost for plowing snow with the grader runs two dollars and sixty cents per hour while a truck and two men costs five dollars and sixty cents per hour. The grader also does away with the cost of outside heavy equipment which during the winter of 59 and 60 cost the town one thousand and two hundred dollars.

The grader could be housed at the roller shed by

making some changes to the end of the building. However the selectmen hesitated in spending the amount necssary for such a change until definite arrangements were made as to the future of the grader.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Freedom:

During the school year 1959-60 the teachers in the Freedom School were Mrs. Edith Plant, grades 1-4, and Mr. Ralph Staples, grades 5-8. Mr. Staples resigned at the end of the school year.

In September, 1960, Mrs. Plant returned to her position in the primary room. In the upper grade room is Mr. John Snodgrass, of Alton, N. H. Mr. Snodgrass is a veteran, and a graduate of the University of New Hampshire. Freedom is fortunate to have competent and conscientious teachers.

Last year the total enrollment in the Freedom School was 46 pupils with an average membership of 40.8. In September of the current year the school opened with 33 pupils. The annual school census indicates that there will be a gradual increase in the next three years to about 40 pupils. Since the opening of school some families have moved out of town reducing the enrollment as of this date to 28 pupils.

The present enrollment numbers indicate that there will be about 15 high school pupils in 1961-62. Kennett High School tuition rate for next year has been announced as \$395.00, and Brewster Academy \$360.00.

The school health services continue under the effective supervision of Mrs. Rebecca Sanborn, R. N. Physical examinations are made by Dr. David P. Dutton with Mrs. Sanborn's assistance.

At the last annual district meetings Effingham, Freedom, Madison and Ossipee appropriated funds to be used for music instruction. These districts jointly engaged Mrs. Dagny Blouin as the music teacher. This is the first time our pupils have experienced the advantage of music instruction by a professionally trained music teacher. Mrs. Blouin holds the degree of Bachelor of Music, and has taken education courses at the University of New Hampshire. Necessarily the instruction this first year is elementary, but the children are making good progress and are enjoying the experience. Mrs. Blouin is to be complimented on the good work she is doing.

During the current year the exterior of the school building received a coat of paint, new shades have been installed on the upper grade room, and the electrical wiring has been renovated.

It has been my privilege to serve as your superintendent of schools during the past fifteen years. My association with members of the school board, teachers, citizens, and pupils has been very pleasant, and is most earnestly appreciated.
